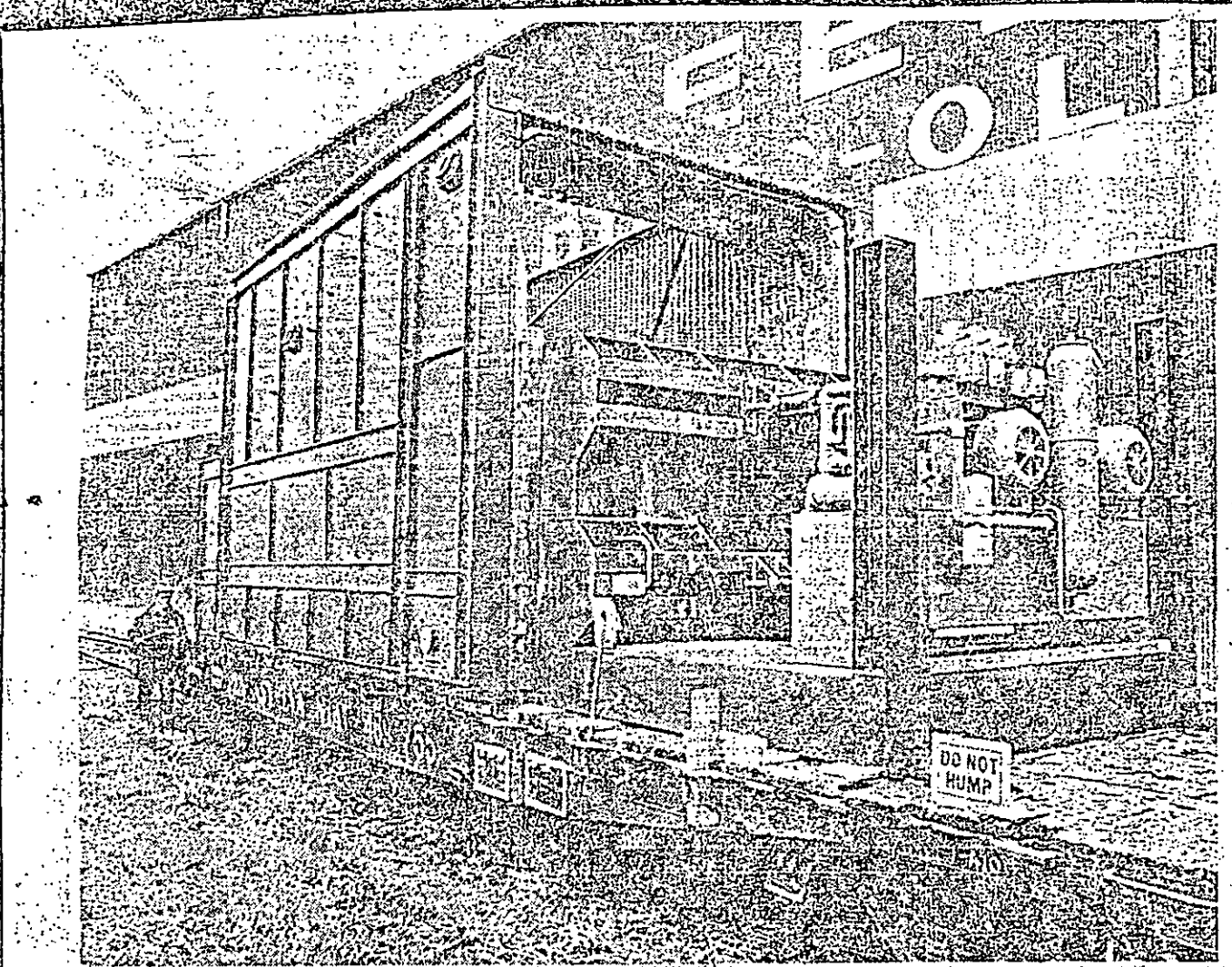

STOKER PART of a municipal solid waste burner was shipped today by Keeler/Dorr-Oliver Boiler Division, with the other section of the giant boiler to follow. The huge piece of equipment is going to Wilmington, N.C., to handle the burning of garbage for New Hanover County. The unit, which takes up most of the flatbed rail car, is 35½ feet long, 14 feet high and 11½ feet wide

and has a capacity of 100 tons a day. Neal Cole, of 136 West Second Avenue, South Williamsport, a boiler division carpenter, stands alongside the unit, giving a comparative idea of its size. The "Do Not Hump" sign is an instruction to railroad yard personnel on handling of the car. The top module of the boiler is approximately the same size.
