**PETITION TO INTERVENE
OF FIRSTENERGY SOLUTIONS CORP.**

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.71-5.75, FirstEnergy Solutions Corp. (“FES”), by and through its counsel, hereby files this Petition to Intervene with the intent to oppose the proposed PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL”) Default Service Program (“DSP”) in the above-referenced matter, and in support of its intervention avers the following:

1. FES is a subsidiary of FirstEnergy Corp., a diversified energy services holding company headquartered in Akron, Ohio. FES provides wholesale and retail energy and related products to customers located primarily in the Mid-Atlantic and Midwest regions. Historically, FES has actively participated in competitive wholesale power procurement auctions of Pennsylvania electric distribution companies and anticipates that it would similarly participate in future competitive procurement developments for which PPL seeks approval by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) at this docket. In addition, FES is a licensed Electric Generation Supplier (“EGS”) in Pennsylvania, having been authorized at Docket No. A-110078 to serve retail customers throughout the Commonwealth.

2. On April 18, 2014, PPL filed a petition for approval of its DSP for the period from June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2017 (“Petition”). The Petition requests Commission approval of

the DSP in order to establish the terms and conditions under which PPL will procure and supply default service and conform to the requirements of the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act for that period.

3. FES will be represented in this proceeding by the following counsel, and requests that their names and addresses be placed on the Commission's official Parties of Record list and that they receive copies of all correspondence and other documents in this matter:

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4. Intervention in Commission proceedings is permitted where a person has an interest in the matter "which may be directly affected and which is not adequately represented by existing participants, and as to which the petitioner may be bound by the action of the Commission in the proceeding," or "another interest of such nature that participation of the petitioner may be in the public interest." 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.72(a)(2), (3).


5. FES is an impending applicant in the competitive wholesale power procurement process by which PPL will acquire electric generation supply to safeguard the electric demands of its default service customers. Also, FES, as a licensed EGS currently serving retail customers in Pennsylvania, has a compelling interest in assuring that the terms, conditions and pricing of default service have no adverse effect on competition in general, or on FES's ability to compete for retail sales to customers in PPL's service territory in particular. Accordingly, FES has several direct and substantial interests in this matter.

6. FES's interests cannot be sufficiently represented by any other party to this proceeding.

7. Because of the significance of this matter to FES as a wholesale electric supplier and a licensed EGS, FES requests that it be permitted to intervene in this matter and that it be placed on the service list.

WHEREFORE, for all of the foregoing reasons, FirstEnergy Solutions Corp. respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission grant its Petition to Intervene in any and all proceedings instituted in connection with the Petition.
