- 20. UNIFORM STANDARDS OF CONDUCT AND DISCLOSURE: As a condition of receiving a license, Applicant agrees to conform to any Uniform Standards of Conduct and Disclosure as set forth by the Commission. AGREED
- 21. **REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:** Applicant agrees to provide the following information to the Commission or the Department of Revenue, as appropriate:
 - a. Reports of Gross Receipts: Applicant shall report its Pennsylvania intrastate gross receipts to the Commission on an annual basis no later than 30 days following the end of the calendar year. AGREED

Applicant will be required to meet periodic reporting requirements as may be issued by the Commission to fulfill the Commission's duty under Chapter 22 pertaining to reliability and to inform the Governor and Legislature of the progress of the transition to a fully competitive natural gas market.

- 22. **FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS:** Applicant is under a continuing obligation to amend its application if substantial changes occur in the information upon which the Commission relied in approving the original filing. AGREED
- 23. **FALSIFICATION:** The Applicant understands that the making of false statement(s) herein may be grounds for denying the Application or, if later discovered, for revoking any authority granted pursuant to the Application. The Energy Co-op - Attachment A Entity History and Formation

The Energy Co-op was originally incorporated on August 21, 1980 as the Northwest Energy Cooperative Association as a non-profit cooperative in the District of Columbia. A copy of that filing is included in this attachment. At the time that the Northwest Energy Cooperative Association was formed, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania did not have a law to allow for incorporation as a cooperative so The Energy Co-op had to incorporate under DC's law. Eventually Pennsylvania passed a law in 1988. On June 18, 1998 The Energy Co-op filed Articles of Domestication of a Foreign Corporation changing the domicile of the Cooperative to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Energy Co-op also filed Articles of Amendment changing the name to the Energy Cooperative Association of Pennsylvania, both of those documents are included in this Attachment.

NORTHWEST ENERGY COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION

Articles of Incorporation

In compliance with the requirements of the District of Columbia Cooperative Association Act (June 19, 1940 Public No. 642, 54 Stat. 480, D.C. Code §29-801 et seq.) ("the Act"), the undersigned associations incorporated under the Act, desiring to form a non-profit cooperative association ("the Association") do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE 1. The purposes for which the Association is formed are to engage in any one or more lawful mode or modes of acquiring producing, building, operating, manufacturing, furnishing, exchanging, or distributing any type or types of property, commodities, goods, or services for the primary and mutual benefit of the patrons of the Association as ultimate consumers.

ARTICLE 2. The name of the Association shall be: Northwest Energy Cooperative Association.

ARTICLE 3. The term of existence of the Association shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE 4. The location and address of the principal office of the Association shall be 559 Carpenter Lane, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 19119.

ARTICLE 7. The association is organized without shares. Two memberships have been subscribed for.

ARTICLE 8. The property rights of the members of the Association may be unequal, and shall be determined by the amount of capital paid by each member to the Association plus patronage refunds assigned to the members' capital accounts. The maximum percentage of capital which may be owned or controlled by any member shall be 75%.

ARTICLE 9. In the event of dissolution of the Association, it shall pay all debts and expenses, and any other distributions required by law, and shall pay to the members the amount of their membership capital accounts. Any surplus remaining shall be distributed as a contribution to any consumers' cooperative association or to all those members of the Association at any time during the previous six years on the basis of their patronage during that period.




