Tour Policies and General Information

ADDITIONAL TOURS: Keep abreast of the new tours that we add during the year by checking your local newspaper.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: An increasing demand has been placed on us to ban the use of alcoholic beverages on our tours. To enhance the ride for all passengers, alcoholic beverages will not be permitted on the bus. No coolers are allowed in the seating area; they will be placed in the luggage compartment. For safety and pleasure of all, we kindly ask your cooperation.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: In compliance with Federal regulations, we require a 48 hour advance notice for individuals needing boarding assistance onto the motorcoach. Please call if you have any questions.

BAGGAGE: One piece of baggage will be allowed per person. A small carry-on will be permitted if handled by the passenger. You may take two pieces of baggage on tours 8 days or longer; pack so you can use from one piece during the first half of the tour and from the other piece the last half. While every effort is made to handle the baggage as carefully as possible, we can not assume liability for lost or damaged baggage. Baggage identification tags will be issued to you and we require that this tag remain on the bag during the tour.

CREDITS ON FUTURE TOURS: Upon cancellation of a tour the customer may choose credit on a future tour instead of a refund. Credits must be used within one year of date of cancellation.

DEPARTURE TIMES: Departure times are based on average driving times between pick-up points. On occasion, due to weather conditions, road conditions, or drivers waiting for tardy passengers, the bus may be running late. We recommend that passengers wait a minimum of 30 minutes from their original pick-up time before leaving the pick-up point. Before leaving a pick-up point, please try to contact the Fullington Company at State College (814-238-4901 or 800-322-5591) or at Clearfield (814-765-7871 or 800-252-3893) even if it is not normal office hours there is often someone in the garage that can help.

DISRUPTIVE PASSENGER: It is the option of the motorcoach driver and/or escort to put off of the bus any passenger who is acting in an abusive manner or posing a safety hazard to the tour. The expelled tour passenger will not be eligible for any refund or compensation from Fullington Auto Bus Company, Inc. The driver will ensure that the passenger is left in a public place with access to telephone and shelter.

ESCORTS: Many of our tours provide the accompaniment of an escort. These escorts are dedicated, caring people who provide additional support to the passengers for their comfort and entertainment. Our escorts are not "guides" because even though they may be knowledgeable in some geographic areas, they can not be expected to know details of all destinations. If you would like to have an escort on a group charter, please inform your charter department contact and it can be arranged.

GRATUITIES OR TIPPING: All expected tipping to porters, bellmen and waiters on included meals is included in the cost of the tour. The traditional end-of-trip gratuity to your tour escort and driver is not included. If you feel they have helped you to enjoy your tour, we suggest you enclose a gratuity in an envelope and present it individually at the end of the tour (rather than pass the hat).

GROUP LEADERS AND CHARTER GROUPS: Deluxe individualized tours can be customized to fit any group's needs. Just let us know what you need and we can arrange a trip for your group. Call our charter department at 1-800-322-5591. They can help you arrange any type tour to fit all price ranges. Call today.

★ CHARTER POLICY FOR GROUPS

Deposits and Payments: Deposits are required as a means of confirming your motorcoach. A \$100.00 per tour day deposit is required at time of confirmation. For example, a one day tour will require \$100.00 deposit, a five day tour would require a \$500 deposit, and so on. Full payment for the entire tour is due thirty (30) days before tour departure date.

Refunds: Group motorcoach tour deposits will be refunded in full if cancelled by you the group leader fourteen (14) days before departure date. Those tours cancelled seven (7) days before departure date will be assessed a cancellation fee of 50% of the deposit. Those tours cancelled two (2) days or less will forfeit all motorcoach deposits.

Tour Inclusion Prepayments: Some attractions, accommodations, and restaurants (vendors) require deposits and prepayments. Payments made towards these items are in addition to the motorcoach deposit. Each vendor will have their own refund policy. When you the group leader cancel your group charter, Fullington cannot guarantee any refunds or credits from these vendors

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS BEFORE AND AFTER: For your convenience, Fullington Tours would like to help you add to your vacationing pleasure by offering pre and post tour lodging. You will need to make your reservations for these hotels through Fullington Tours. That way we can assure you the rates and determine your pickup point. The properties have assured us that you can leave your vehicles in their lot at no charge while on the tour.

Please check your homeowner's insurance to ascertain your coverage for baggage. Travel Accident, Optional Sickness, Travel Baggage, Trip Cancellation Coverages are available. Call for brochure and application.

ITINERARIES: Itineraries are mailed out to passengers on tours of 7 day duration and longer. Itineraries include a brief schedule of daily events and motel accommodations. Itineraries are for your general information and are subject to change. Due to the time and cost involved, itineraries are not sent for those trips lasting less than 7 days. If you desire a brief itinerary on a tour 6-2 days, send a self-addressed stamped envelope to PO Box 211; Clearfield, PA 16830. PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP WHEN CROSSING USA BORDER: Proof is required on all tours traveling to or through Canada, Mexico, or the Bahamas. To enter and leave, all U.S. citizens should carry as proof of citizenship (not packed in suitcase) passport or certified birth certificate plus a photo I.D. or a voter's registration card plus a photo I.D. with the same address.* Naturalized citizens must carry their naturalization certificate. Non-citizens must have a valid passport, visa or alien card which permits entry into Canada, Mexico or the Bahamas plus a 'multiple entry visa' for return to the U.S. You will not be allowed to cross the bor-

der without the proper papers. Keep them with you at all times. If you are from a country other than Canada or the United States, contact your local consulate if you have any questions.
*A driver's license alone is not acceptable.

RAINED OUT—CANCELLED EVENTS: Concerts, sporting events, and any other ticketed productions retain the right to cancel or reschedule their events. Often the event group will honor the ticket for the rescheduled event or issue a refund for the cost of the event ticket. These event tickets are the property of you the individual passenger and going to the rescheduled event or obtaining the refund is your responsibility. Fullington Auto Bus Company only acts as an agent in obtaining the tickets for you. If the event is cancelled after the bus has arrived, Fullington Auto Bus Company cannot make any refunds for the transportation portion of the tour. Transportation has been provided. As a courtesy, we will try but cannot guarantee to set up transportation for the rescheduled event at an additional charge. Cancelled or rescheduled ticket events fall within the realm of circumstances beyond our control.

REFUNDS: This policy will apply regardless of reason for cancellation and in fairness to all, we cannot make exceptions. **Cancellations can only be made during regular business hours.** Hours Monday to Friday: 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM; Saturday 8:00 AM - 12:00 Noon. To facilitate your cancellation, please call the main office directly at 1-800-252-3893. Cancellations result in a costly process of letters, toll calls, adjustments, etc., plus a loss if a reasonable amount of time does not permit resale. Cancellation fees apply whether or not a passenger changes to or is re-booked on another tour.

Deposits are required and cancellation fees are calculated to cover certain guarantees which are made 14 days before the tours depart, and to cover out-of-pocket costs for telephone calls, letters and for the time and effort of office personnel required to execute cancellation notices. **Refund will be sent after tour returns** and is processed by the bookkeeping department, generally four to six weeks. Refunds will be made in kind. If payment is cash or check, refund will be by check. If payment is by credit card, the credit card will be credited. Also there are no refunds on any unused sightseeing or admissions on a tour package.

REFUNDS ON 1 DAY TOURS: When cancellations are made by you, the customer, full refunds will be made on 1 day tours cancelled 14 days prior to departure date unless incidentals, tickets or other fees have been prepaid. Cancellations for a one day tour received less than 14 days prior to departure date will be subject to a minimum \$5.00 per person or 10% of tour price cancellation fee which ever is greater. **NO REFUNDS** given on cancellation made one day prior to or day of tour departure including no-shows.

REFUNDS ON MULTI-DAY TOURS: When cancellations are made by you, the customer, full refunds will be made on multi-day tours cancelled 30 days or more prior to departure date unless incidentals, tickets and hotels have been prepaid. Cancellations for a multi-day tour received less than 30 days prior to departure will be subject to a 10% cancellation fee based on the total price of the tour. **NO REFUNDS** given on cancellations made 72 hours prior to tour departure.

REFUNDS ON TICKETS: There are **NO** refunds for tickets to Broadway plays, sporting events, or other special entertainment events for which admission tickets must be purchased by Fullington Auto Bus Company in advance. Fullington acts as an agent for its customers in purchasing such tickets, once they are sold to the customer, tickets become the customer's responsibility. Office personnel will attempt to re-sell such tickets for you if you must cancel, but cannot accept any responsibility to do so.

RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS, & PAYMENTS: Reservations may be made by phone. Early reservations assure you the tour of your choice. One day tours require payment in full within 1 week from date of reservation. Multiple day tours require a \$20 per tour day deposit. If the tour is 2 days, a \$40 deposit is required, if 3 days, a \$60 deposit, etc. Payment in full is due 1 month prior to departure date. Some tours with special features may require additional deposits.

Receipts are not sent out for payments received in the mail. Your cancelled check is receipt of payment. Payment sent by mail should be sent promptly. When sending payment by mail, be sure to specify name of trip and date. Checks should be made payable to **FABCO**.

All reservations not paid in full 10 business days prior to departure date will be automatically cancelled and subject to cancellation fee. Reservations made after deadline will be accepted on a seats-available basis. **HOWEVER**, payment in full must be received with reservation.

SOLO TOUR PASSENGERS: Tour passengers traveling alone are welcomed on all our tours. However, due to the double seat configuration on the bus, you may have to sit with another solo passenger as to accommodate passengers traveling together.

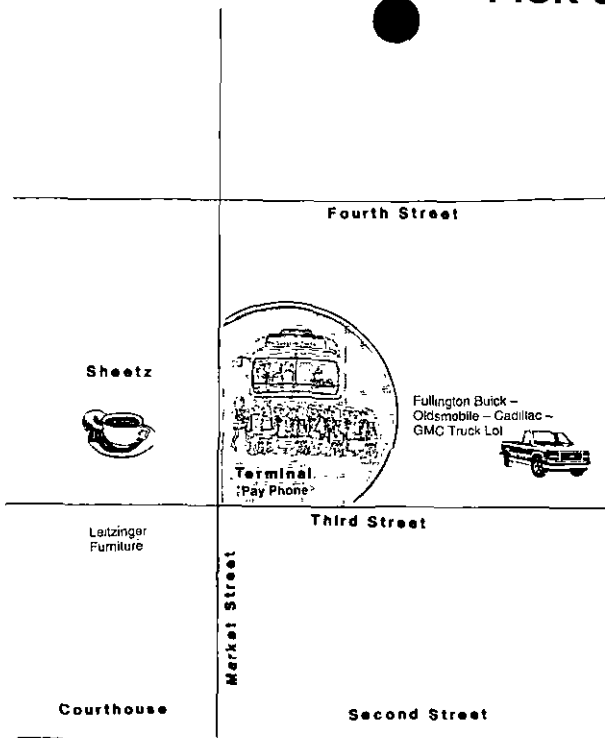

Mexico 18 days

June 12-29

The United Mexican States is our Southern neighbor. Mexico offers a dramatic contrasts in landscape, lifestyle, and culture. It is fascinating to get to know the Mexican people. Their diversity of climates, regions, and the mixture of Indian and European strains have produced a hospitable, resourceful, outgoing and informal people. 1st Day — With your spirit of adventure packed up ready to go, we head West and overnight in Indianapolis, IN.

2nd Day — Cross the Mississippi River to St. Louis. Lunch at the **Lt. Robert E. Lee** an authentic replica of a paddle-wheel riverboat permanently moored on the Mississippi River. Overnight in Joplin, MO.

3rd Day — Claremore, Oklahoma — **Will Rogers Memorial** includes personal items, dioramas, selections from his movie career, and a video program telling the life of America's favorite son. A short tour at **Oral Roberts University** before heading on to Oklahoma City for our overnight.

4th Day — Explore the **National Cowboy Hall of Fame** a memorial to the men and women who pioneered the West. The rugged individualism and romantic spirit of the frontier are preserved here. A **dude ranch** experience with a wagon ride to **Palo Duro Canyon** and chuckwagon meal. Be entertained by cowboy demonstrations. Overnight in Amarillo, TX.

5th Day — **Albuquerque – Old Town** is tucked within a bustling city. The old adobe shops and plaza area offer a unique experience. A city tour will show us this and the more modern Albuquerque. Overnight in Gallup, NM.

6th Day — Stretching across the northern end of the Petrified Forest National Park is **Painted Desert** earning its name from the hues of purple, red, and grey sediment forming eerie mounds. Enter the largest **Petrified Forest** in the world. **Montezuma Castle** are the ruins of prehistoric cliff dwellers. Spend some time viewing the ancient dwellings and see artifacts at the visitor center. Overnight in Tucson, Arizona.

7th Day — A day to rest up and gear up for our start into Mexico. A short side tour to **Mission San Xavier Del Bac**, known as the White Dove of the Desert. There will be lunch and a get acquainted session with our Mexican Escort that will be with us during our entire stay in Mexico. Time for relaxing or shopping. Overnight again in Tucson.

8th Day — Begin our international tour – don't anticipate, just enjoy the journey. Crossing the Border at Nogales, travel through the frontier region and cross the international border. Regulation procedures may vary slightly, so time has been generously allotted for our day. The state that we first explore is Sonora where the desert meets the sea. Lunch will be at **Hermosillo** the capital of Sonora. Travel on to the resort village of San Carlos on the Sea of Cortez. **Dinner with unique local entertainment**, an Indian performance of the Deer Dancer. Overnight at the Howard Johnson Hotel Plaza and Resort.

9th Day — An all day **cruise** on the Sea of Cortez (Gulf of California), home to a wide variety of marine life; porpoise, dolphin, whales, and sea lions. Disembark to have **lunch** on one of the many little islands of secluded coves. Overnight again at San Carlos.

10th Day — The colonial city of **Alamos** offers unspoiled architecture. It was originally built as a mining town in 1680.

A locally guided walking tour will introduce us to the Plaza de Arms, La Purisima Conception Church, Palacio del Gobierno, Museo Costumbrista. **Lunch at Maria Bonita**. Los Mochis is an interesting town housing one of the largest sugar refineries on the West Coast. It was founded in 1893 by an American family, the Johnson's, from Virginia. Overnight in Los Mochis.

11th Day — Board the **Chihuahua Pacifico** train for a two day excursion. From the luxury of the train coach view Copper Canyon, four times larger and 280 feet deeper than the Grand Canyon of the United States. This excursion through the Copper Canyon is spectacular in its diverse scenic beauty and in its man-made engineering wonders. The train will climb steep grades, thread through 86 tunnels, cross 39 bridges, and loop from sea level to 9,000 feet. Arrive in the afternoon at Divisadero, the dividing. You are at the midway point in the canyon. Breathtaking views and rustic traditional accommodations make this area most memorable. For the stout of heart, walking tours along the rim of the canyon make it possible to visit some of the traditional Tarahumara Indians homes. This area is home to the shy Tarahumara Indians living in the same ways as they have for centuries.

12th Day — After lunch reboard the train for **Creel**, a classic frontier boom town. Side tours will be available to the vast forests, mountain lakes, waterfalls, caves, and Indian villages. Overnight in Creel.

13th Day — On to **Chihuahua**, possibly one of the legendary cities of gold. A city tour will acquaint you with the rich history and beauty of this capital city.
