PREHEARING ORDER

Duquesne Light Company (DLC or Duquesne Light) filed a Petition on April 24, 2014 seeking approval from the Commission of its Default Service Plan (DSP) for the period from June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2017. In the DSP, Duquesne Light proposes to continue separate default supply procurements for: (1) Residential and Lighting customers, (2) Small Commercial and Industrial (C&I) customers with monthly metered demands less than 25 kilowatts, (3) Medium C&I customers with monthly metered demands equal to or greater than 25 kilowatts and less than 300 kilowatts, and (4) Large C&I customers with monthly metered demands equal to or greater than 300 kilowatts. Changes are proposed on the frequency for default service supply contracts, for the Standard Offer Customer Referral Program and the Time-of-Use Program. Duquesne Light filed its direct testimony on April 24, 2014.

On May 2, 2014, the Office of Administrative Law Judge issued a Notice scheduling the prehearing conference for June 2, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. by telephone. On May 7, 2014, the presiding officer issued a Prehearing Conference Order notifying the parties of the obligation to file prehearing memoranda prior to the prehearing conference.

The Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed a Notice of Intervention on May 12, 2014, in addition to filing an Answer. The Office of Small Business Advocate (OSBA) filed a Notice of Intervention, Answer, Public Statement and Notice of Appearance on May 15, 2014. The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE) filed a Notice of Appearance in the

proceeding on May 20, 2014. Petitions to Intervene were filed by the following parties on the dates listed:

Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania (CAUSE-PA) on May 19, 2014

Noble Americas Energy Solutions, LLC (Noble Americas) on May 22, 2014

NextEra Energy Power Marketing, LLC (NextEra) on May 27, 2014

Duquesne Industrial Intervenors (DII) on May 27, 2014

Exelon Generation Company, LLC on May 27, 2014

Retail Energy Supply Association (RESA) on May 29, 2014

On June 2, 2014, the presiding officer conducted a prehearing conference telephonically from Pittsburgh with the following parties represented: Duquesne Light Company, OCA, OSBA, BIE, CAUSE-PA, FES, Noble Americas, Penn Future, NextEra, DII, Exelon, and RESA. Prehearing memoranda were filed prior the prehearing conference by: OCA, OSBA, BIE, CAUSE-PA, DII, Exelon, Noble Americas, RESA, NextEra, FES, and Penn Future. At the prehearing conference, the parties considered issues raised by the Petition, discussed discovery provisions and established a litigation schedule.

The parties attending the prehearing conference agreed to a litigation schedule with all due dates requiring service to be "in-hand" by 4:00 p.m. The parties further agreed electronic or e-mail service will satisfy the "in-hand" requirement if done by 4:00 p.m. and if the service is completed by service of a hard copy via first class mail. This Prehearing Order memorializes the matters discussed, decided and agreed to by the parties during the prehearing conference.
