LEO BYRNE, being duly sworn according to law deposes, and says that:

1. He is the President of Delaware County Transportation Service, Inc., the Applicant under P.U.C. Application No. A-00106960, and in that capacity I am authorized to make this statement on behalf of the Applicant.

2. The Applicant, Delaware County Transportation Service, Inc., is a Pennsylvania Corporation with its principle place of business at 1344 Chester Pike, Sharon Hill, Delaware County, PA 19079.

3. The Applicant is not affiliated with other carriers.

4. Applicant is seeking the following authority:  
To transport persons in group and party service from points in Delaware County to points in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and return.

5. Applicant holds no authority at the present time. It does, however, operate school buses for transportation of students, which is exempt from authority requirements.

6. Applicant has terminal facilities at its principle place of business, including a parking area for its equipment, garages and service facilities for all of its equipment.

7. A list of Applicant's equipment is attached to this statement as Exhibit "A."

8. Applicant follows the following safety program:  
(a) All drivers take drivers' training required by the Applicant;  
(b) All equipment is continuously maintained and serviced by Applicant's full time service employees.

12. The service to be provided will not create empty miles or backhauls.



Notes to Financial Statements

August 31, 1985 and 1984

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(A) Revenue and Expense Recognition

The company utilizes the accrual method of accounting wherein revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when incurred.

(B) Uncollectible Accounts Receivable

Since only minor losses have been experienced on uncollectible accounts receivable, no reserve for doubtful accounts is deemed necessary.

(C) Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. The cost of additions and improvements are capitalized; while maintenance and repairs are charged to expense when incurred. Upon retirement or other disposition of property and equipment, the cost and related depreciation is removed from the accounts and the resulting gain or loss is included in earnings.

(D) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided using primarily the straight line method based upon the following useful lives:

Transportation equipment                      3 - 5 years

For property placed into service after December 31, 1980, depreciation is computed by using the accelerated cost recover system under the provisions of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981.

(E) Income Taxes

Taxes are provided for on current income using applicable state statutory tax rates. Investment tax credits are accounted for under the flow-through method as a reduction of tax in the year the benefit is realized.

Note 2 - Property and Equipment

Property and equipment used in computing depreciation are summarized as follows:

Note 4 - Related Party Transaction

The company leases parking facilities on a monthly basis from Byrne Service Center, which is owned by the sole shareholder of Delaware County Transportation Services, Inc. Rent expense amounted to \$33,429 and \$32,132 for the years ended August 31, 1985 and 1984, respectively.

Note 5 - Contingent Liability

The company is contingently liable as the guarantor of a \$88,500 bank loan to its president and sole shareholder. In the opinion of management, the ultimate liability with respect to the guarantee, taking into consideration the collateral associated with the loan, is not material.

Note 6 - Reclassifications

The financial statements for the year ended August 31, 1984 have been reclassified where appropriate to conform with the classifications presented in the financial statements for the year ended August 31, 1985. These reclassifications did not affect income as previously reported.

The need is for transportation of groups of children from the headquarters of the Troop to the above destinations and return.
4. We have not supported similar applications in the past.

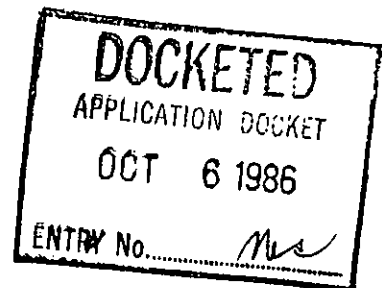
