

FORMAL COMPLAINT

1. The Complainants are four consumer organizations, the Consumers Education and Protective Association (CEPA), the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN), Action Alliance of Senior Citizens of Greater Philadelphia (Action Alliance) and the Tenants' Action Group (TAG) (hereinafter collectively "CEPA et al.") who advocate on behalf of low and moderate income residential customers and consumers of the utility services of the Philadelphia Gas Works.

4. On October 11, 2002, the Philadelphia Gas Works (PGW) filed a document entitled "Philadelphia Gas Works' Petition to Permit Effectiveness of Tariff Supplement on Less Than 60 Days Notice" which was docketed at R-00027875. PGW attached to the Petition a proposed Tariff Supplement 30 to Tariff Gas - Pa.P.U.C. No. 1.¹

5. Complainant Consumer Education and Protective Association (CEPA) is a nonprofit corporation with an office at 6048 Ogontz Avenue, Philadelphia, PA. CEPA is composed of hundreds of members, mostly low and moderate income, who have come together to address a variety of community and consumer issues, including the management, rates and quality of customer service of the Philadelphia Gas Works.

6. The Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (hereinafter ACORN) is a registered non-profit corporation and membership organization with offices at 846 N. Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA 19130. ACORN's mission is to advocate on behalf of the economic well being of low income people, particularly with respect to such fundamental necessities of life as utility service, housing, healthcare and jobs.

7. Action Alliance of Senior Citizens of Greater Philadelphia (Action Alliance) is a registered non-profit corporation and membership organization with offices at 1201

Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, PA. The mission of Action Alliance is to advocate on behalf of senior citizens, many of whom are low and moderate income, in a wide range of matters including the management, rates and quality of customer service of the Philadelphia Gas Works.

8. The Tenants' Action Group (TAG) is a registered non-profit organization with offices at 21 S. 12th Street, 12th Floor, Philadelphia, PA 19107. The mission of TAG is to advocate on behalf of low and moderate income tenants.

9. In addition to their organizational missions to advocate on behalf of low and moderate income consumers, CEPA et al. count among their members many low and moderate income customers of the Philadelphia Gas Works. For these two reasons, they therefore have an interest in this proceeding not adequately represented by any other party of record.

10. CEPA et al. have conducted an initial preliminary review of PGW's proposed Supplemental Tariff No. 30 and alleges that the proposed Supplement in general would violate the Gas Choice Act in that it reduces the level of consumer protection below the level of quality prior to the effective date of the Gas Choice Act and fails to maintain the consumer protections, policies and services in existence as of the effective date of the Act to assist low-income customer to afford natural gas services. 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2203(7), 2206(a). CEPA et al. request that the Commission undertake an investigation to determine whether the proposed Supplement:

- would result in payment agreements for PGW customers whose service has been terminated which meet Chapter 56 standards of reasonableness and affordability, both as to the down payment and security deposits required as a condition of restoration of service, and as to the monthly payments on arrears required after service has been restored;
- would result in the creation of an unreasonable barrier to access to PGW's customer assistance program, the Customer Responsibility Program, in violation of Commission applicable Commission guidelines;
- would subvert the Commission's standards for determining the reasonableness and affordability of payment agreements set forth in Chapter 56 and other formal and informal guidelines;
- would impermissibly limit the rights of individual terminated customers aggrieved by PGW's Supplement mandated payment agreement requirements to obtain a full review of the reasonableness and affordability of the payment agreement actually proposed to the customer via an informal complaint to BCS;
- would result in the application of payment agreement standards to PGW customers which are more onerous than those in existence in other PUC regulated natural gas utilities, without reasonable or sufficient justification, in violation of the rights of customers to equal protection under the law, under the state and federal Constitutions and the Public Utility Code.

11. CEPA et al. reserve the right to raise and address other issues of concern during the course of this proceeding.

Wherefore, CEPA et al. respectfully request that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission:


(1) accept this Formal Complaint and allow Complainants to intervene in this proceeding with full party status;

(2) suspend the effective date of the proposed Supplement and initiate an investigation into its compliance with applicable legal standards;

(3) require PGW at hearing to adduce evidence in justification of its proposed Supplement and accord Complainants full opportunity to cross-examine PGW's witnesses, present evidence and offer argument.

(4) grant such other relief as is just and proper.





3. WHAT IS YOUR COMPLAINT? (DESCRIBE PROBLEM).

A. On October 11, 2002, Philadelphia Gas Works ("PGW" or "the Company") filed a Petition with the Commission at this docket requesting that Tariff Supplement No. 30 to its Tariff Gas- Pa. P.U.C. No.1 be allowed to go into effect on October 25, 2002, without a sixty day notice as required in 52 Pa. Code § 53.31. On October 31, 2002, the Office of Consumer Advocate filed an Answer to PGW's Petition, and on November 7, 2002, the Commission entered an order suspending the Tariff

Supplement until May 8, 2003, and assigning the matter to the Office of Administrative Law Judge.

- B. Tariff Supplement No. 30 modifies PGW's procedures for negotiating payment arrangements with customers who have had gas service terminated for non-payment and are seeking restoration of their gas service.
- C. PGW is a municipal public utility company, owned by the City of Philadelphia and managed and operated by Philadelphia Facilities Management Corporation, a non-profit Pennsylvania Corporation. The natural gas service being furnished or rendered by PGW became subject to the regulation and control of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission on July 1, 2000 pursuant to the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act, 66 C.S. § 2212 and pursuant to Section IV of the Company's existing Tariff.
- D. PGW furnishes natural gas services to approximately 550,000 residential, commercial and industrial customers in the City of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
- E. Pursuant to the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2212(g), PGW made its restructuring filing on July 1, 2002. The OCA is reviewing all of the billing and payment provisions in PGW's proposed restructuring tariff to ensure that they comply with the Public Utility Code and the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act and applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the Commission, including Chapter 56. PGW's proposed restructuring tariff is scheduled to go into effect on September 1, 2003.
- F. The Consumer Advocate is empowered pursuant to 71 Pa.C.S. §§ 309-1 et seq. and 66 Pa. C.S. § 2212(i) to represent the interests of consumers before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission in matters involving PGW.

- G. The Consumer Advocate avers that PGW's Tariff Supplement No. 30 is not in the public interest and is not in full compliance with the Commission's Chapter 56 regulations. The Bureau of Consumer Service Guidelines provides for a range of percentages for required down payments based on a customer's arrearage balance, while PGW's Tariff Supplement requires a set percentage, for example a down payment of 20% of a customer's arrearage balance. Additionally, section 56.191 enumerates factors to be taken into account for the amortization of arrearages over a reasonable period of time, including the size of the unpaid balance, the ability of the ratepayer to pay, the payment history of the ratepayer, and the length of time over which the bill accumulates. 52 Pa. Code § 56.191(1). Nothing in PGW's Tariff Supplement allows for these considerations.
- H. The Consumer Advocate files this complaint to ensure that the Commission fully and fairly adjudicates issues pertaining to whether Tariff Supplement No. 30 is in the public interest and is in compliance with the Commission's Chapter 56 regulations.

4. WHAT DO YOU WANT US TO DO?

The Consumer Advocate respectfully requests that the Public Utility Commission:

- A. Hold evidentiary hearings;
- B. Deny implementation of Tariff Supplement No. 30 because it is not in the public interest and does not comply with the Commission's regulations at Chapter 56;
- C. Grant any other relief deemed appropriate.

PUBLIC STATEMENT OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE ISSUED IN
ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 904-(e) OF ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929
(P.L. 177, No. 175), KNOWN AS "THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF
1929", AS AMENDED BY ACT 161 OF 1976 (APPROVED JULY 9, 1976)

Act 161 of the Pennsylvania General Assembly, 71 P.S. § 309-2, as enacted July 9, 1976, and Section 2212 of the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa. C.S. § 2212, authorize the Consumer Advocate to represent the interest of consumers before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission"). In accordance with those statutory provisions, and for the following reasons, the Consumer Advocate determined to file a Formal Complaint and participate in proceedings before the Commission involving the Philadelphia GasWork's ("PGW" or "the Company") Tariff Supplement No. 30 to its Tariff Gas- Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 ("Tariff Supplement") at docket number R-00027857.

PGW's Tariff Supplement modifies existing procedures for negotiating payment arrangements with customers who have had gas service terminated for non-payment and are seeking restoration of their gas service. However, its Tariff Supplement does not comply with Chapter 56 of the Commission's regulations. Specifically, the Bureau of Consumer Service Guidelines provides for a range of percentages for required down payments based on a customer's arrearage balance, while PGW's Tariff Supplement requires a set percentage, for example a down payment of 20% of a customer's arrearage balance. Additionally, section 56.191 enumerates factors to be taken into account for the amortization of arrearages over a reasonable period of time, including the size of the unpaid balance, the ability of the ratepayer to pay, the payment history of the ratepayer, and the length of time over which the bill accumulates. 52 Pa.

Code § 56.191(1). Nothing in PGW's Tariff Supplement allows for these considerations.

PGW is a municipally owned natural gas operation that provides service within the limits of the City of Philadelphia. Prior to the passage of the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa. C.S. § 2201 *et seq.*, PGW was regulated by the Philadelphia Gas Commission. Pursuant to Section 2212(d) of the Natural Gas Choice and Competition Act, however, PGW has come under the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. 66 Pa. C.S. § 2212(d).

The objective of the Consumer Advocate in filing a Formal Complaint in this matter is to protect the interests of the Company's customers. The Consumer Advocate will seek to ensure that the proposed Tariff Supplement is in the public interest and in compliance with Chapter 56 of the Commission's regulations.




