I am a concerned citizen that lives near the proposed site of the new PECO Energy Company electric substation in Montgomery County (Horsham and Kenas Road).

We understand PECO's intentions for choosing a site include:

- 1) little impact as practical on nearby residents
- 2) little impact as practical on sensitive environmental areas

This site (Horsham and Kenas Road) is literally in the backyard of at least five residential communities (Estates of Montgomery, Windlestrae, Venco Group, Raven Hollow and Neshaminy Falls) to name a few. There are thousands of adults and hundreds of young children to consider.

There is a 172-acre park (Windlestrae Park) right down the road from the proposed location. It is the largest dedicated recreational area in Montgomery Township. Windlestrae is used in winter and summer, day and evening with baseball fields, soccer fields, four tennis courts, picnic areas, basketball courts, volleyball area and hiking paths.

The long term effects from exposure to substation radiation are still being argued today. However, what is known and cannot be argued is that all of us in these nearby neighborhoods and parks will receive an increased level of radiation exposure because we will be exposed on a *continual basis*. Whether we or our children will develop cancer in 10-20 years down the road is not known but we sure are at a greater risk than if we lived in a neighborhood without such exposure. That is a chance that most of us are not willing to take.

In addition, our home values will decrease dramatically as well.

The effects on us will be far from "little impact." We understand that development (both residential and industrial) in Montgomery County has

Dear Commissioner Fitzpatrick:


My wife and family and I are concerned and deeply troubled by the proposed site of the new PECO electric substation in Montgomery County at the Horsham and Kenas Road intersection. It is our understanding that when PECO chooses a site that as little impact on nearby residents and environmental areas are major considerations. This particular site is bordering the five residential communities of the Estates of Montgomery, Windlestrae, Venco Group, Raven Hollow and Neshaminy Falls. These communities contain thousands of adults and young children. In addition there is an extremely large park and recreational area (Windlestrae Park) a few hundred yards from the proposed site. The Little Neshaminy creek also is nearby.

The long-term effect of exposure from substation radiation is of major concern. Long-term effects are as yet unknown. We will, however, receive increased levels of radiation exposure. This indeed will lead to higher levels of risk for cancer and other related diseases.

There is a lot of open space available in sparsely populated areas of the county that should be evaluated. Substations of this magnitude should be relegated to industrial designated areas.

Dear Chairman Fitzpatrick:

As you are more than aware, PECO Energy Company is planning a new substation in Montgomery Township in the very near future. As residents of the Estates of Montgomery, one of the sites under consideration (Site A, Kenas Road), we believe voicing our concerns/site preference directly to you is both impelling and expedient. Given all the factors surrounding this new facility, we submit that the **newly suggested** third site (**farther within the Hartman Road Industrial Complex**) is, at this time, the most feasible and sensible location for the substation for a variety of reasons.

First, quality of life health issues are at stake at Site A (Kenas Road). Potential danger from electromagnetic fields/radiation is deterrent enough in a residential neighborhood filled with children, as well as in the 172 acres of Windlestrae Park, the largest dedicated recreational area in Montgomery Township, which is constantly used by both children and adults.

Second, the danger of accident/death/loss of property from fire is deterrent enough in a residential neighborhood like Site A (Kenas Road).

Third, quality of life aesthetic issues are a real concern at Site A (Kenas Road). Who wants to look out his/her window on a less than attractive electrical substation?

Fourth, zoning cannot be ignored as a significant factor. When the newly suggested site (farther within the Hartman Road Industrial Complex) is already zoned "light industrial," that site clearly poses the least "impact as practical" on the totally residential area of Site A (Kenas Road).

Last, financial issues are a substantive part of the equation at Site A (Kenas Road). Most residents have invested their life savings and more in their homes. No one wants that investment jeopardized!

In an effort to be pro-active, we have already voiced our concerns/site preference to Ms. Suzanne Ryan, the County Affairs Manager of PECO, in a telephone conversation between her and Mrs. DeStefano on Tuesday, May 18, 2004, and in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. Dennis O'Brien, the


President of PECO, in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. Kenneth G. Lawrence, Chairman of PECO and Senior Vice-President of Exelon Corporation, in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. John W. Dear Commissioner Fitzpatrick,

i am a concerned citizen that lives near the proposed site of the new PECO Energy Company electric substation in Montgomery County (Horsham and Kenas Road).

We understand PECO's intentions for choosing a site include:

- 1) little impact as practical on nearby residents
- 2) little impact as practical on sensitive environmental areas

This site (Horsham and Kenas Road) is literally in the backyard of at least five residential communities (Estates of Montgomery, Windlestrae, Venco Group, Raven Hollow and Neshaminy Falls) to name a few. There are thousands of adults and hundreds of young children to consider.

There is a 172-acre park (Windlestrae Park) right down the road from the proposed location. It is the largest dedicated recreational area in Montgomery Township. Windlestrae is used in winter and summer, day and evening with baseball fields, soccer fields, four tennis courts, picnic areas, basketball courts, volleyball area and hiking paths.

The long term effects from exposure to substation radiation are still being argued today. However, what is known and cannot be argued is that all of us in these nearby neighborhoods and parks will receive an increased level of radiation exposure because we will be exposed on a *continual basis*. Whether we or our children will develop cancer in 10-20 years down the road is not known but we sure are at a greater risk than if we lived in a neighborhood without such exposure. That is a chance that most of us are not willing to take.

In addition, our home values will decrease dramatically as well.

The effects on us will be far from "little impact." We understand that development (both residential and industrial) in Montgomery County has



We are concerned citizens who live near the proposed site of the PECO Energy Company electric substation in Montgomery County (Horsham and Kenas Roads).

We understand PECO's intentions for choosing a site include the following:

1. creating as little impact as practical on nearby residents
2. creating as little impact as practical on sensitive environmental areas

The proposed site fails to satisfy both scenarios. First, it is literally adjacent to no fewer than five large residential communities (Raven Hollow, Estates of Montgomery, Windlestrae, Venco Group and Neshaminy Falls) and is nearby to several other large residential developments in Montgomery Township. These communities are home to thousands of adults and hundreds of young children who must be taken into consideration when making such a decision.

Second, there is a 172-acre park (Windlestrae Park) less than one-half mile from the proposed location. It is the largest dedicated recreational area in Montgomery Township and one of the largest in the entire County. It is used in winter and summer, day and evening, and it includes baseball and soccer fields, tennis, basketball and volleyball courts, picnics areas and hiking paths.

The long-term effects of exposure to substation radiation are still being debated. However, what IS known and cannot be argued is that all of us living in these nearby communities and using the nearby park will receive an increased level of radiation exposure because we will be exposed on a CONTINUAL BASIS. Whether we or our children will develop cancer in 10 or 20 years is not known, but it is certain that we would be at greater risk than individuals living in a neighborhood without such exposure. We are not willing to take that chance, nor should we be forced to. We are also concerned that our property values will decrease dramatically. This is hardly "little impact."

We understand that development (both residential and industrial) in Montgomery County has increased dramatically over the last several years. As a result, we naturally need to accommodate the increased demand for electricity and transmission. But a substation of this magnitude DOES NOT BELONG IN A DENSELY POPULATED RESIDENTIAL AREA, especially when other sites being considered are zoned "light industrial."

We and our neighbors will use every resource available to us to prevent the construction of this substation at Horsham and Kenas Roads. We will not give up easily.


My wife and family and I are concerned and deeply troubled by the proposed site of the new PECO electric substation in Montgomery County at the Horsham and Kenas Road intersection. It is our understanding that when PECO chooses a site that as little impact on nearby residents and environmental areas are major considerations. This particular site is bordering the five residential communities of the Estates of Montgomery, Windlestrae, Venco Group, Raven Hollow and Neshaminy Falls. These communities contain thousands of adults and young children. In addition there is an extremely large park and recreational area (Windlestrae Park) a few hundred yards from the proposed site. The Little Neshaminy creek also is nearby.

The long-term effect of exposure from substation radiation is of major concern. Long-term effects are as yet unknown. We will, however, receive increased levels of radiation exposure. This indeed will lead to higher levels of risk for cancer and other related diseases.

There is a lot of open space available in sparsely populated areas of the county that should be evaluated. Substations of this magnitude should be relegated to industrial designated areas.

Dear Chairman Fitzpatrick:

As you are more than aware, PECO Energy Company is planning a new substation in Montgomery Township in the very near future. As residents of the Estates of Montgomery, one of the sites under consideration (Site A, Kenas Road), we believe voicing our concerns/site preference directly to you is both impelling and expedient. Given all the factors surrounding this new facility, we submit that the **newly suggested** third site (**farther within the Hartman Road Industrial Complex**) is, at this time, the most feasible and sensible location for the substation for a variety of reasons.

First, quality of life health issues are at stake at Site A (Kenas Road). Potential danger from electromagnetic fields/radiation is deterrent enough in a residential neighborhood filled with children, as well as in the 172 acres of Windlestrae Park, the largest dedicated recreational area in Montgomery Township, which is constantly used by both children and adults.

Second, the danger of accident/death/loss of property from fire is deterrent enough in a residential neighborhood like Site A (Kenas Road).

Third, quality of life aesthetic issues are a real concern at Site A (Kenas Road). Who wants to look out his/her window on a less than attractive electrical substation?

Fourth, zoning cannot be ignored as a significant factor. When the newly suggested site (farther within the Hartman Road Industrial Complex) is already zoned "light industrial," that site clearly poses the least "impact as practical" on the totally residential area of Site A (Kenas Road).

Last, financial issues are a substantive part of the equation at Site A (Kenas Road). Most residents have invested their life savings and more in their homes. No one wants that investment jeopardized!

In an effort to be pro-active, we have already voiced our concerns/site preference to Ms. Suzanne Ryan, the County Affairs Manager of PECO, in a telephone conversation between her and Mrs. DeStefano on Tuesday, May 18, 2004, and in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. Dennis O'Brien, the


President of PECO, in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. Kenneth G. Lawrence, Chairman of PECO and Senior Vice-President of Exelon Corporation, in a letter of June 7, 2004; to Mr. John W. Rowe, Chairman and CEO of Exelon Corporation, in a letter of June 7, 2004; to State Senator Stewart J.
