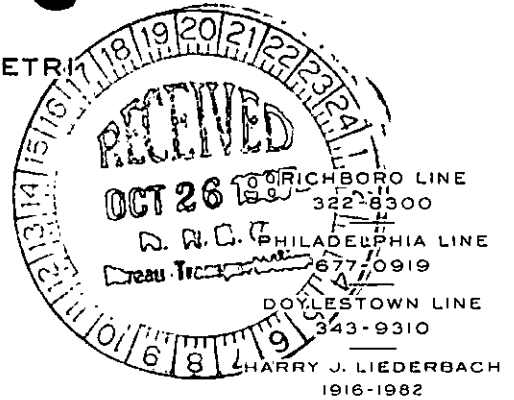

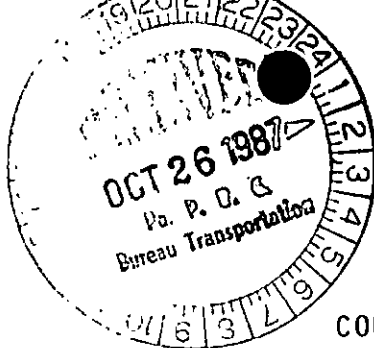

To transport, as a Class D Carrier, personal property, in use, including furniture, furnishings, stock, fixtures, show cases, equipment and works of art of dwelling houses, stores, offices, institutions, and libraries between points in the counties of Philadelphia, Delaware, Chester, Montgomery, and Bucks, included within a line which connects the boundaries of Chester, West Chester, Norristown, Paoli, Doylestown and Morrisville, but not including said places.

To transport, as a Class D Carrier, personal property in use, including furniture, furnishings, stock, fixtures, show cases, equipment and works of art of dwelling houses, stores, offices, institutions and libraries from points in the counties of Philadelphia, Delaware, Chester, Montgomery, and Bucks, included within a line which connects the boundaries of Chester, West Chester, Norristown, Paoli, Doylestown and Morrisville, but not including said places to points in Pennsylvania and vice versa.

To transport, as a Class D Carrier, show cases and fixtures for B. W. McClean Manufacturing Company and W. P. Himes between points in Pennsylvania within an airline distance of twenty-five (25) statute miles of the City Hall in the City and County of Philadelphia, excluding the right to furnish local cartage in the City of Philadelphia.

To transport, as a Class D Carrier, show cases and fixtures from points in Pennsylvania within an airline distance of twenty-five (25) statute miles of the City Hall in the City and County of Philadelphia to points in Pennsylvania within an airline distance of seventy-five (75) statute miles of the City Hall in the City and County of Philadelphia, excluding the right to furnish local cartage in the City of Philadelphia.

Under date of August 25, 1988 the Secretary's office transmitted to you the Commission's compliance order of August 18, 1988, evidencing approval of the above carrier's application at A-00107747, F. 2, which is in effect a transfer of the rights formerly held by Robert W. Badey, at A-00068090. The letter transmitting the order directs attention to the requirement for the filing of a tariff.

PA Code, Title 52, Section 23.13(c) provides that in the case of change in ownership, etc., if feasible to do so, the tariffs of the former operator shall be adopted by the new operator, and no change in rates is permitted to cover the transfer of rights.

In this instance it is not possible to meet the tariff requirements by the adoption of the former tariff for the reason that the present tariff description of operating authority does not conform with the approval of this application.

It will be necessary, therefore, to file a new tariff which should be designated Freight - PA PUC No. 1. The tariff should name the same rates, rules and regulations as were filed by the former operator and may be issued to become effective on one days notice under authority of PA Code, Title 52, Section 23.42.

We notice that rates for a part of the authorized service of Robert W. Badey are provided in tariffs published by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc. Should you elect to participate in the agency publication(s), two copies of a suitable power of attorney should be included with the filing. If you do not elect to participate in the agency publication(s) a new tariff or tariffs should be filed containing the same rates, rules and regulations published by the agency for a minimum of 30 days.
