The verified statement of Ms. Leach demonstrates that there is a need for the applicant's proposed service and the statement of Mr. Clouse demonstrates that the applicant is fit, in every way, to fulfill that need. Therefore, we submit that the application, as amended, should be approved in full.

We further submit that approval should be for common carriage, as opposed to contract carriage. While the present application seeks authority to perform service for a particular shipper, the applicant also has applied for the transfer to it of the common-carrier authority held by Mr. Clouse as an individual. The transfer proceeding has been captioned: Clouse Trucking, Inc., A-00106830, Folder 2. Publication of notice of the transfer proceeding appears in the <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin</u> of Saturday, September 27,

1986. As Mr. Clouse's statement in the instant case makes clear, it is applicant's intent to hold itself out to, and serve, members of the public, other than just the supporting shipper in the present proceeding. Thus, under the facts of this case, we respectfully request the Commission to award a certificate to the applicant instead of a permit.

WHEREFORE, Clouse Trucking, Inc. respectfully requests the Commission to grant the applicant a certificate to perform the complete service it seeks in Appendix "A" to Mr. Clouse's statement.

#### STATEMENT OF J. EDWARD CLOUSE

## I. LEGAL NAME AND DOMICILE OF APPLICANT

The legal name of the applicant is Clouse Trucking, Inc.

("applicant"). Applicant's facilities are located in West Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, about one mile from the borough limits of Carlisle, Pennsylvania. While applicant's domicile is West Pennsboro Township, its address is R. D. #5, Box 112, Carlisle, PA 17013.

II. IDENTITY AND QUALIFICATIONS OF PERSON MAKING STATEMENT FOR APPLICANT My name is J. Edward Clouse. I am president of the applicant and have been so since its incorporation in 1964. I am fully familiar with applicant's authority, operations, facilities, equipment, and personnel. Moreover, I am authorized by my corporation to submit this testimony in support of the application captioned above.

I have been in the trucking business, as an individual, since 1953 at which time I commenced performing transportation of commodities excluded from regulation. I received my first certificate of public convenience, as an individual, from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission") on December 18, 1963. On September 5, 1986, the applicant filed an

application with the Commission seeking approval of the transfer to applicant of the authority held by me as an individual. I shall discuss this transfer proceeding in further detail later in this statement.

## III. IS THE APPLICANT AFFILIATED WITH OTHER CARRIERS?

As I just indicated, I hold a certificate of public convenience with the Commission. The docket number of my certificate is A-90287. Other than this, applicant is not affiliated with other carriers.

## IV. AUTHORITY SOUGHT

As initially filed, applicant sought authority to transport such merchandise as is dealt in by wholesale, retail and chain groceries, food business houses, drug stores and drug houses, and by hospitals and nursing homes, between the Pennsylvania facilities owned, leased, or used by Dauphin Distribution Services Co. ("Dauphin Distribution"), and from said facilities to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

As amended, applicant now seeks the authority as set forth in the "Restrictive Amendment," dated August 29, 1986, attached hereto as Appendix "A."

- V. GENERAL SCOPE OF CURRENTLY AUTHORIZED OPERATIONS

  Applicant holds no authority with the Commission at the present time.
- VI. DUPLICATING AUTHORITY WHICH WILL RESULT FROM GRANT OF AUTHORITY

In the transfer proceeding, referred to by me earlier, applicant seeks to obtain the authority set forth on Appendix "B," attached hereto. For all

practical purposes, there is no duplicating authority which will result from a grant of the transfer application and the instant application. Whatever, applicant is not seeking duplicating rights and will accept a restriction that the authority granted in this proceeding, to the extent that it duplicates authority subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

## VII. DUAL OPERATIONS RESULTING FROM GRANT OF AUTHORITY

Inasmuch as applicant neither holds, nor seeks, any contract carrier authority with the Commission, there will be no dual operations resulting from a grant of the application.

#### VIII. PERTINENT TERMINAL FACILITIES AND COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK

Applicant's facilities are located in West Pennsboro Township, Cumber-land County, Pennsylvania, on approximately 2 3/4 acres of land. There is a building at this location which measures approximately 85 feet by 100 feet. Included in the building are an office, garage, loading station, and dispatch center. Fuel tanks and storage tanks are also on the premises.

Vehicles can be parked inside the garage. Additionally, the garage is equipped to conduct inspections, including Pennsylvania state inspections, perform repairs of any kind, perform complete overhauls, and do any body work including completely building a body.

In addition to three regular phone lines which can be used by the public, applicant has three WATS lines, two of which are for incoming and outgoing interstate calls and one of which is for incoming and outgoing

intrastate Pennsylvania calls. With regard to the regular phone lines, applicant's personnel will accept the charges for incoming calls made on those lines.

## IX. PERTINENT EQUIPMENT

The applicant's list of pertinent equipment which it owns is attached to this statement as Appendix "C." This list shows that applicant owns 71 tractors, and 35 van trailers. All of these tractors and trailers can be utilized to serve Dauphin Distribution, the supporting shipper in this case.

#### X. SAFETY PROGRAM

Applicant's safety program has various phases. Applicant carefully selects, trains, and supervises its drivers. Additionally, the equipment undergoes routine inspections and maintenance. The vehicles are also road checked. Moreover, applicant's insurance company has safety meetings with applicant's drivers twice a year. Applicant stresses safety for every aspect of its operation.

## XI. TYPE OF SERVICE CURRENTLY PROVIDED TO THE SUPPORTING WITNESS

Applicant presently serves Dauphin Distribution in interstate commerce. Applicant gives Dauphin Distribution the type of equipment and general service which it requires. More specifically, applicant supplies the shipper with closed van trailers and provides, primarily, a truckload service with multiple deliveries and deliveries on schedule.

## XII. TYPE OF SERVICE TO BE OFFERED

Applicant will offer the same type of service to Dauphin Distribution as it provides to that shipper now in interstate commerce. Through approval of this application, applicant will be able to expand its service by providing Dauphin Distribution with an intrastate Pennsylvania service too. By having intrastate service, we will be able to provide Dauphin Distribution with multiple deliveries combining both intrastate and interstate traffic. We understand that this will be a significant advantage to Dauphin Distribution.

#### XIII. FINANCIAL DATA

Applicant's balance sheet as of December 31, 1985, and its income statement for the year ended December 31, 1985, are attached hereto as Appendix "D." These documents show that applicant had a net income for 1985 of \$246,747 and has substantial retained earnings.

#### XIV. WHETHER SERVICE PROVIDED WILL CREATE EMPTY MILES OR BACKHAULS

Applicant believes that it will be able to integrate its service pursuant to the authority which it now seeks with its service rendered on an interstate basis so as to keep empty hauls and backhauls to a minimum. In fact, approval of this application will enable applicant to have loaded traffic while travelling to many of its interstate pickup points.

Moreover, applicant's facilities are located in close proximity to the facilities of Dauphin Distribution. Applicant submits that it will be more fuel efficient and cost effective for the applicant to serve Dauphin

Distribution, for this reason, than for other carriers. In other words, applicant's empty miles to get to the origin facilities are relatively insignificant; whereas, carriers located at further distances would have a much greater empty-mile factor to get to the origin points.

In all, from applicant's analysis of the operation which it now seeks, it knows that the transportation will not only be feasible, but will be able to be conducted economically and at a profit.

#### XV. ANY OTHER INFORMATION DEEMED PERTINENT

I point out that the ordinary compliment of our personnel consists of six office employees, 80 drivers, and 15 mechanics and related positions. Applicant has sufficient facilities, equipment, and personnel, to handle the traffic which will be tendered to it under the authority which it seeks in this application. However, if it becomes necessary, applicant is ready, willing, and able to obtain additional equipment, facilities, and personnel in order to serve Dauphin Distribution.

There is one other significant aspect of this application. I am aware of the Commission's policy to grant contract carrier authority to a new applicant seeking authority to provide service to one shipper. The applicant does not want contract carrier authority nor will Dauphin Distribution use the applicant as a contract carrier.

As one can see from Appendix "B," to this statement, applicant filed for additional common carrier rights which are all the rights which I now hold as an individual. Therefore, applicant is seeking to provide service for many shippers, rather than just a single shipper. Moreover, applicant intends to file for additional authority, as a common carrier, in the future.

It is applicant's desire, and intent to serve many shippers, and not just Dauphin Distribution. If both of applicant's pending applications are approved, applicant will hold itself out to perform service for all shippers which it will be authorized to serve, and will perform such transportation when called upon to do so. To be clear, applicant intends to hold itself out, offer, and undertake to perform service authorized to it for the general public, rather than simply the supporting shipper in this case.

For the reasons set forth in this statement, and the reasons being submitted by the supporting shipper, I respectfully request the Commission to approve this application by granting the applicant a certificate of public convenience to perform the entire service requested by it, as set forth in Appendix "A." to this statement.

## I. Legal Name and Domicile of Supporting Party or Firm

The legal name and address of the supporting party are Dauphin Distribution Services Co. ("DDS"), P. O. Box 427, Camp Hill, PA 17011. The principal office of DDS is located at that address and the facilities of concern to this application will be set forth later in this statement.

II. Identity and Qualifications of Person Making Statement for Supporting Party or Firm

My name is Doris E. Leach, and I am director of transportation for DDS. I have been with DDS for eight and one-half years and have held my present position for one year.

As director of transportation, I am fully familiar with the transportation needs of my company and I have been authorized by it to support the application of Clouse Trucking, Inc. ("applicant") at the above-captioned docket number.

DDS pays the freight charges and selects the carriers that utilizes to perform transportation for it.

## III. General Description of Supporting Party, Organization, or Operations

Basically, DDS operates distribution centers and a freight consolidation program for the industries covered by the present application. More specifically, these industries are classified as wholesale, retail and chain groceries, food business houses, drug stores and drug houses, and hospitals and nursing homes.

I have attached hereto, as Appendix "A," a list of the commodities which DDS ships from its facilities. These commodities include such merchandise as is dealt in by wholesale, retail, and chain groceries, food business houses, drug stores and drug houses, and by hospitals and nursing homes. That is why we support the application for all of such merchandise.

## IV. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use

DDS intends to give the applicant approximately eight to ten truck-loads weekly in Pennsylvania intrastate commerce, and this amount will increase in the future. An average truckload weighs approximately 40,000 pounds.

## V. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations, or Both

DDS owns five different facilities in Hampden Township, Cumberland County, a facility in Camp Hill, Cumberland County, and two facilities in the township of Silver Spring, Cumberland County. Furthermore, DDS operates a facility in Silver Spring Township, Cumberland County, which it does not own. Since DDS is a growing concern and could own, lease, or

otherwise utilize other facilities, likely in Cumberland County or an adjacent county, DDS supports the application without limitation as to origin points so as to avoid having to support individual applications to obtain service every time another facility is established.

The origin points are the facilities owned, leased, or used by DDS. From these facilities, DDS ships to such representative points in Pennsylvania as Washington, Pittsburgh, New Castle, Erie, Oil City, Greensburg, Uniontown, Indiana, Bedford, Clarion, Clearfield, Temple, Johnstown, Somerset, Altoona, Robesonia, Bradford, St. Marys, Williamsport, Lewistown, Carlisle, Sunbury, Harrisburg, York, Chambersburg, Lancaster, Pottsville, Susquehanna, Gettysburg, Scranton, Reading, Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton area, Philadelphia, Doylestown, Stroudsburg, Milford, and Honesdale. I stress that DDS needs, and supports, this application for statewide service. This is particularly so since the shipments of DDS involve multiple deliveries.

Moreover, DDS has interfacility shipments and supports the application for these too.

## VI. Type of Service Required. Describe

DDS requires a truckload service in closed van trailers and multiple deliveries. It also requires deliveries on schedule.

#### VII. Similar Applications Supported

DDS supported the application of R. H. Crawford, Inc. at Docket No. A-97201, Folder 1, Am-P. The support of the present application is to give DDS a carrier which can supplement the service rendered by Crawford, and other carriers that serve DDS. We need the services of the applicant, in addition to Crawford and other carriers, so that our full transportation needs will be fulfilled.

## VIII. Any Other Information Deemed Pertinent

The applicant serves DDS in interstate service and gives DDS excellent service. It has the type of equipment DDS requires, and its drivers are well familiar with handling the products of DDS and meeting the requirements of DDS. From experience, we know that the applicant can do a top-rate job for DDS and we want to have its service available to us for intrastate traffic just as it is for interstate traffic. Such service will allow DDS to be more efficient by being able to combine both interstate and intrastate traffic on a load, among other things.

For all the reasons given above, I respectfully request the Commission to grant the instant application, as amended, in its entirety. I also request that the grant be for common carriage because we will not use applicant's services if applicant is restricted to operating as a contract carrier.
