jury investigating the bomb threats against the University of Pittsburgh sued Pitt on Monday, claiming he was expelled, charged criminally and subjected to FBI scrutiny because of a dispute over use of a locker room.

Seamus Johnston of Johnstown wrote in the lawsuit filed pro se that he began attending Pitt's Johnstown campus in 2009 on a full tuition scholarship for commuter students. Mr. Johnston, 24, who was born

a woman, filed a name change with Pitt in 2011 and enrolled in a for-credit men's weightlifting class, according to the complaint. During his second semester in

that class, a university administrator told him that he should not use the men's locker room unless he got a court order or a birth certificate change. He was told to use a unisex locker room normally reserved for referees.

Following publication of a campus newspaper story about the dispute. Pitt police cited Mr. Johnston, declared him persona non grata in the men's locker room and eventually from the entire sports center, and finally dismissed him from the university. according to the lawsuit.

Campus police also charged Mr. Johnston criminally with indecent exposure, disorderly conduct and defiant trespass. He pleaded guilty to disorderly conduct and defiant trespass, and was on probation for 90 days.

Last year, while U.S. Attornev David Hickton was leading an effort to find the source of the Pitt bomb threats, the FBI took Mr. Johnston's computer and brought him before a grand jury. In the complaint, Mr. Johnston wrote that Pitt gave his "name to the FBI in a retaliatory furtherance of their discriminatory conduct."

Mr. Johnston said Monday that he based that accusation on "the timing, obviously, and from passing comments from the agents.'

"We do intend to vigorously defend any of the claims related to this case." said Pitt spokesman Ken Service, declining to comment further.

Adam Busby of Dublin was eventually charged for making the bomb threats. He has not yet been extradited.

Mr. Johnston said he was inspired to file the lawsuit by Johnstown-area transgender student Kasey Caron's efforts to run for homecoming king despite school officials' ruling that he can only run for queen because he was born female. "I was just incensed to find out that this kind of discrimination is still going on," Mr. Johnston said.

Mr. Johnston claimed that he was a victim of gender discrimination under federal and state law, and that Pitt breached its contract by defying its own ban

PA Cyber charter board stops paying for former CEO's defense

The board of the Pennsylvania Cyber Charter School voted Monday night to stop footing the bill for founder and former CEO Nick Trombetta's legal defense, in light of his indictment last month.

Board president Dave Jaskiewicz said the school's leaders decided in July 2012 to cover Mr. Trombetta's defense bills. though he had resigned the month before, because he had not then been accused of wrongdoing. The federal indictment, Mr. Jaskiewicz told the board. indicates that Mr. Trombetta "had reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful."

Neither he nor school chief executive officer Michael Conti knew precisely what the school

\$200,000. Board member Phillip Tridico voted against the motion to cut off the tab, and would not comment after the meeting. Members Tom Dorsey and Jayne Lingenfelder abstained. Four members voted for the motion.

The vote came after a closeddoor executive session lasting almost an hour and a half.

Mr. Jaskiewicz said the school has also paid the legal bills of employees called as witnesses in the prope.

'To our understanding, basically, we're done," he said, adding that if an employee was called as a witness in the future the school would pay their lawyer.

Mr. Trombetta has pleaded not guilty to the 11 count indictment accusing him of using a series of companies to obtain, and avoid taxes on, some \$990,000 in school

on vendors, working with its nonprofit education management organization, the National Network of Digital Schools, to improve background checking.

'Everyone is looking around the corner a second time before we move" on any new contracts. Mr. Jaskiewicz said.

The school has applied to the Internal Revenue Service for nonprofit status, Mr. Conti added.

"It's been a difficult year," he said. "We are preparing to do what we've always done, and that's to continue to make this school better for its students."

The Midland-based online school now has 10.345 students with nearly 1,000 more in the application stage. Students' home districts pay tuition to PA Cyber in amounts governed by a state formula.
