

PETITION TO INTERVENE OF PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY

Pursuant to Section 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.72 – 5.74, Pennsylvania Electric Company (“Penelec” or “the Company”) hereby files this Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. In support of this Petition, the Companies state as follows:

1. On May 2, 2013, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (“PennDOT”) notified the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) of safety concerns associated with a bridge structure carrying State Route 1025 (“Bridge”) over a track owned by Canadian Pacific Railway (“Canadian”).

2. On May 14, 2013, a field investigation was held at the site of the crossing, at which PennDOT, the Commission and Canadian had representatives. As a result of the investigation, it was determined that the Bridge should be closed to both vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

3. On May 23, 2013, the Commission entered an Order directing that the Bridge be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic no later than June 22, 2013, and further directing that additional engineering studies be performed, as well as directing that the matter be set for hearing.

4. On June 3, PennDOT filed a Petition for Reconsideration of the May 23, 2013 Order. PennDOT also contemporaneously filed a Motion for Certification of Interlocutory Order and Stay of Proceedings Pending Appeal, as well as a Petition for Protective Order.

5. Reconsideration was granted by Opinion and Order of the Commission entered on June 13, 2013.

6. On July 31, 2013, PennDOT filed a Petition for Leave to Withdraw Certain Pleadings relative to its June 3 Motion and portions of the Petition for Reconsideration.

7. On August 16, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order granting PennDOT's July 31 Petition to Withdraw and June 3 Petition for Protective Order, as well as ordering that this proceeding be expedited.

8. On October 4, 2013, a prehearing conference was held in this matter. A Hearing Notice was issued following the conference, setting this matter for hearing on November 20, 2013. In addition, a Prehearing Order was issued dated October 11, 2013, which set a full procedural schedule for this matter. The Prehearing Order was served on one of Penelec's engineers in Montrose, Pennsylvania.

9. Penelec files this Petition to Intervene consistent with the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 5.74.

10. The Commission's regulation at 52 Pa. Code § 5.72 governs eligibility to intervene in such a proceeding, and permits a petition to intervene to be filed by a "person claiming a right to intervene or an interest of such nature that intervention is necessary or appropriate to the administration of the statute under which the proceeding is brought." 52 Pa. Code § 5.72(a).

11. A potential party is eligible under this section where it can assert and demonstrate "an interest which may be directly affected and which is not adequately represented by existing

participants, and as to which the petitioner may be bound by the action of the Commission in the proceeding.” 52 Pa. Code § 5.74(a)(2).

12. The Company is an electric distribution company (“EDC”) serving customers throughout Pennsylvania.


13. Following a review of the crossing at issue in this proceeding and the Company’s facilities, Penelec has determined that there is a high probability that the outcome of this proceeding may cause it to be required to relocate a number of its facilities.

14. The fact that Penelec’s facilities may be affected by the outcome of this proceeding raises issues with regard to feasibility, safety, and cost sharing as it relates to the potential modification of these facilities.

15. For these reasons, there are no other parties that can adequately represent the interests of the Company in this proceeding and, as such, the Company’s Petition to Intervene should be granted.

WHEREFORE, Pennsylvania Electric Company respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Petition to Intervene.
