Enclosed, herewith, is supplemental order modifying certificate of public convenience issued by the Commission in the above entitled proceeding.


The applicant will not be permitted to operate or engage in any transportation granted by the enclosed order until he has complied with the following tariff requirement:

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed June 25, 1986. Public notice of the application was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on July 19, 1986. The application was protested by four protestants. All protests were withdrawn upon the applicant restricting it authority to exclude rendering service between cutting, sewing, assembling and manufacturing plants; and to or from four named counties.

The now unopposed record is certified to the Commission without oral hearing. Verified statements have been entered by the applicant and one supporting shipper.

The applicant currently operates pursuant to a P.U.C. common carrier certificate. Mr. Robert F. Hummel states that he and two brothers, Charles L. Hammel, II and Kenneth W. Hammel, each own one-third of the stock of Pitt-Ohio. Charles L. Hammel, III is the president of the applicant and a director. Kenneth W. Hammel is vice president of the applicant and a director. He is the secretary-treasurer and a director. There is an affiliation between the applicant and Hammel's Express. The three brothers each own 12% of the stock of Hammel and serve as officers and directors. There is no other affiliation between the applicant and any other persons or corporations.

The office and principal place of business is located at 26th Street and A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. Applicant owns 52 tractors, 20 trailers and 44 straight trucks which are 20 feet in length. All of the trailers are closed vans. There are two 25-foot pup trailers, eight 48-foot vans, and ten 45-foot vans. Applicant leases from Martera two tractors, 90 closed van trailers, and 18 straight trucks. A maintenance and safety program is in effect.

As evidence of its financial capacity to perform the proposed services, the applicant reports assets of \$4,306,285, liabilities of \$2,297,448 and stockholders' equity of \$2,008,837.

Mr. Joseph P. Pinto is the vice president of the supporting shipper, Crystal Brands, Inc. He states the main office and plant is located in Aston, Delaware County, with a second office and distribution center located in Reading, Berks County. The company receives clothing and piece goods from points throughout Pennsylvania. It ships clothing, wearing apparel and other related items to the distribution center or other clothing manufacturers. Crystal Brands intends to tender to the applicant between 75% and 100% of its intrastate business.

As no other shipper support was presented, we will modify the authority to read service for Crystal Brands, Inc. (Women's Apparel Group) from its facilities. This modification is in conformance with current Commission policy when the origin is from a specific shipper's facilities and that shipper offers the only support.

We find that:

. 1 - - [

1. Applicant has the equipment, experience and fitness necessary to render the proposed service.

2. The supporting shipper has demonstrated a need for the service as proposed as amended and modified.

3. Applicant has established that approval of the application is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved and that the certificate, as amended, be further amended and modified to include the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, wearing apparel and related accesserials, for Crystal Brands, Inc. (Women's Apparel Group) from its facilities located in the township of Aston, Delaware County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

subject to the following conditions:

- That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport property to or from points in the counties of Bradford, Columbia, Lackawanna and Luzerne.
- (2) That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport property between cutting, sewing, assembling and manufacturing plants.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any service authorized herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code and the rules and regulations of the Commission relating to the filing and acceptance of an amended tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the carrier, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.
