Dear Rosemary Chiavetta,

I am writing to inform the Commission that I have contacted Widener Law Clinic for assistance with PECO's counsel's correspondences and motions. However, they have not yet committed to assisting me. I am still waiting to hear if the Commission has allowed me additional time to respond to PECO's counsel motions. PECO's counsel contacted me a further time on Oct. 17th. I was hoping it would be the requested information concerning the device/technology to be installed inside our residence. Instead it only held copies of two Commission decisions concerning an opt out request. I have not made this request of PECO or the PA PUC.

I still continue to look for a copy of the ordinance PECO's counsel refers to on line but can not locate the law. Is this information on PA PUC's website? It should be. I could find much information referring to Act 129's implementation with the utilities, discussions, etc. with the PA PUC. But I can not find information or directions from this state law related to consumers and this new meter technology. PECO's shut off notices where the first direct contact I had with them concerning this new technology. I can not recall hearing of any debate in the PA Legislator concerning Act 129 or of this issue being covered in the media.

These important requests made in the complaint where to postpone my consent to the installation of a new electrical meter/technology within the living environment of my home or to receive informational materials PECO possesses concerning the device's health and safety testing and also to be given a copy of PECO's privacy policy concerning their use of this device/technology prior to it's installation. I need also to know who is legally liable for any harm/violations that may come from this device/technology in the important areas I have outlined, health, safety and personal privacy.

Without having had any return correspondence with the PA PUC since sending my response to PECO's counsel motions to the Commission (letter sent September 22nd) I am repeating my request that the PA PUC delay any action in support of PECO in this matter until I have had the opportunity to have PECO's New Matter, Motion, and Preliminary Objection reviewed by an attorney with experience in this legal area. I would like to request that the PA PUC allow me an extension in the time required to respond to this legal document. The ten day requirement is much too brief a time for an individual customer to make a formal legal declaration even if supplied with adequate legal counsel. Because my financial situation requires that I seek counsel on a pro bono basis I would like to request six weeks to formally make a reply to PECO's counsel and the PA PUC.

I hope that you may be able to clarify the on going formal complaint process via correspondence at your earliest convenience. I would also appreciate information you may have related to Act 129 that pertains to consumers. The noted lack of information about this new technology from the PA Legislature, the media, PECO and it's contractors as well as the PA PUC I find alarming. Please help explain the silence regarding this technology.

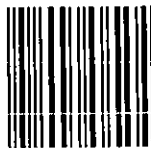
