Complainant Response to Respondent Answer

#4. Respondent alleges that a piece of 4x8 insulated sheathing flew off a non PECO truck and came in contact with PECO Energy's 34KV primary line. To my knowledge there were no witnesses to this and no proof that this actually happened. On the day of the surge a PECO employee checked my meter, as they were doing to all houses on my block, and told me "a branch fell on a 35,000 volt line causing it to fall on our neighborhood service line causing the surge". I must therefore contest respondent's statement as to the cause.

#5. My primary relief would be for PUC to fine PECO for the incident. Complainant recognizes that PUC has no authority to award monetary damages.

#8. Complainant has no legal representation.

Complainant Response to Respondents New Matter

#1. Complainant has stated a claim requesting the PUC fine PECO which they do have a legal right to do.

#2. Agree—PUC has no right to award damages but can render fines against PECO.
