
Please accept for filing on behalf of Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC - Equitable Division the enclosed Supplement No. 14 to Gas — PA PUC No. 46. Supplement No. 14 is issued in compliance with the Commission's order entered in these dockets on October 2, 2014.

Supplement No. 14 contains First Revised Page No. 79, cancelling Original Page No. 79. Paragraph 4.E on First Revised Page No. 79 includes the tariff language approved in the October 2nd order. Supplement No. 14 reflects an effective date of October 1, 2013 as required in the Commission's order.

Note that Supplement No. 14 only makes changes to the language in Customer Safeguards - paragraph 4.E - and does not impact the application of the DSIC surcharge rate, which is currently set at 2.27% as of October 1, 2014.

RIDER E - DSIC (Continued)4. **Customer Safeguards**

A. Cap: The DSIC is capped at 5.0% of the amount billed to customers for distribution service (including all applicable clauses and riders) as determined on an annualized basis.

B. Audit/Reconciliation: The DSIC is subject to audit at intervals determined by the Commission. Any cost determined by the Commission not to comply with any provision of 66 Pa C.S. §§ 1350, et seq., shall be credited to customer accounts. The DSIC is subject to annual reconciliation based on a reconciliation period consisting of the twelve months ending December 31 of each year. The revenue received under the DSIC for the reconciliation period will be compared to the Company's eligible costs for that period. The difference between revenue and costs will be recouped or refunded, as appropriate, in accordance with Section 1307(e), over a one-year period commencing on April 1 of each year. If DSIC revenues exceed DSIC-eligible costs, such over-collections will be refunded with interest. Interest on over-collections and credits will be calculated at the residential mortgage lending specified by the Secretary of Banking in accordance with the Loan Interest and Protection Law (41 P.S. §§ 101, et seq.) and will be refunded in the same manner as an over-collection.

C. New Base Rates: The DSIC will be reset at zero upon application of new base rates to customer billings that provide for prospective recovery of the annual costs that had previously been recovered under the DSIC. Thereafter, only the fixed costs of new eligible plant additions that have not previously been reflected in the Company's rates or rate base will be reflected in the quarterly updates of the DSIC.

D. Customer Notice: Customers shall be notified of changes in the DSIC by including appropriate information on the first bill they receive following any change. An explanatory bill insert shall also be included with the first billing.

E. All customer classes: The DSIC shall be applied equally to all customer classes, except that the Company may reduce or eliminate Rider E to any customers with competitive alternatives who are paying flexed or discounted rates and customers having negotiated contracts with the Company, if it is reasonably necessary to do so.

F. Earning Reports: The DSIC will also be reset at zero if, in any quarter, data filed with the Commission in the Company's then most recent Annual or Quarterly Earnings reports show that the Company would earn a rate of return that would exceed the allowable rate of return used to calculate its fixed costs under the DSIC as described in the pre-tax return section.


