This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed February 24, 1986. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of March 22, 1986, and in the Intelligencer Journal, Lancaster County; the Reading-Eagle Times, Berks County; and the Philadelphia Inquirer, Philadelphia, all newspapers of general circulation within the area of application. No protests were filed and the record is certified to the Commission for its decision without an oral hearing.

Kleins' Bus Service, Inc. (applicant or transferee), P.O. Box 334, Route 422, Douglassville, Berks County, seeks by the instant application to purchase all of the operating authority of William J. Klein (transferor), at A-00100442, for the nominal sum of one dollar (\$1.00). The intent of the instant application is for the transferor to incorporate his sole proprietorship. All current business debts of the transferor will be assumed by the transferee. The transferor's 1983 and 1984 annual reports show total operating revenues of \$304,497 and \$749,660, respectively. All of the transferor's due assessments have been paid and all reports have been filed.

We find:

1. That the applicant is fit to hold a certificate of public convenience.
2. That there is a continuing necessity for the rights herein involved.
3. That approval of the instant application is necessary for the continuation of service to the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for the transfer of the rights held by William J. Klein at A-00100442, be and is hereby approved, and that a certificate be issued to the applicant granting the following rights:

To transport, as a common carrier, by motor vehicle, groups and parties of persons between points in the townships of Douglass, Union, Amity and Colebrookdale, and the borough of Birdsboro, Berks County, and from points in said territory to points in Pennsylvania and return to the points of origin, expressly excluding special excursions and tours or sight-seeing trips.

To transport, as a common carrier, groups and parties of persons between points in the townships of North Coventry and Warwick, Chester County and from points in said territory to points in Pennsylvania, and return.

with the right immediately above subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to render tour, special excursion and sight-seeing trip service.

To transport, as a common carrier, groups and parties of persons, from points in the borough of Elverson, Chester County, the borough of Pottstown, and the townships of Lower Pottsgrove, Upper Pottsgrove and West Pottsgrove, Montgomery County, to points in Pennsylvania and return.

with the right immediately above subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to render tour, special excursion and sight-seeing trip service.

To transport, as a common carrier, groups and parties of persons and persons on tours or sight-seeing trips between points in the townships of Earl, Oley, Alsace, Muhlenberg, Bern, Lower Heidelberg, South Heidelberg, Spring, Brecknock, Cumru, Lower Alsace, Robeson, Caernarvon and Exeter, the boroughs of Sinking Springs, Wyomissing, Adamstown, Mohnton, Shillington, Kenhorst, West Reading, Wyomissing Hills, Laureldale, Temple, St. Lawrence, Mt. Penn, Wernersville, Leesport, West Lawn and the city of Reading, Berks County, the townships of Caernarvon, Brecknock, East Cocalico and West Cocalico, the boroughs of Denver and Adamstown, Lancaster County, and from points in said area to points in the counties of Adams, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Delaware, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montgomery, Philadelphia and York.

with the right immediately above subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide transportation in conventional school bus type equipment.

subject to the following conditions:

1. That the approval hereby given is not to be understood as committing the Commission, in any proceedings that may be brought before it for any purpose, to fix a valuation on the rights to be acquired by applicant from the present certificate holder equal to the consideration to be paid therefor, or equal to any value that may be placed thereon by applicant, or to approve or prescribe rates sufficient to yield a return thereon.
2. That applicant shall not record in its utility accounts any amount representing the rights herein granted in excess of the actual cost of such rights to the original holder thereof.
3. That the applicant charge to Account 1550, Other Intangible Property, \$1.00, being the amount of the consideration payable by it for the rights and going concern value attributable thereto; less any amount recorded under condition 2 above.
4. That the certificate holder shall comply with all of the provisions of the Public Utility Law as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and Pa. 52 Pa. Code §29, as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and any other rules and regulations as may hereafter be prescribed by the Commission. Failure to comply shall be sufficient cause to suspend, revoke or rescind the rights and privileges conferred by the certificate.
5. That the certificate holder shall not transfer, sell or in any way convey any of its outstanding capital stock to any individual, partnership, corporation or any entity, without the prior filing of an application and approval thereof by the Commission under 66 Pa. C.S.A. §1102(3).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the carrier, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it has complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations of this Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of evidence of insurance and a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That issuance of the certificate be withheld pending receipt of the 1985 Annual Report of the transferor.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with this order the rights granted the transferor, William J. Klein at A-00100442 be cancelled and the record be marked closed.
