

Motion for Suppression of Late Filed Exceptions

And Now comes UGI and files the following Motion for Suppression of Late Filed Exceptions pursuant to *52 Pa. Code*, Section 5.103:

1. On October 30, 2014, counsel for UGI received by US Postal Service from Complainant a thirteen-page document purporting to be filed exceptions dated October 22, 2014 to the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge Katrina Dunderdale dated August 21, 2014. The document was entitled "EXCEPTIONS FILED WITH RESPECT TO INTERLOCUTORY DECISION".

2. The Commission served the Initial Decision on the parties on September 9, 2014. UGI received the Initial Decision by on September 9, 2014. In accordance with the Commission's Service Letter dated September 9, 2014 and the Commission regulations at 52 Pa. Code, Section 5.333 (a), exceptions were to be filed within 20 days after the Commission issued the Initial Decision. Consequently, UGI did not file reply exceptions because there was no document timely filed by Ms. Crankfield.

3. The purported exceptions filed by Complaint were filed after the September 29, 2014 date for the filing of exceptions. Further, Complainant gave no indication to UGI that she would be filing untimely Exceptions. The first notification of the Exceptions was when counsel for UGI received the document on October 30, 2014. Complainant should not be allowed to establish her own rules for the filing of exceptions and reply exceptions.

Wherefore, UGI moves that the document entitled EXCEPTIONS FILED WITH RESPECT TO INTERLOCUTORY DECISION be suppressed and given no consideration by the Commission. In the alternative, if the Commission desires to consider the late filed document, UGI must be given a reasonable opportunity to respond to the document.




