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



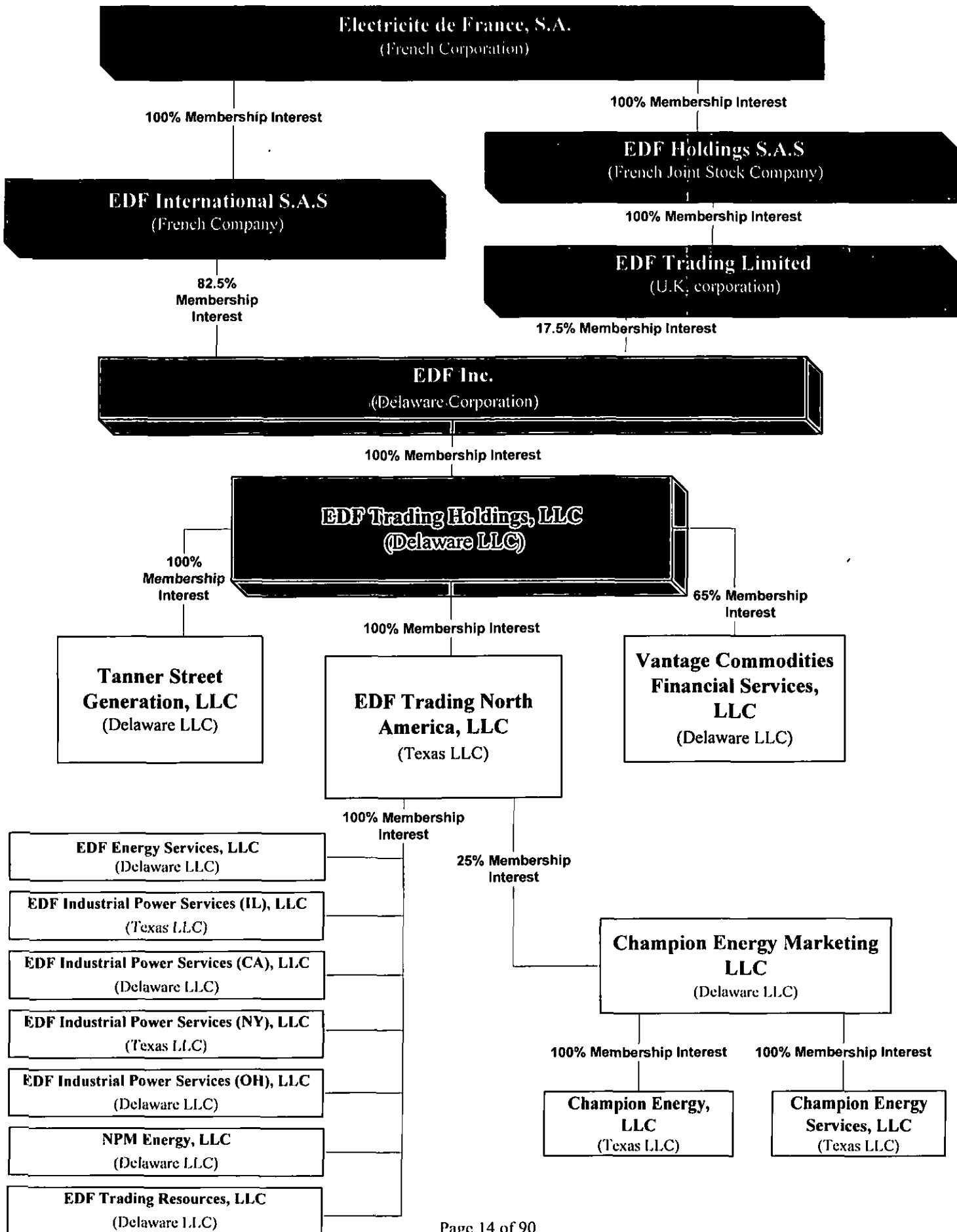
Exhibit 3.a

MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

EDF Energy Services, LLC ("EDF") pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("Commission"), rules of practice and procedure, respectfully petitions the Commission for an order to protect the Company's proprietary Financial Documents included in EDF's Application for Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) License at Exhibit 7.b.3 and Exhibit 7.b.5 from disclosure. In support of its Motion, EDF states as follows:

1. EDF's Financial Documents, constitute financial data not commonly known by or available to the public. EDF has used its best efforts to keep and maintain such information confidential. To the best of EDF's knowledge, current financial documents have not been disclosed or released to the public;

2. *The Financial Documents derive economic value from not being generally known to and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by other persons, who can obtain economic value from their disclosure and use. Specifically, the information contained therein is extremely sensitive information that could be used by competitors to determine revenue and other information damaging to EDF in the marketplace.*

Disclosure of such information would be extremely detrimental and could be used by EDF's competitors to materially affect EDF's ability to compete effectively; and

3. Due to the sensitive nature of this information, it is appropriate for the Commission to limit access to it. The Financial Documents should solely be used by the Commission in exercising its governmental functions in considering EDF's Application for operating authority. There is no legitimate purpose or public interest to be served in disclosing the Financial Documents to EDF's competitors or, indeed, to any person other than the appropriate staff of the Commission.

For the foregoing reasons, EDF Energy Services, LLC respectfully requests that the commission grant a Protective Order allowing its Financial Documents to be treated as confidential.

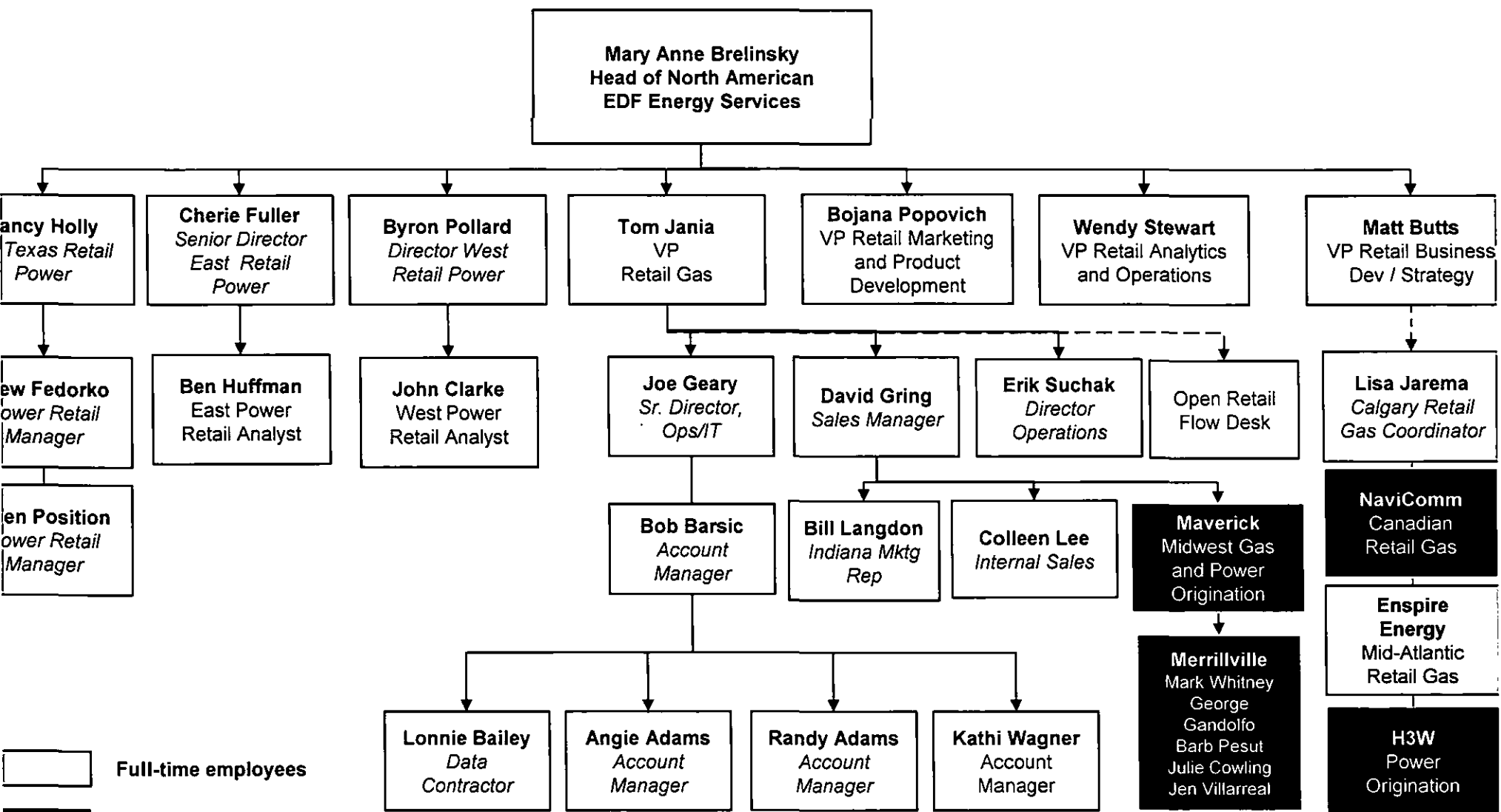

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Current Organization Chart



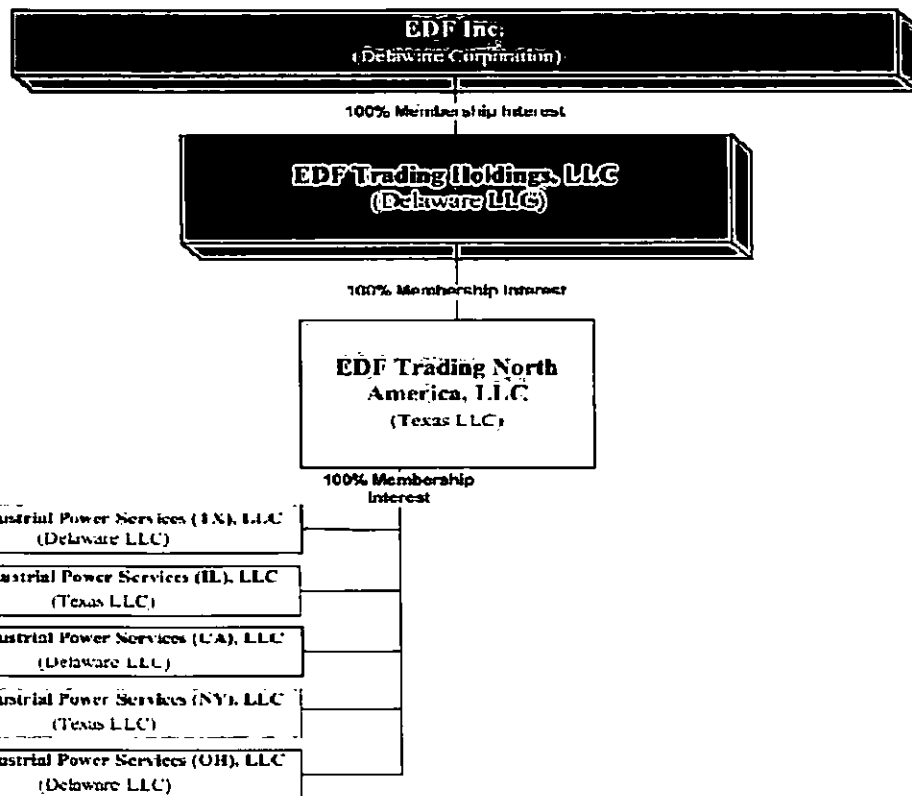

Pending New Structure

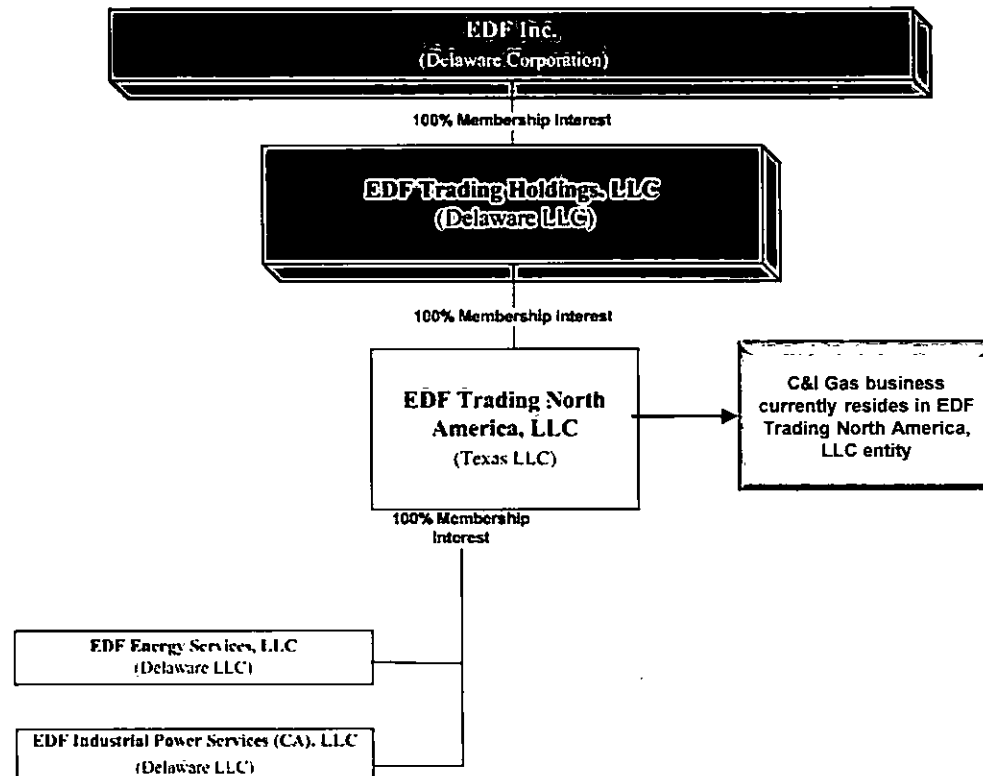

Announcement: Moody's changes outlook on EDF's Aa3 rating to negative from stable

Global Credit Research - 05 Dec 2012

London, 05 December 2012 -- Moody's Investors Service has today changed to negative from stable the outlook on the Aa3 senior unsecured ratings of Electricité de France (EDF). Concurrently, Moody's has also changed to negative from stable the outlook on the A3 ratings of EDF's wholly owned subsidiaries, EDF Energy plc and EDF Trading Limited, which incorporate support from their ultimate parent.

RATINGS RATIONALE

The change of outlook to negative from stable follows the recent ruling by France's Conseil d'Etat which cancelled the decision relating to the electricity distribution tariffs for the third regulatory period (2009-2013, known as TURPE 3). Although EDF considers that the decision should not have an impact on its financial results, in Moody's view it adds to the challenges faced by the group from rising debt and pressured profitability. It therefore increases the risk that the group will be unable to maintain a leverage profile that is aligned with Moody's guidance for the Aa3 rating.

The Conseil d'Etat's decision was based on its judgment that the methodology used by the CRE, the French electricity regulator, for calculating the capital return on the electricity distribution network of ERDF, EDF's subsidiary, is incorrect since it did not take account of the nature of the concessions assets and renewal provisions. The distribution network charges for TURPE 3 have therefore been incorrectly calculated. There remains uncertainty surrounding the amount and timing of any remedies that might be required, and their potential impact on EDF. The group itself considers that the decision should not have an impact on its financial results because of the nature of its integrated tariffs.

However, in Moody's view, there remains some risk of a negative financial impact on the group whether from any potential remedy, or from the revised methodology which the CRE is required to propose by June 2013.

The negative outlook takes account of the increase in EDF's net financial debt to EUR39.7 billion at end-June 2012 as a result of its acquisition of Edison; higher capital expenditure; and the rising Contribution au Service Public de l'Electricite (CSPE) balance. It also reflects a flat outlook for the group's profitability in 2013, under pressure from rising nuclear safety costs and weaker power generation earnings in certain markets outside France.

In changing the outlook on EDF's ratings, Moody's takes account of the group's efforts to ease the burden on its balance sheet, and to underpin profitability in order to achieve its 2.5x net debt/EBITDA leverage target. The outlook change factors in the group's ongoing discussions with the government regarding CSPE. Moreover, Moody's notes EDF's ongoing review of its operating costs and capital expenditure (capex) trajectory, which currently includes rising investment in renewables, new nuclear plant builds and its gas strategy.

Nevertheless, Moody's expects the negative pressure on EDF's free cash flow generation to continue, partly as a result of the group's substantial capital investment commitments. These include the Flamanville EPR, the cost estimate for which was recently increased by a further EUR2 billion to EUR8 billion, with planned commissioning maintained for 2016.

The negative outlook therefore reflects the risk, in Moody's view, that measures taken by the group to manage its leverage could be insufficient to ensure its credit metrics remain well positioned against the following guidelines: (1) RCF/net debt in the mid- to upper teens in percentage terms; and (2) FFO/net debt in the high teens/low 20s range in percentage terms.

In light of EDF's 84.48% ownership by the Government of France (Aa1 negative), the group falls under Moody's rating methodology for government-related issuers (GRIs) and its Aa3 rating incorporates a two-notch uplift from its standalone credit quality for potential government support.

WHAT COULD CHANGE THE RATING UP/DOWN

Given the current uncertainties and risks with regard to EDF's cash flows, as reflected by the negative outlook, Moody's does not consider an upgrade of the group's ratings to be likely in the near term.

Negative pressure could be exerted on EDF's a2 Baseline Credit Assessment (BCA) in the event of a sustained deterioration in the group's financial profile, as would be evidenced, for example, by a retained cash flow (RCF)/net debt ratio in the low teens in percentage terms on a sustainable basis. Such a deterioration could result from lower-than-expected profitability, capital investment unsupported by cash flow generation or large debt-funded acquisitions. In the context both of increased demands on national budgets and a two-notch rating uplift under Moody's GRI methodology, it is likely that negative pressure would be exerted on EDF's Aa3 rating were the BCA to deteriorate to a3 from a2.

PRINCIPAL METHODOLOGY

The methodologies used in this rating were Unregulated Utilities and Power Companies published in August 2009, and Government-Related Issuers: Methodology Update published in July 2010. Please see the Credit Policy page on www.moodys.com for a copy of these methodologies.

Thank you for submitting your Retail Access Application Package to become an Energy Services Company (ESCO) serving nonresidential electric customers in New York State. This letter is to inform you that documentation submitted in your application package has been reviewed by Staff and established to be in compliance with the New York State Public Service Commission's ESCO eligibility requirements that are implemented by codes and regulations found in the Uniform Business Practices, the Home Energy Fair Practices and other applicable regulations.

I am also pleased to notify you that EDF Industrial Power Services has successfully met the Commission's EDI Phase I certification requirements for Core, Utility Rate and Bill Ready Transactions effective March 16, 2010. All requirements therefore, for this initial stage of your eligibility determination have been satisfied.

Please be advised that you may now continue with the utility approval stage of the eligibility process by contacting those companies in whose service territories you intend to participate. The utility stage normally consists of a creditworthiness determination, completion of Phase III EDI testing and the execution of any operating or billing service agreements. Please note that each utility's eligibility requirements pertain to only their retail access programs.

Once you have satisfactorily completed the utility eligibility stage, Staff will be notified by the utility of your success. It would be helpful if EDF Industrial Power Services notified Staff of the actual production date in the utility service territories you intend to enroll customers. At that point I will confirm that your final eligibility requirements have been satisfied.

Be advised that to maintain your ESCO eligibility, you must notify Staff of any substantive legal, financial or business related changes to your company as they occur. If your business plan changes and you decide to expand your service offerings by choosing to participate in any of the ESCO referral programs or move into other utility service territories, you must immediately submit the appropriate documentation for Staff review and determination of how it affects your current eligibility.

If you are using vendors to provide ESCO related services (e.g., EDI), the ESCO remains fully responsible for any activities the vendors perform. If you have not already done so, or if you have changed vendors since last reporting them to us, please provide Staff a list with contact information for all vendors that you are now using. **Finally, you must submit a statement annually, by January 31st, indicating that the information in your original or most recent updated Retail Access Application remains current, or submit a statement identifying revisions.** Upon completion of our review of new eligibility information, Staff will then update your eligibility status as necessary.

I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

On October 27, 2009, Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC ("Applicant" or "Eagle Industrial") filed a verified application with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") requesting a certificate of service authority to operate as an alternative retail electric supplier ("ARES") in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451 ("Part 451"). Applicant submitted its certificate of publication showing that on October 30, 2009, proper notice of the application was published in the official State newspaper. The Administrative Law Judge requested clarification of certain matters contained in the application. Applicant filed a verified response to the Administrative Law Judge and an amended application on November 16, 2009.

II. BACKGROUND AND AUTHORITY SOUGHT BY APPLICANT

Applicant requests authority to offer the sale of electricity and power to eligible nonresidential retail customers with annual electrical consumption greater than 15,000 kilowatt-hours ("kWh") in the service territories of Commonwealth Edison Company, Central Illinois Public Service Company d/b/a AmerenCIPS, Central Illinois Light Company d/b/a AmerenCILCO, Illinois Power Company d/b/a AmerenIP, MidAmerican Energy Company and, Mt. Carmel Public Utility Company. Applicant also proposes to provide single billing services under subpart F of Part 451.

III. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS UNDER SECTION 16-115(d) OF THE ACT

Applicant is a limited liability company organized under the laws of Texas. Applicant does not intend to install, operate, or maintain generation, transmission, or distribution facilities within the State of Illinois. Therefore, no demonstration of compliance with the requirements of Section 451.20(f)(2) has been made and Applicant's employees are not permitted to perform such functions, and other entities

are not permitted to perform such functions pursuant to contractual arrangements with Applicant.

The products and services that Applicant plans to provide will include but are not limited to: full requirements power and energy services; index-related power and energy services; energy risk management services; block and shaped block energy service; demand response service; and other energy services that are desired by our customers or customer prospects.

Applicant has certified that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will provide service only to retail customers eligible to take such services; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-112 of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ARES. Additionally, Applicant has agreed to submit good faith schedules of transmission and energy in accordance with applicable tariffs. Applicant has agreed to adopt and follow rules relating to customer authorizations, billing records, and retail electric services and agrees to retain requests for delivery services transmitted to utilities for a period of not less than two calendar years after the calendar year in which they are created. Applicant has agreed to adopt and follow rules and procedures to preserve the confidentiality of its customers' data.

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 451.50 of Part 451, Applicant provided a License or Permit Bond in the amount of \$150,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact business in Illinois. Attachment C to the application is a copy of the required License or Permit Bond.

IV. FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL, AND MANAGERIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 16-115

Applicant asserts that it meets the financial qualifications set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1). Included in Attachment D to the application are unconditional guarantees intended to meet the requirements of Section 451.220(a)(4)(A). Applicant also provided documents showing the good faith estimates of the peak amount of megawatts that Applicant will schedule in the upcoming year as well as the manner in which it calculated the required amount of its unconditional guarantees. Having reviewed the information submitted by Applicant, the Commission finds that the Applicant has satisfied the financial requirements of Section 451.220(a)(4)(A).

Applicant represents that it meets the technical and managerial qualifications set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1) and Sections 451.230 and 451.240 of Part 451. Applicant identified the personnel who purportedly satisfy the criteria and provided biographical information for these individuals. Through arrangements maintained by Applicant with its parent, EDF Trading North America, LLC, Applicant indicates it will use an existing 24-hour manned energy desk for coordination with control centers of scheduling

changes, reserve implementation, curtailment orders, and interruption plan implementation. In Attachment E, Applicant provided a telephone number and facsimile number where its staff can be directly reached at all times. Having reviewed the information submitted by Applicant, the Commission concludes that Applicant meets the financial, technical, and managerial qualifications set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1) of the Act and Subpart C of Part 451.

With regard to the qualifications to provide single billing services, in Attachment H to the application, Applicant provided documentation intended to demonstrate it meets the requirements of Section 451.510(a). Applicant provided copies of bonds issued by Berkley Regional Insurance Company in Attachment H. Applicant also provided calculations showing its good faith estimates of the amounts it expects to be obligated to pay the utilities under single bill tariffs during the next twelve months. Having reviewed the information submitted by Applicant, the Commission concludes that Applicant meets the financial requirements set forth in Subpart F of Part 451.

V. REQUIREMENTS OF PUBLIC ACT 095-01027

On January 12, 2009, Public Act 095-01027 ("PA 95-1027") was signed into law in Illinois. Among many other things, PA 95-1027 amends Section 16-115 of the Act. New subsection 16-115(d)(5) requires, in part:

That the [ARES] applicant will procure renewable energy resources and will source electricity from clean coal facilities, as defined in Section 1-10 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, in amounts at least equal to the percentages set forth in subsections (c) and (d) of Section 1-75 of the Illinois Power Agency Act.

Applicant states that it intends to fully comply with Subsection 16-115(d)(5) of the Act and the specific requirements to procure renewable energy resources as defined in the Illinois Power Agency Act ("IPA Act"). Applicant says it will procure renewable energy sources in accordance with Sections 16-111.5(d)(5) and 16-115D of the Public Utilities Act and will source electricity from clean coal facilities, as defined in Section 1-10 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, in amounts at least equal to the percentages set forth in subsections (c) and (d) of Section 1-75 of the Illinois Power Agency Act. Applicant indicates it is not a generator of electric power and energy (renewable or otherwise) and therefore contemplates that it will either purchase the required portion of its electric supply requirements from qualified renewable power generation sources directly, or more likely, purchase sufficient Renewable Energy Credits and/or make alternative compliance payments to meet the requirements of the Acts and related Commission requirements.

With respect to the initial clean coal facility cited in the Acts, if such facility is approved by the Legislature, Applicant says it will execute the required contract for renewable electric supply or a contract for differences. For other clean coal sources, Applicant indicates it will contract with and purchase from such sources and in such

quantities as required by the Acts or the Commission, provided that such sources are available within the Commission's established procedures. Finally, Applicant states that it will comply with the required reporting requirements under Section 16-1150(e) of the Public Utilities Act to show that it has met the Commission's requirements as it relates to the Acts.

Having reviewed the information submitted by Applicant, the Commission concludes that Applicant meets the requirements set forth in Section 16-115(d)(5) of the Act. The Commission notes that it is responsible for enforcing the requirements of Section 16-115(d-5) of the Act, as well as certain referenced requirements in the IPA Act, and Applicant must fully comply with all requirements contained therein.

VI. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the application and attachments along with the supplementary information provided by Applicant regarding the technical, financial, and managerial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 451 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements.

The Commission concludes, therefore, that Applicant's request for a certificate of service authority to operate as an ARES in Illinois should be granted and should include the following authority:

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS CERTIFIED that Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC is granted service authority to operate as an Alternative Retail Electric Supplier as follows:

SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED: The sale of electricity and power, as well as single billing services.

CUSTOMERS TO BE SERVED: All eligible nonresidential retail customers with annual electrical consumption greater than 15,000 kWh.

GEOGRAPHIC REGION(S) SERVED: The service areas of Commonwealth Edison Company, Central Illinois Public Service Company d/b/a AmerenCIPS, Central Illinois Light Company d/b/a AmerenCILCO, Illinois Power Company d/b/a AmerenIP, MidAmerican Energy Company and, Mt. Carmel Public Utility Company.

VII. FINDINGS AND ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) Applicant, Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC, a business organized under the laws of Texas, seeks a certificate of service authority to operate as an alternative retail electric supplier under Section 16-115 of the Act;
- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over the parties hereto and the subject matter hereof;
- (3) the recitals of fact and conclusions reached in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact, as required by Section 16-115(d)(1) of the Act;
- (4) Applicant has demonstrated that it possesses sufficient financial, managerial and technical resources and abilities to provide power and energy to eligible nonresidential retail customers with annual electrical consumption greater than 15,000 kWh, as well as single billing services, throughout the areas certified herein;
- (5) Applicant has complied with Section 16-115(d)(1) through (5) and (8) of the Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451; and
- (6) Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC should be granted the certificate of service authority to operate as an alternative retail electric supplier as specified in Section VI of this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC is hereby granted the Certificate of Service Authority as set forth in Section VI of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Eagle Industrial Power Services (IL), LLC shall comply with all applicable Commission rules and orders now and as hereafter amended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.

Background

We at EDF Energy Services, LLC (“EDFES”) are licensed by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to offer and supply electric generation services in Pennsylvania. Our PUC license number is A-XXXX-XXXXXXX.

We set the generation prices and charges that you pay. The Public Utility Commission regulates distribution prices and services. *The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission regulates transmission prices and services.*

You will receive a single bill from your Electric Distribution Company (“EDC”) that will contain EDC charges and EDFES charges.

Right of Rescission - You may cancel this agreement at any time before midnight of the third business day after receiving this disclosure by calling us at 1-877-432-4530, or in writing at 4700 W. Sam Houston Parkway N., Ste. 250, Houston, TX 77041, or by email at Cherie.Fuller@edfenergyservices.com.

Definitions

- “Distribution charges” are part of the basic service charges on every customer’s bill for delivering electricity from the EDC to your home. The PUC regulates distribution prices and services.
- “Generation charges” are charges that represent the cost of producing the electricity and are specific to this Contract. Generation prices and charges are set by the electric generation supplier you have chosen, which is EDFES.
- “Transmission charges” are charges that represent the cost of transporting electricity from the source of supply to the EDC. This charge will vary with your source of supply. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission regulates transmission prices and services.

Terms of Service

1. Basic Service Prices -

Fixed Rate: If you have selected a fixed rate, the Rate per kWh for each billing cycle during the Term, will be as indicated on the Enrollment Form, or within the Welcome Package. This Rate means the energy price, including generation, ancillary services, administration, congestion fees, losses, reserves, margins and other applicable charges. This price includes Transmission Charges where applicable and Estimated Total State Taxes, including the Gross Receipts Tax, but excludes applicable state and local Sales Taxes

Variable Rate: If you have selected a variable rate, the Rate assigned to each individual account will be established each month, based upon such factors as load factor, energy market pricing as indicated by average PJM posted prices (average hourly LMP) and transmission costs as may be adjusted per the PJM Open Access Transmission Tariff. The rate assigned to any particular individual account may vary from the rate assigned to any other particular individual account, even though such accounts may be in the same utility rate class. The monthly rate may be higher or lower than the Utility price in any given month. To view current pricing please visit our website www.edfenergyservices.com. This price includes Transmission Charges and Estimated Total State Taxes, including the Gross Receipts Tax, but excludes applicable state and local Sales Taxes.

2. Length of Agreement

The initial Term of this Agreement is as indicated on the Enrollment Form, or within the Welcome Package and will begin from the date of service as determined by the Utility.

3. Early Cancellation Fee



In the event the customer cancels this agreement after the rescission period but, before the end of the term, and not in accordance with the terms of cancellation, the Customer will pay an Early Cancellation Fee. The early cancellation fee is the greater of \$100 or \$10 per month remaining in the Agreement at the time of early cancellation.

4. Cancellation Provision

EDFES may cancel service to the Customer for any non-payment or any other breach of the Contract upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to you of such cancellation. If you fail to cure within the 30-day notice period, we may cancel the Contract even if you subsequently cure the non-payment of breach after such period has expired. In addition, EDFES reserves the right to reject your enrollment or cancel this Contract if:

- You fail to meet or maintain satisfactory credit standing as determined by us;
- You fail to meet minimum or maximum threshold consumption levels as determined by us;
- You move within or outside of the EDC's service territory;
- Your electric service is terminated by your EDC for non-payment; or
- You initiate cancellation of this Contract prior to the end of the initial term, you will owe us for amounts unpaid up to the date of cancellation and we will charge the early cancellation fee mentioned above.
