







#### **ORDER**

By the Commission:

#### I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

On November 24, 2009, Alternative Utility Services, Inc. ("Applicant") filed a verified application with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") requesting a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant ("ABC") in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 III. Adm. Code 454 ("Part 454"). Applicant requests authority to offer services as an ABC for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

### II. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS UNDER SECTION 16-115C OF THE ACT

Applicant is a corporation organized under the laws of Illinois and licensed to transact business in Illinois. Applicant has certified that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ABC. Applicant has agreed to ensure that any person who acts on its behalf will comply with all applicable sections of Part 454. Applicant agrees that it will remain in compliance with the provisions of the Act and Part 454, and will ensure that authorizations received from customers, and all other applicable records are retained for a period of not less than three calendar years after the calendar year in which they were created. Applicant has agreed to adopt and follow rules and procedures to preserve the confidentiality of its customers' data.

## III. FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL, AND MANAGERIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 16-115C

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 454.80 of Part 454, Applicant provided a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact business in Illinois. Applicant submitted an original surety bond in satisfaction of Section 454.80.

Applicant is required by Part 454.60 to demonstrate that it meets the managerial qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant must further provide an organizational chart that indicates the position of persons which satisfy the managerial qualification. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the managerial qualifications set forth in Part 454.60, as demonstrated in the attachments to the Application. The attachments to the Application also include an exhibit containing a corporate organizational chart and identifying the persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.60(a). The attachments include an exhibit containing occupational background information on the person or persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.60(a).

Applicant is required by Part 454.70 to demonstrate that it meets the technical qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the technical qualifications set forth in Part 454.70 with the information provided, including the information included in the attachments to the Application. The attachments include an exhibit containing occupational background information on the person or persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.70(a).

Applicant further agrees to comply with the Code of Conduct for ABC's contained in Section 454.90.

#### IV. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the application and attachments along with the supplementary information provided by Applicant regarding the technical and managerial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 454 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements.

The Commission concludes, therefore, that Applicant's request for a certificate of service authority to operate as an ABC in Illinois should be granted and should include the following authority:

#### CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS CERTIFIED that Alternative Utility Services, Inc. is granted service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

## V. FINDINGS AND ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) Applicant, Alternative Utility Services, Inc., a business organized under the laws of Illinois, seeks a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant under Section 16-115C of the Act;
- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over the party hereto and the subject matter hereof;
- (3) the recitals of fact and conclusions reached in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact:
- (4) Applicant has demonstrated that it possesses sufficient financial, managerial and technical resources and abilities to provide services as an agent, broker or consultant for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply to third parties in the State of Illinois;
- (5) Applicant has complied with Section 16-115C of the Act and Part 454; and
- (6) Alternative Utility Services, Inc. should be granted the certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant as specified in this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that Alternative Utility Services, Inc. is hereby granted a Certificate of Service Authority authorizing it to operate as an agent, broker or consultant; said Certificate of Service Authority shall read as that set forth in Section IV of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Alternative Utility Services, Inc. shall comply with all applicable Commission rules and orders now and as hereafter amended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.

On March 16, 2012, Alternative Utility Services Inc. ("Company") filed an Application for a license to supply electricity or electric generation services in Maryland under COMAR 20.51. Additional information was filed on March 29, 2012. The license granted by the Commission under this Letter Order is limited solely to electricity supplier broker services to residential, commercial and industrial customers. Additionally, the Company is directed to file marketing and training material specific to Maryland operations when materials become available.

Finally, the Company is reminded that it is under a continuing obligation to notify the Commission within 30 days of any changes to the information upon which the Commission relied in granting this license. A copy of the supplemental or updated information is required to be filed concurrently with the Office of People's Counsel.

### I. SUMMARY

In this Order, we license Alternative Utility Services, Inc. (AUS) to operate as a competitive electricity provider furnishing aggregator/broker services to all customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Maine Public Service Company pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

#### II. APPLICATION AND DECISION

On September 8, 2011, AUS applied to the Commission to operate in Maine as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305. AUS proposes to provide aggregator/broker services to all customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Maine Public Service Company. AUS met all the Chapter 305 filing requirements. As a licensed competitive electricity provider, AUS is required to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations, including all conditions of licensing, customer protection rules, and the filing of annual reports.







#### ORDER

## BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 2, 2011, Alternative Utility Services, Inc. (Alternative Utility) filed an application seeking to become a licensed electric generation supplier (EGS) in the electric distribution company service territories of PECO, Duquesne Light, Met Ed, Penelec, Penn Power, PPL, UGI, Wellsboro, Pike County Light & Power, Citizens and West Penn Power throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The application was filed pursuant to the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code §§ 54.31-54.43, which became effective on August 8, 1998, and which were established under section 2809 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 2809.

Section 2809 provides in pertinent part that:

License Requirement.—No person or corporation, including municipal corporations which choose to provide service outside their municipal limits except to the extent provided prior to the effective date of this chapter, brokers and marketers, aggregators and other entities, shall engage in the business of an electric generation supplier in this Commonwealth unless the person or corporation holds a license issued by the Commission.

# An electric generation supplier is defined as:

A person or corporation, including municipal corporations which choose to provide service outside their municipal limits except to the extent provided prior to the effective date of this chapter, brokers and marketers, aggregators or any other entities, that sells to end-use customers electricity or related services utilizing the jurisdictional transmission and distribution facilities of an electric distribution company, or that purchases, brokers, arranges or markets electricity or related services to end-use customers utilizing the jurisdictional transmission and distribution facilities of an electric distribution company.

66 Pa. C.S. § 2803.

Alternative Utility is a foreign corporation, incorporated in the State of Illinois, and registered in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as of October 23, 2010. Alternative Utility proposes to act as a broker/marketer for residential, small commercial (25 kw and under demand), large commercial (over 25 kw demand), governmental and industrial customers. Alternative Utility states that it will not be billing customers directly for its broker services, paying customer bills in its broker services role, nor will it be taking title to electricity. Customers will continue to pay their bills directly to the electric distribution company (EDC) or EGS, as appropriate.

Alternative Utility will be using independent marketers. Alternative Utility is directed to inform any current or future independent consultants, which arrange for the

sale of Alternative Utility's energy products to end-users, that they will be required to be licensed as an EGS if they arrange for the sale of energy products to end-users from another supplier, in addition to Alternative Utility.

Since Alternative Utility proposes to provide electric generation supplier services to residential customers it is required to comply with, and be governed by, applicable Chapter 56 residential service regulations as set forth in the Commission Order Guidelines for Maintaining Customer Service at the Same Level of Quality Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 2807(d), and Assuring Conformance with 52 Pa. Code Chapter 56 Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 2809(e) and (f) at Docket No. M-00960890F0011, Order entered July 11, 1997. Thus, we deem it appropriate to reiterate certain items with respect to Chapter 56 of our regulations. Chapter 56 (52 Pa. Code Chapter 56) is applicable to residential accounts. An EGS cannot physically disconnect a residential customer from the electricity grid; therefore, the rules relating to residential service termination are not applicable to EGSs. An EGS may seek to terminate its generation service through an appropriate written notice to the customer and the distribution company. The residential customer can then attempt to repair their relationship with the supplier, seek a new supplier, or return to utility service at default service rates in accordance with the utility's obligations under section 2807(e), 66 Pa. C.S. § 2807(e). The customer would only be disconnected from the electricity grid pursuant to appropriate regulations if the customer failed to meet its obligations to the utility or the EGS that has been designated by the Commission as the provider of last resort.

Additionally, we specifically note that the licensee must comply with, and ensure that its employees, agents, representatives and independent contractors comply with the standards of conduct and disclosure for licensees set out in Commission regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.43 that were enacted to protect consumers of this Commonwealth. These standards include, *inter alia*, the provision of timely and accurate

information about the services offered by the licensee, the practice of nondiscrimination in service in regard to race, color, religion, national origin, marital status, etc., the safeguarding of a consumer's personal information, and compliance with applicable state and federal consumer protection laws. Also, we take this opportunity to remind the licensee of its agreement to abide by, and to ensure that its employees, representatives, agents and independent contractors abide by all applicable federal and state laws, and Commission regulations, procedures and orders, including Emergency Orders, which may be issued verbally or in writing during any emergency situations that may unexpectedly develop from time to time in the course of business.

Alternative Utility has provided proofs of publication in Pennsylvania newspapers and proofs of service to the interested parties as required by the Commission.

Regarding the financial and technical requirements of the license application, Alternative Utility has supplied an audited Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the year ended December 31, 2010, as well as a Dun and Bradstreet credit report dated June 22, 2011, showing a low credit risk. Alternative Utility has supplied historical employment information for Alternative Utility executives indicating the presence of the necessary consulting, utility and/or regulatory experience. Sufficient information has been provided by Alternative Utility to demonstrate its financial and technical fitness in order to be licensed as a broker/marketer in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Alternative Utility did not provide a \$250,000 bond as required by the license application; however, it did provide a bond in the amount of \$10,000 and requests that the Commission reduce its security requirement from \$250,000 to \$10,000. In support of this request, Alternative Utility explains that it will not be collecting any gross receipts from its customers, generating electricity, and will not be taking title to

electricity. Its services include analyzing client electricity loads, bill review, and recommendations regarding alternative providers.

The Commission believes that the reasoning on which Alternative Utility bases its request for a bond reduction from \$250,000 to \$10,000 is similar to that offered by the other EGSs that have successfully petitioned the Commission for a bonding level of \$10,000. Two of the EGSs are Co-eXprise, Inc. (Co-eX), at Docket No. A-110166, whose request was granted January 20, 2006, and Premier Energy Solutions (Premier), at Docket No. A-110170, whose request was granted July 26, 2006. In the case of Co-eX, the company explained that, as a consultant, it will provide its customers with an evaluation and selection process from which to select the best positioned licensed electricity supplier/generator and award business. In the case of Premier, the company explained that it requested an EGS license to become EDI certified with the utilities, in order to be able to efficiently and effectively obtain electricity usage information for the customers to whom it provides consulting services. Premier intended to utilize the information to help its customers reduce their overall spending for electricity. Premier also stated that it will not take title to power.

The Commission believes that Alternative Utility operates in a similar manner as Co-eX and Premier and therefore should be granted similar relief and be permitted to provide a bond or other approved security in the reduced amount of \$10,000. However, Alternative Utility's bonding level is contingent upon the company's business model as described in this Order. If Alternative Utility takes title to generation supply for its customers, and/or charges customers directly for that generation supply, a \$10,000 level of bonding may not be appropriate. Therefore, we will direct Alternative Utility to notify the Commission 45 days prior to a change in its business model, whereby Alternative Utility takes title to generation supply and/or bills its customers directly for that generation supply. This will provide the Commission with an opportunity to review and adjust Alternative

Utility's approved bonding level prior to Alternative Utility implementing those changes.

As of November 1, 2011, no protests have been filed.

We find that the applicant:

- Is fit, willing and able to properly perform the service proposed in conformance with applicable provisions of the Public Utility Code and lawful Commission orders and regulations, specifically including 52 Pa. Code Chapter 56 (relating to Standards and Billing Practices for Residential Utility Service).
- 2. Has agreed to lawfully abide by all Commission regulations, procedures and orders, including Emergency Orders, which may be issued verbally or in writing during any emergency situations that may unexpectedly develop from time to time in the course of doing business in Pennsylvania.

We further find that the proposed service, to the extent authorized by the license, will be consistent with the public interest and the policy declared in the Electricity Generation Customer Choice and Competition Act.

Upon full consideration of all matters of record, we find that approval of this application is necessary and proper for the service, accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

# IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. That the application of Alternative Utility Services, Inc. is hereby approved, consistent with this Order.
- 2. That Alternative Utility Services, Inc.'s request for a reduction in the bond level from \$250,000 to \$10,000 is hereby granted.
- 3. That the security amount of \$10,000 shall remain in effect for Alternative Utility Services, Inc. as long as Alternative Utility Services, Inc. does not make a change to its business model in Pennsylvania, whereby it would take title to generation supply and/or bill its customers directly for generation supply.
- 4. That a license be issued authorizing Alternative Utility Services, Inc.to begin to offer, render, furnish or supply electric generation supplier services to residential, small commercial (25 kw and under demand), large commercial (over 25 kw demand), industrial and governmental customers in the PECO, Duquesne Light, Met Ed, Penelec, Penn Power, PPL, UGI, Wellsboro, Pike County Light & Power, Citizens and West Penn Power electric distribution service territories throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as specified in the Order.
- 5. That if Alternative Utility Services, Inc. proposes to change its business model as described in Ordering Paragraph No. 3, it must notify the Commission at least 45 days prior to the changes. With the notice, the Company must provide an update to the nature and scope of business information that was required by Pa. Code § 54.40(c) to justify the modification granted in Ordering Paragraph No. 3. This will provide the Commission the opportunity to review Alternative Utility Services, Inc. bonding level and adjust as appropriate, prior to Alternative Utility Services, Inc.

shall cease effective with the date of the change in the business model. The level of bonding effective at that time shall be \$250,000 or the level required by 52 Pa. Code § 54.40, whichever is greater.

7. That this proceeding at Docket No. A-2011-2261520 be closed.
