Members of the PUC, To Whom It May Concern: this is a sampling of some of the electric choices available in Pa. including FIRST ENERGY and some competitors. As you can see by the figures, First energy officers are compensated far greater than most others. I do not feel a rate increase is in order until they have trimmed some of the obvious fat in the organization. Penelec's rate to compare price several months ago, was around .06 per kilowatt. Today it is .09 per/kilowatt. Why do they seek a rate increase again in such a short span? The consumers cannot afford to continue to absorb these increases while the millionaires become billionaires! Deregulation of the electric industry has caused this condition and has saved the average residential consumer nothing! In the past 10 years. I could only have saved about four dollars a month on my electric bill. Now tell me, is that a great savings or what! Hardly worth the effort to change suppliers. And guess what, every time someone switches their supplier, somebody other than the consumer benefits. Electricity at the generation level most days sells for around .025 -.035 cents per kilowatt, so charging customers .09 cents per kilowatt on the same old lines, untrimmed right of ways and frequent outages is already a pretty nice profit! Perhaps instead of buying out the competitors and eliminating competition, they could have better reinvested their profits in better equipment as they now say they need it for, rather than in the pockets of the corporate officers. Deregulation has taken the electric industry from a controlled profit industry with the residential customers' best interest as number one, to big business profit and CEO compensation as number one concern with lots of middle men along the way and pockets greased. Sorry, but I don't believe anyone is worth 11,000,000 per year. Corporate greed is just one of the reasons this country is in the shape it is.


