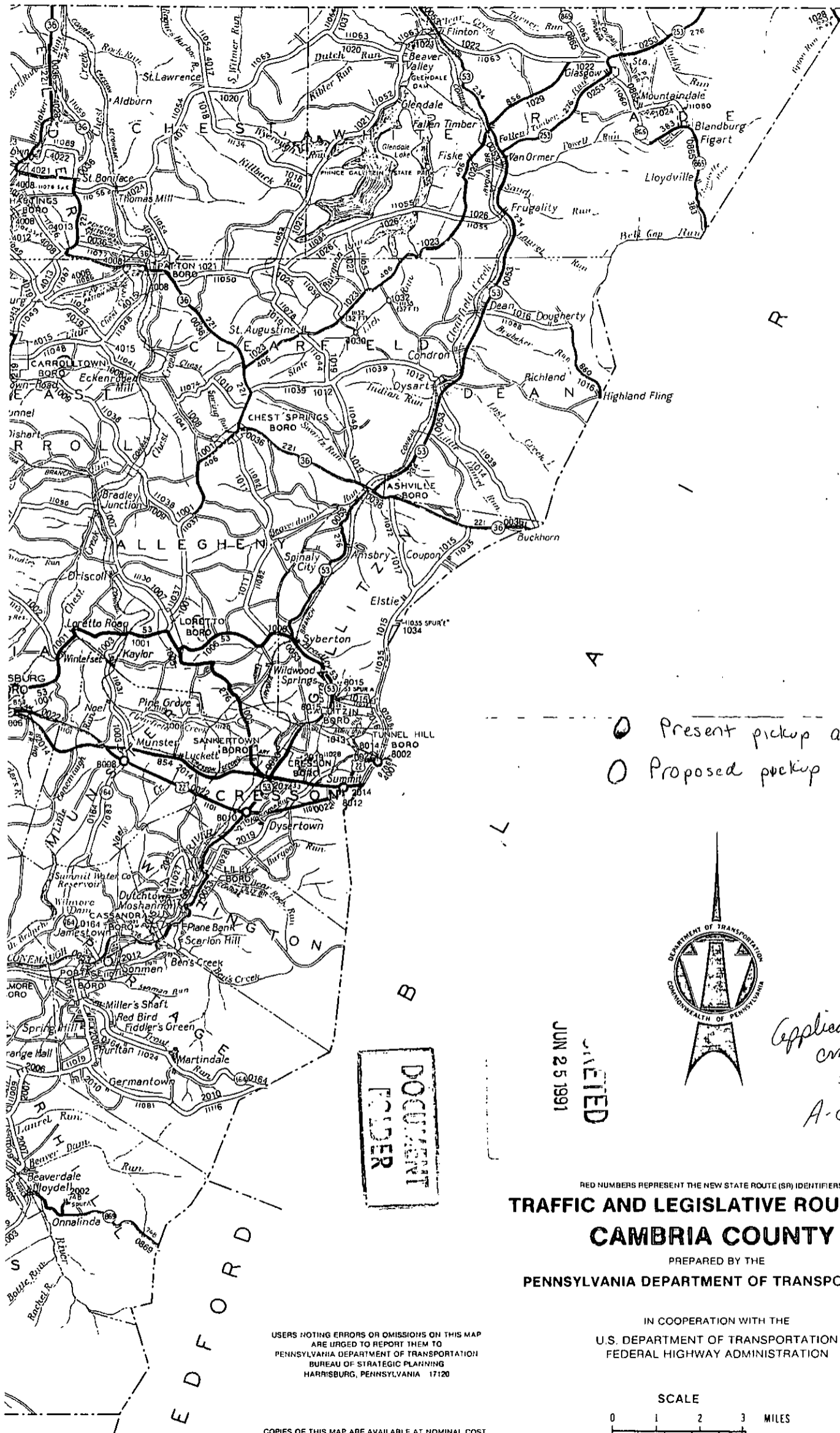

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed April 25, 1983. Public notice of the application appeared in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of June 25, 1983. Additional public notice was advertised in the June 28, 1983 edition of the Altoona Mirror, a newspaper of general circulation published in Altoona, Blair County; and in the June 29, 1983 publication of the Tribune-Democrat, a newspaper of general circulation in the city of Johnstown, Cambria County.

EXHIBIT A

One protest was timely filed on behalf of Blue & White Lines, Inc., by Herbert R. Nurick, on July 13, 1983, and was subsequently withdrawn on March 2, 1984. The application is now unopposed and the record is certified to the Commission for its decision without an oral hearing.

The record consist of a verified statement of the applicant, 31 statements of group witnesses and 42 individual statements supporting the applicant.

J. Richard Fullington, president of Fullington Auto Bus Company (Fullington or applicant) of Clearfield, PA, sets forth in his verified statement that he is familiar with all aspects of his company's operations and is authorized to provide the following information. Although the applicant is not affiliated with other carriers, it is a member of the Trailways System, which allows it to offer through service for Trailways members in interstate transportation. In the instant application, Fullington seeks to amend its authority at Folder 19, to enable it to provide group and party service from Blair and Cambria Counties to points in Pennsylvania, excluding various points in Blair County. The applicant has extensive intrastate authority, primarily for scheduled route and group and party service, and currently serves portions of Cambria and Blair Counties. Fullington also has various interstate authority and operates charter service in Cambria and Blair Counties under MC-2796.

The main terminal and headquarters of Fullington, located in Clearfield, PA, consist of general offices, repair and parking facilities. Two other terminals are located at State College and DuBois. The DuBois terminal serves as an exchange point for Fullington's Pittsburgh-DuBois-Buffalo-State College-DuBois route. The applicant has the privilege of utilizing additional terminals at Altoona, Bradford and Pittsburgh, which are not company owned. All terminals have ticket agencies for Fullington, and in addition, Fullington has numerous ticket outlets throughout Pennsylvania. The proposed transportation can be adequately served using the applicant's present terminal network.

Fullington has 28 charter coaches in its operating fleet and anticipates early delivery of five new coaches. These vehicles are air-conditioned, with reclining seats and are equipped with restrooms, radios and public address systems. The applicant intends to use these coaches in the proposed service, but will also offer school buses or suburban coaches upon request.

Fullington maintains insurance coverage which exceeds Commission requirements. All vehicles are periodically inspected and safety checked before use. Defects noted on drivers' logs are corrected. All drivers are familiar with safety regulations.

The service proposed by Fullington will originate at any point within the scope of the application. Trips will be for one day or extended, at the option of the group. Tours will include meals, hotel

reservations and admission to points of interest. Local tour guides and guides employed by Fullington will also be available when required.

The unaudited financial statement for 1983 submitted by the applicant reflects a cash position of \$109,479 with total tangible assets of \$739,290. Total current liabilities are \$635,339 and exceed the total current assets of \$369,200. The applicant explains that \$197,728 of the total current liabilities represent notes payable within one year and that \$132,837 is outstanding on advance ticket purchases. The applicant's income statement shows operating revenues of \$3,066,722 and net income of \$17,977 after taxes. The applicant's present terminal facilities, ticket agencies, equipment and personnel will enable it to readily provide the additional service with no capital expenditure or operational change.

Statements of support of the instant application have been submitted by a total of 31 group witnesses. These are diverse groups such as travel agencies, businesses, schools and colleges, churches and civic organizations located throughout Blair and Cambria Counties, as follows: Hobar Travel Agency, Citizens Concerned for Human Life, Inc., and Senior Activities Center, Inc. all of Johnstown; Northern Cambria Elementary Middle School and Hope Fire Co. both of Barnesboro; Cambria Heights Highlander Marching Band of Patton; Bishop Carroll High School and Senior Citizen Center both of Ebensburg; Carrolltown Senior Citizens of Carrolltown; Ramblers Club Chapter 8 of Fallentimber; Senior Center in Spangler; St. Francis College of Loretto; Fireman's Club and Senior Citizens of Hastings; Cove Shoe Company and Morrison's Cove Memorial Park Association of Martinsburg; IGA and Great American Vacations in Williamsburg; Blair County Christian School, Golden Age Club, Small Tube Co. and VFW all of Duncansville; Appleton Papers, Inc. of Roaring Spring; Spade and Travel Garden Club, Blair County Extension Service and Holidaysburg Area Band, all of Holidaysburg; Church of Brethren in Curryville; Claysburg-Kimmel High School Band of Claysburg; and Sky Bros. employees, no address given. All statements express a need for group and party service from said counties to various destinations in Pennsylvania with frequency averaging approximately one trip per month.

In addition, statements of support were entered by 42 individuals residing in Blair and Cambria Counties, all attesting to the need for charter service from points in said counties to cultural, athletic, political, recreational and other activities throughout the Commonwealth. The names and addresses of these witnesses are as follows: Dorothy Grigg and William Kolar of South Fork; Nancy E. Coleman of Portage; Betty A. Eckenrode of Cresson; Ellen Curry of Glasgow; Joan Kuhn of Patton; Madeline Goss, Irma B. Shea, Victoria S. Montonaro, Ann E. Kertis, Michael Novak, and Cynthia Chernisky all of Barnesboro; Theresa Morealli of St. Benedict; Nancy Sassano of Ebensburg; Dolores Huether, Mike Jubie, Marie Miller and Betty Smolko all of Spangler; Helen Zeglin and Ceil Bire of Hastings; M. Jo Wagner of Flinton; Kathleen McCreary, Dwella Roger, Vernon J. Miller, Charlotte Davidson, Vivian Mansfield and Doretta Kane all of Johnstown; Brother Stephen Sorach of Loretto; Glenn Wenzel of Imler; Kenneth Shultz of Martinsburg; John B. Rizzo of

Altoona; Frank P. Gazzara of Claysburg; Ethel Mae Smith, Arlene Delozier, Mildred Marlin, Isabel Nori, Harold A. Wilt, and Robert Smith all of Hollidaysburg; Tessa A. Mayhew Corbin, Russell L. Crownover and Grace Schultz, all of Williamsburg; and Linda Wolford of Newry. Some expressed dissatisfaction with present service in the area, inconvenient points of pickup and discharge, poor selection of tours or high costs. Many cited having used the applicant in interstate travel with good results.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Fullington Auto Bus Company seeks to amend its group and party authority at Folder 19 to encompass service from Blair and Cambria Counties, excluding named points in Blair County currently served by the applicant. The sole protestant, Blue & White Lines, Inc., withdrew its protest upon reconsideration, without restrictive amendment. This withdrawal is predicated upon restriction of service in the instant application from points in the city of Altoona, borough of Bellwood and Logan, Antis, Snyder and Tyrone Townships, Blair County. Fullington's present authority at Folder 19, Am-A, authorizes group or party service from said points and also excludes the transportation from any point in Altoona and Logan Township to any point in Altoona and Logan Township. The protestant desires to preserve this exclusion in the application before us.

The applicant currently provides intrastate scheduled route and group and party service to various points in Blair and Cambria Counties and also serves said counties in interstate charter operations.

The applicant's financial data shows that Fullington's total current liabilities exceed its total current assets of \$369,200, but when short term notes payable of \$197,728 and advance ticket COD's of \$132,837 are deducted from total current liabilities, the applicant's financial position appears sound. For the year ending 1983, the applicant showed a net profit of \$17,977 after taxes.

Fullington has amassed the support of 31 group and 42 individual witnesses from Blair and Cambria Counties attesting to the need for service in the area. Many of these witnesses have used the applicant interstate service and found it satisfactory. From the public support demonstrated, it appears that a need exists for additional service in Blair and Cambria Counties. Fullington has long experience in the transportation of persons and already has the necessary terminal facilities, personnel and equipment in place to enable this expansion of service with no capital expenditure.

We find:

1. That the applicant is fit, willing and able to provide the proposed transportation.
2. That the applicant has shown a public need for the service.

3. That approval of the application is an accommodation and convenience to the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved and that the certificate issued on March 12, 1935 be and is hereby amended to include the following right:


To transport, as a common carrier, groups and parties of persons and persons on special excursions and tours or sight-seeing trips, from points in the counties of Cambria and Blair (except the city of Altoona, the borough of Bellwood and the townships of Logan, Antis, Snyder and Tyrone) to points in Pennsylvania.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the carrier, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code relating to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

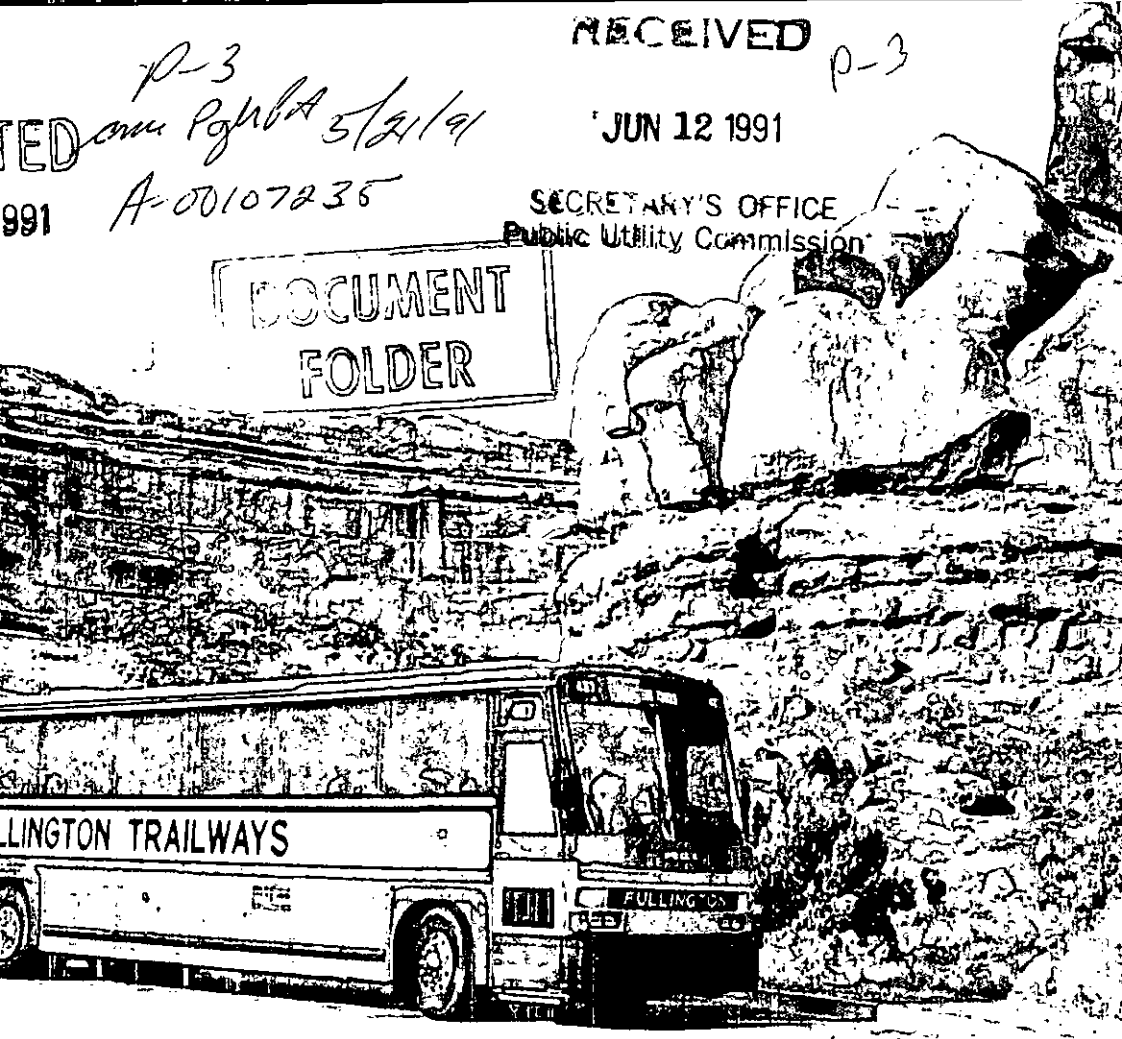

Tour Policies and General Information

ADDITIONAL TOURS: Keep abreast of the new tours that we add during the year by checking your local newspaper. Also, we have updated addendums available at any of our offices.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: An increasing demand has been placed on us to ban the use of alcoholic beverages on our tours. To enhance the ride for all passengers, alcoholic beverages will not be permitted on the bus. No coolers are allowed in the seating area; they will be placed in the luggage compartment. For safety and pleasure of all, we kindly ask your cooperation.

BAGGAGE: One piece of baggage will be allowed per person. A small carry-on will be permitted if handled by the passenger. You may take two pieces of baggage on tours 8 days or longer; pack so you can use from one piece during the first half of the tour and from the other piece the last half. While every effort is made to handle the baggage as carefully as possible, we can not assume liability for lost or damaged baggage. Baggage identification tags will be issued to you and we require that this tag remain on the bag during the tour.

CREDITS ON FUTURE TOURS: Upon cancellation of a tour the customer may choose credit on a future tour instead of a refund. Credits must be used within one year of date of cancellation.

DISRUPTIVE PASSENGER: It is the option of the motorcoach driver and/or escort to put off of the bus any passenger who is acting in an abusive manner or posing a safety hazard to the tour. The expelled tour passenger will not be eligible for any refund or compensation from Fullington Auto Bus Company, Inc. The driver will ensure that the passenger is left in a public place with access to telephone and shelter.

ESCORTS: Many of our tours provide the accompaniment of an escort. These escorts are dedicated, caring people who provide additional support to the passengers for their comfort and entertainment. Our escorts are not "guides" because even though they may be knowledgeable in some geographic areas, they can not be expected to know details of all destinations. If you would like to have an escort on a group charter, please inform your charter department contact and it can be arranged.

GRATUITIES OR TIPPING: All expected tipping to porters, bellmen and waiters on included meals is included in the cost of the tour. The traditional end-of-trip gratuity to your tour escort and driver is not included. If you feel they have helped you to enjoy your tour, we suggest you enclose a gratuity in an envelope and present it individually at the end of the tour (rather than pass the hat).

GROUP LEADERS AND CHARTER GROUPS: Deluxe individualized tours can be customized to fit any group's needs. Just let us know what you need and we can arrange a trip for your group. Call our charter department at 1-800-322-5591. They can help you arrange any type tour to fit all price ranges. Call today.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS BEFORE AND AFTER: For your convenience, Fullington Tours would like to help you add to your vacationing pleasure by offering pre and post tour lodging. If you stay at one of these hotels, the bus will make a special pickup for you there at no additional charge. You will need to make your reservations for these hotels through Fullington Tours. That way we can assure you the rates and guarantee your special pickup. The properties have assured us that you can leave your vehicles in their lot at no charge while on the tour.

Also, while every effort is made to protect your personal property on a tour, Fullington Auto Bus Company, Inc. is not liable for lost, stolen, or damaged articles. Please check your homeowner's insurance to ascertain your coverage for baggage.

ITINERARIES: Itineraries are mailed out to passengers on tours of 7 day duration and longer. Itineraries include a brief schedule of daily events and motel accommodations. Itineraries are for your general information and are subject to change. Due to the time and cost involved, itineraries are not sent for those trips lasting less than 7 days. If you desire a brief itinerary on a tour 6-2 days, send a self-addressed stamped envelope to PO Box 211; Clearfield, PA 16830. PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP WHEN CROSSING USA BORDER: Proof is required on all tours traveling to or through Canada, Mexico, or the Bahamas. To enter and leave, all U.S. citizens should carry as proof of citizenship (not packed in suitcase) birth certificate, voter's registration card, passport or naturalization papers*. Non-citizens must have a valid passport, visa or alien card which permits entry into Canada, Mexico or the Bahamas plus a 'multiple entry visa' for return to the U.S. You will not be allowed to cross the border without the proper

papers. Keep them with you at all times. If you are from a country other than Canada or the United States, contact your local consulate if you have any questions.

*A driver's license alone is not acceptable.

REFUNDS: This policy will apply regardless of reason for cancellation and in fairness to all, we cannot make exceptions. Cancellation fees apply whether or not a passenger changes to or is re-booked on another tour.

REFUNDS ON 1 DAY TOURS: When cancellations are made by you, the customer, full refunds will be made on 1 day tours cancelled 14 days prior to departure date unless incidentals, tickets or other fees have been prepaid. Cancellations for a one day tour received less than 14 days prior to departure date will be subject to a minimum \$5.00 per person or 10% of tour price cancellation fee which ever is greater. NO REFUNDS given on cancellation made one day prior to or day of tour departure including no-shows.

REFUNDS ON MULTI-DAY TOURS: When cancellations are made by you, the customer, full refunds will be made on multi-day tours cancelled 30 days or more prior to departure date unless incidentals, tickets and hotels have been prepaid. Cancellations for a multi-day tour received less than 30 days prior to departure will be subject to a 10% cancellation fee based on the total price of the tour. NO REFUNDS given on cancellations made 72 hours prior to tour departure.

Deposits are required and cancellation fees are calculated to cover certain guarantees which are made 14 days before the tours depart, and to cover out-of-pocket costs for telephone calls, letters and for the time and effort of office personnel required to execute cancellation notices. **Refund will be sent after tour returns** and is processed by the bookkeeping department, generally four to six weeks.

There are **NO** refunds for tickets to Broadway plays, sporting events, or other special entertainment events for which admission tickets must be purchased by Fullington Auto Bus Company in advance. Fullington acts as an agent for its customers in purchasing such tickets, once they are sold to the customer, tickets become the customer's responsibility. Office personnel will attempt to re-sell such tickets for you if you must cancel, but cannot accept any responsibility to do so. Also there are no refunds on any unused sightseeing or admissions on a tour package.

RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS, & PAYMENTS: Reservations may be made by phone. Early reservations assure you the tour of your choice. Tours 8 or more days require a \$100.00 deposit per person when the reservation is made and payment in full 1 month prior. Tours 2 - 7 days require a \$50.00 deposit per person when the reservation is made and payment in full 1 month prior to departure. One day tours require payment in full within 1 week from date of reservation.

All reservations not paid in full 10 business days prior to departure date will be automatically cancelled and subject to cancellation fee. Reservations made after deadline will be accepted on a seats-available basis. **HOWEVER**, payment in full must be received within two business days.

Receipts are not sent out for payments received in the mail. Your cancelled check is receipt of payment. Payment sent by mail should be sent promptly. When sending payment by mail, be sure to specify name of trip and date. Checks should be made payable to **Fullington AutoBus Company**.

RESPONSIBILITY: Tours shown herein are operated by Fullington Auto Bus Co. and act solely in the capacity of agents on behalf of their tour patrons in arranging for transportation, lodging, sightseeing, and other services, and as such are not responsible for any damage, loss, delay, injury, or accident due to any act or default on the part of any company or persons engaged in providing transportation, lodging, sightseeing, or other services which are a part of these tours.

In addition, Fullington Auto Bus Co. will not be responsible for (1) mechanical breakdowns, government actions, weather, acts of God, or other circumstances beyond its control, (2) the failure to obtain required documentation, including passports, visa and health certificates, (3) overbooking by the hotel and hotel imposed surcharges, (4) failure to follow instructions, including but not limited to, check in and out times and baggage handling, and (5) inconvenience generated by strike or other work stoppage involving the heretofore referenced independent firms.

We anticipate no changes in the published tours, but reserve the right to withdraw, alter the schedule, change the routing on tariffs at the time of printing and are subject to change before final payment. The right is reserved to cancel any tour prior to departure and in such case all payment will be refunded.

SEATING: Since all seats on the type motor coach used are comfortable with reclining adjustments, there will be no seats reserved. On multiple day tours, seating will be rotated at the driver's discretion.

SMOKING: In order to provide maximum comfort for our passengers, a **NO SMOKING** policy has been adopted on all tours. We do, however, make frequent rest stops for your convenience.



SOLO TOUR PASSENGERS: Tour passengers traveling alone are welcomed on all our tours. However, due to the double seat configuration on the bus, you may have to sit with another solo passenger as to accommodate passengers traveling together.

SPECIAL PICKUPS: Due to the cost, special pickups are available on a limited basis. For a free special pickup you must have a minimum of 10 paying passengers at one point.

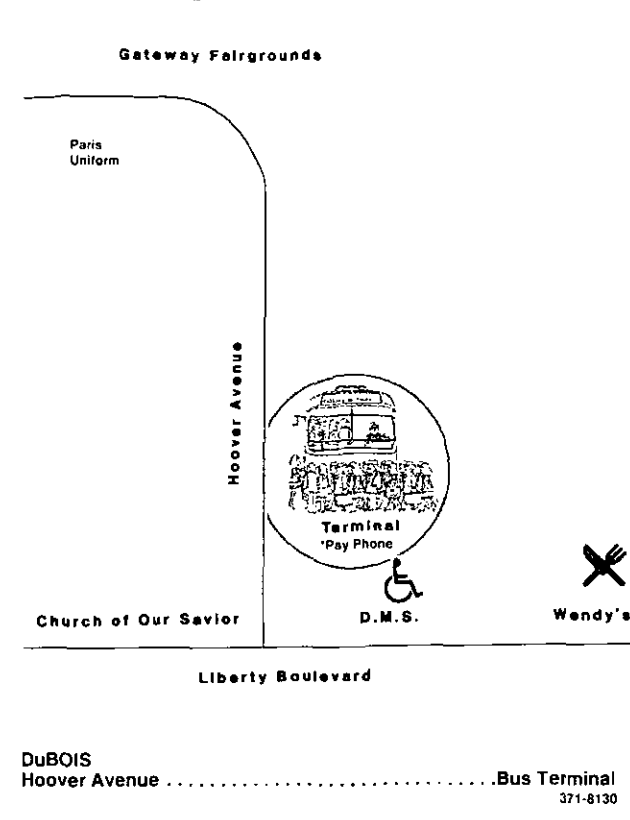
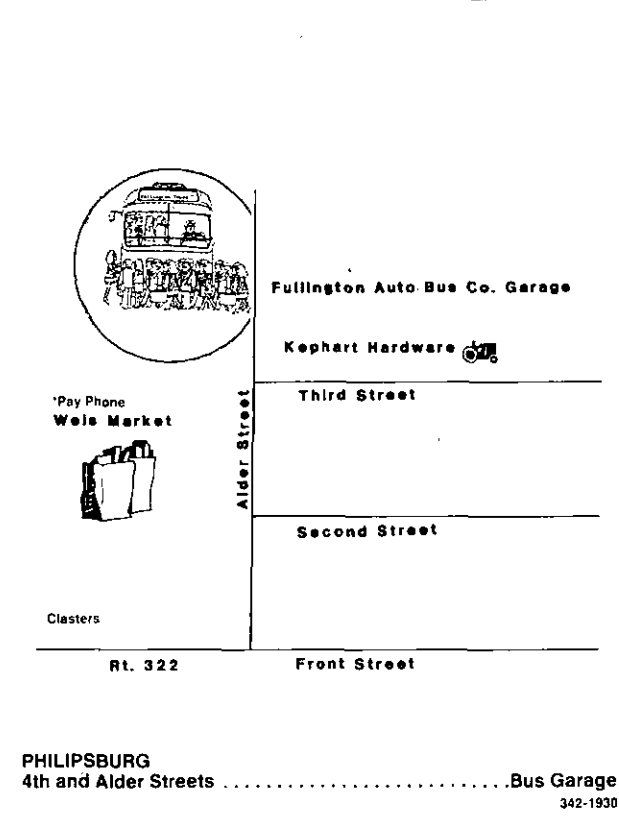
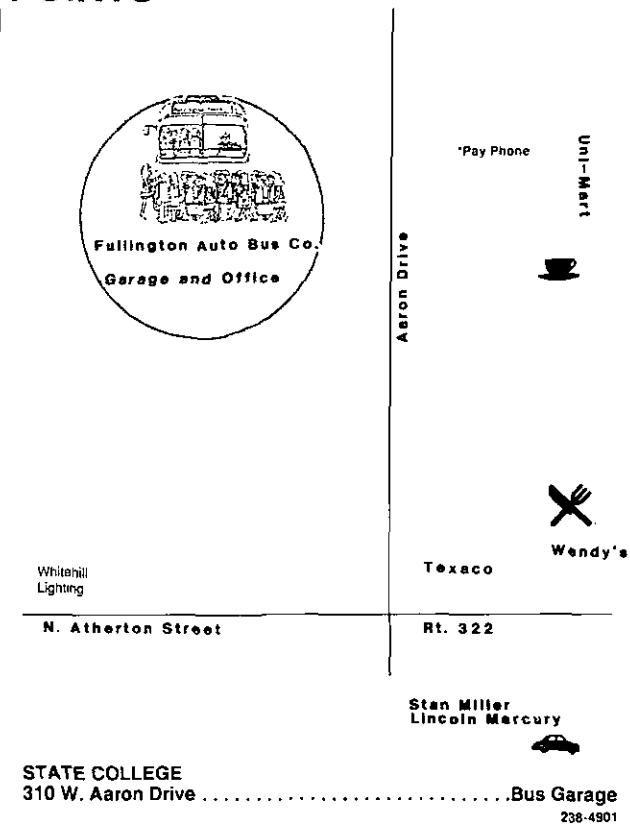
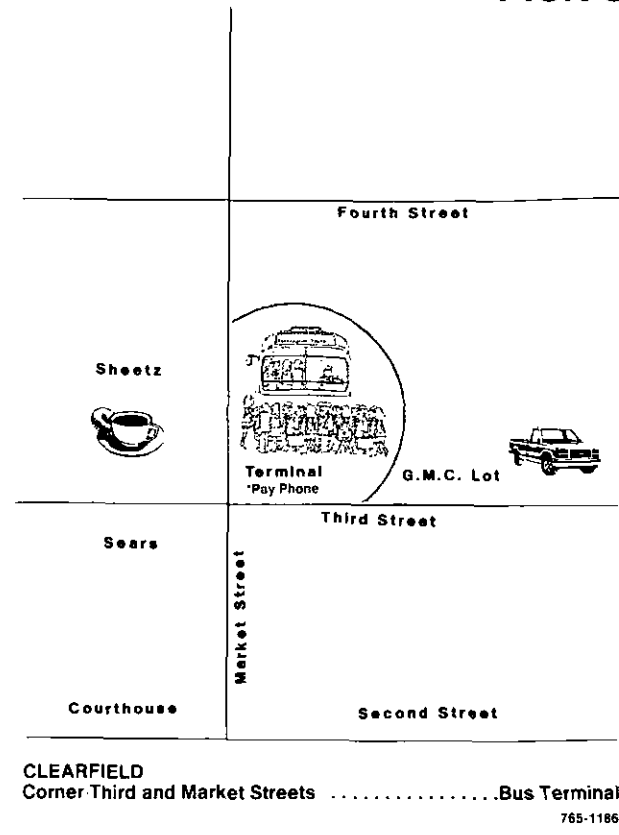

A BRIEF HISTORY

In 1889, Emerson M. Fullington with his two sons, Ai and Richard, began a livery and surrey company, along with their lumber supply business. The nine passenger surrey transported Clearfielders to the Pennsylvania Railroad Station. On February 12, 1915, Fullington Auto Bus Company was born. The fleet was made up of two Model 15 White Buses. The schedule route ran the seven miles between Clearfield and Curwensville. The horse barn housed the buses on the site of the present day garage in downtown Clearfield.

Fullington Auto Bus Company kept expanding its schedule service. During World War II, the line run bus between Clearfield and Tyrone was loaded up several times a day carrying the troops to war and bringing them home again. The company has operated school bus contracts for over fifty years. The contracts have included Clearfield Area School District, Philipsburg-Osceola School District, Ridgway School District, West Branch School District, Curwensville Schools, State College Area School District, Bellefonte School district, Juniata School District (Mifflintown), and Marion Center School District. In the early 1960's, public tours were offered to such points as the New York City's World Fair for \$15.00 per person including fair admission; a day in Pittsburgh for \$4.00 per person; and a 29-day trip to the Pacific Northwest for \$425.00 including sightseeing and accommodations.

Today the company is owned and operated by J. Richard Fullington, Sr. and his wife, Tillie along with their sons, J. Richard, Jr. and Michael. In 1990, the buses traveled over 3.3 million miles and carried 660,000 passengers. The company has expanded from the original "bus barn" to five garage locations at Clearfield, Philipsburg, State College, Dubois, and Marion Center and from 3 employees to 350 employees. The fleet of 145 vehicles includes deluxe motorcoaches, school buses, limo vans, stretch limousines and our vintage 1915 antique bus.



THE ANTIQUE BUS

In September 1986, Dick Fullington, Sr., along with his wife, Tillie, and grandsons, Michael John, and Matthew, headed West to try and track down our original auto bus. It had gone to the National Park Service as a touring vehicle at Yellowstone National Park. Dick found and talked with Jerry Pressman who had been one of the drivers of the bus, but Jerry had no idea where any of the buses had gone. While staying in Yellowstone National Park, the Information Station directed Dick to a lady who worked in the gift shop who may have some idea. This lady knew the name of the housemother of the fraternity that had bought one of the buses. Dick called the housemother of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity at the Montana State University in Bozeman. She knew of the bus and told how the fraternity had nicknamed it "Minerva" and used it for many functions and parties. With the skyrocketing liability insurance cost, the fraternity had more or less junked the bus in some alumni's barn, she thought. Next, Dick called Harry Mitchell, the President of the Alumni Association of SAE. Mr. Mitchell said that the bus was at his home in Great Falls. The Fullingtons traveled to Mr. Mitchell's home to find the shell of the bus and several boxes of bits and pieces. A deal was struck with the fraternity. Preparations were made to get everything gathered up and transported back to Central Pennsylvania. In August 1987, Bill and Dottie Albert of Westboro, Massachusetts, brought the bus (and the many boxes of parts) home to Clearfield on their flatbed trailer. Now the real work began! The mechanics and body shop personnel started cleaning and repairing, repainting and refinishing, reconditioning and recreating the Fullington Auto Bus Company Vehicle. Tracking down many of the missing pieces became a nationwide search. The brass taxi horn came from Chicago, Illinois. The carbide headlamps reached us from Vermont. The porcelain antique license plates were found in Dover, Delaware. The single kerosene tail light came out of an antique brass store in Staten Island, New York. The old-time brass fire extinguisher was found in the company's own attic in Clearfield.



SOME OF THE UNIQUE FACTS AND CHARACTERISTICS

- The first manufacturing company of this type of vehicle was the White Company. E.M. Fullington and Sons were the dealer for White and so had the first option to purchase these vehicles in our area.
- The original name for this type of new vehicle configuration was an auto bus hence the Fullington's current name.
- The headlamps are lit from carbide gas produced from a tank on the side of the bus. These lights are identical to the ones the miners use to wear on their hardhats.
- With absence of batteries and starters, the Auto Bus was started with a hand crank and a strong arm. There is a four speed transmission.
- There are no windshield wipers.
- There is no heater, and in the winter, the passengers wore extra clothes and had buffalo robes to put over their laps.
- The baggage compartment in the rear is fashioned after those on a stage coach with leather straps and canvas cover.
- The tires are tube and the wheels solid wood.
- The top touring speed was around 25 M.P.H.
- The roof is made of canvas with side windows that would roll down for some protection from the rain. The seats are covered in black leather.
- The White Company originally offered a choice of colors. You could select black or black. Like the original auto bus, the bus is painted black with gold leaf lettering:
- The driver of the auto bus would wear leather jodphurs because there was no fire wall like today between the engine and the driver. The heat off of the engine would set a driver's cotton pants on fire!
- The original cost of the auto bus was \$2500.

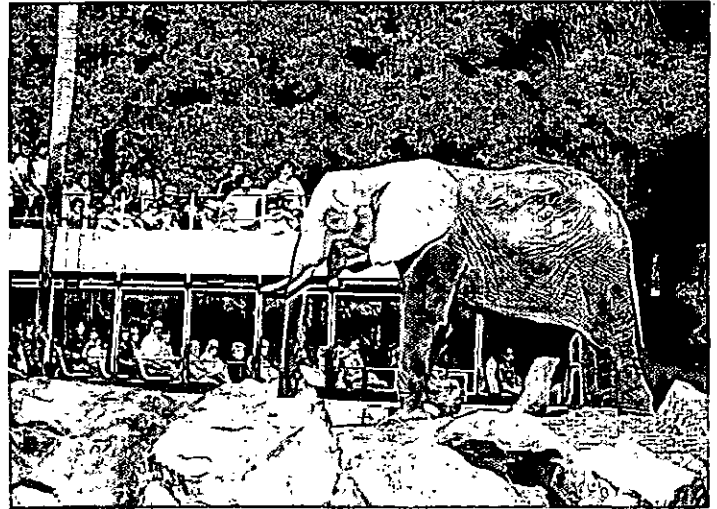

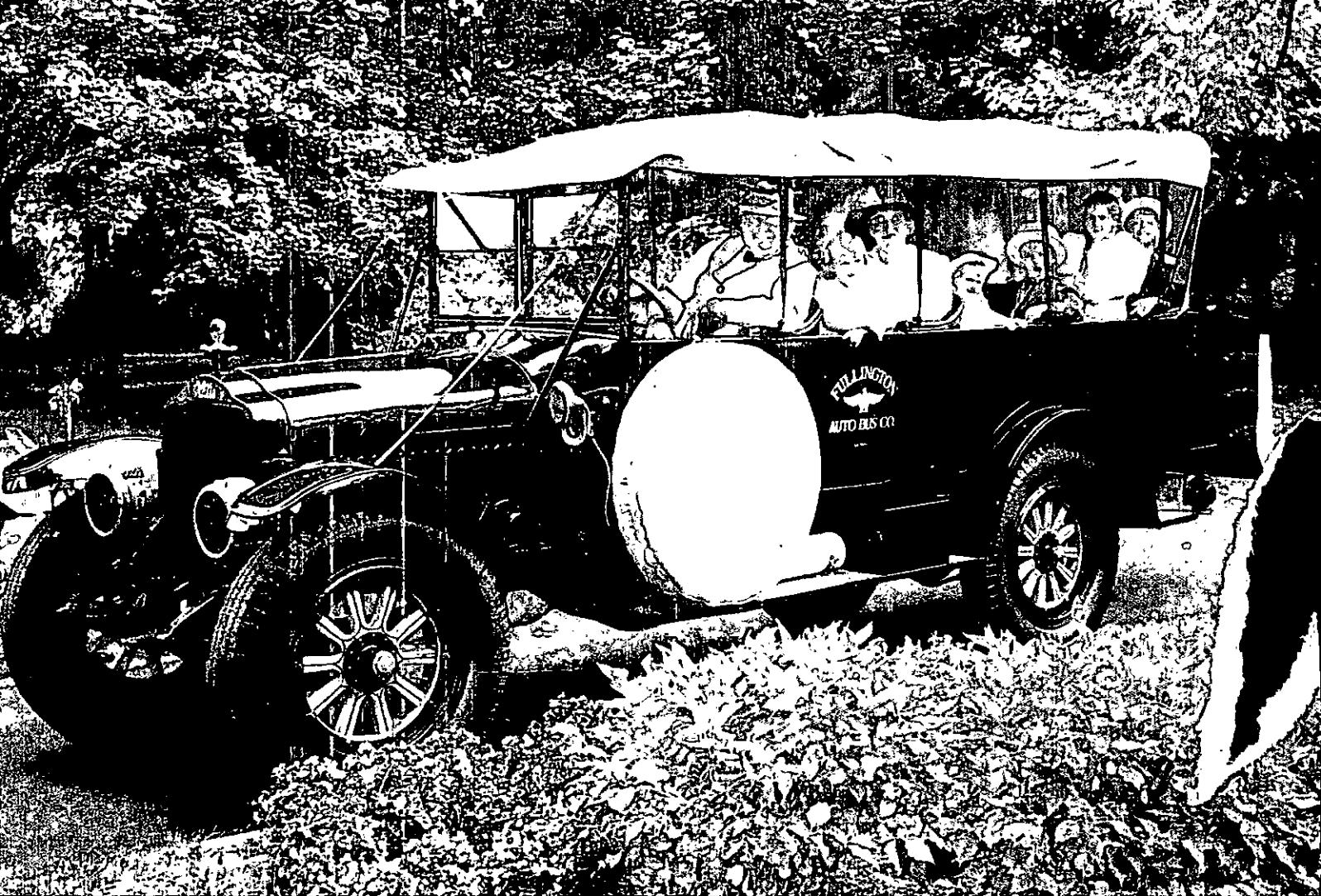
