
In re: A-00106548, F. 1, Am-C - Transfer application filed by Debo Moving and Storage, Inc. to receive household goods in use rights from David E. Bauman and Company, Inc., t/a Don Martin Trucking Division at A-00110722.

Dear Mr. Pillar:

I have received and reviewed the above-referenced transfer application. I believe that the household goods in use rights you have listed as the first, third and fourth right (Appendix "A") do not include the right household goods in use authority.

Our rationale is that when you review the "corrected order" adopted January 6, 1994 and entered January 12, 1994, rights numbered eighteen (18) and twenty-three (23) clearly state household goods in use. Rights numbered seventeen (17), twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22) are listed as property rights. These three property rights numbered 17, 21 & 23 immediately proceed the household goods in use rights. If these three rights were meant to include household goods in use rights, I believe they would state household goods in use. Since they do not include this verbiage, it is my opinion that household goods in use were never intended to be included in these property rights and therefore cannot be extracted from the rights.

According to your "Appendix A" the last three rights are subject to the condition of five (5) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough (Brackenridge). Paragraph (A) of the above referenced order restricts transportation at rights numbered 21, 22 & 23 to eight (8) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough (Brackenridge), creating an



inconsistency between the two conditions. You note that these paragraphs have been amended to be consistent with restriction (b) relating to household goods in use. You show that both conditions are now subject to a five (5) mile restriction. Even though I believe this to be a moot issue, I cannot find any order that made this amendment, please explain.

I will hold the application in abeyance pending receipt of your answer.
