COMMONWEALTH TELEPHONE COMPANY FILED SUPPLEMENT NUMBER 94 TO TARIFF TELEPHONE PA PUC NUMBER 23, SUPPLEMENT NUMBER 102 TO TARIFF TELEPHONE PA PUC NUMBER 24, AND SUPPLEMENT NUMBER 4 TO TARIFF TELEPHONE PA PUC NUMBER 25, FOR AN INCREASE IN ANNUALIZED REVENUE OF APPROXIMATELY \$4.11 MILLION OF NON-COMPETITIVE SERVICE REVENUE, RESULTING IN AN INCREASE IN RESIDENTIAL PRIMARY DIAL TONE LINE RATES OF \$0.90 MONTHLY BUSINESS DIAL TONE AND PBX MONTHLY RATES OF \$0.50 MONTHLY. IN ADDITION, NON-DIAL TONE RATE INCREASES ARE ALSO PROPOSED, WITH THE SUPPORTING INFORMATION INCLUDED IN THIS FILING, TO BECOME EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2007.

Dear Secretary McNulty:

Pursuant to the provisions of its Alternative Regulation and Network Modernization Plan approved by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission at Docket No. P-00961024, and consistent with the rules and regulations contained in Title 52 (Pennsylvania Code), Commonwealth Telephone Company (CTCo) respectfully submits the above-referenced tariff supplements seeking Commission approval to make the following changes effective on 60 days' notice:

- An increase in annualized revenue of approximately \$4.11 million of non-competitive service revenue, resulting in an increase in residential primary dial tone line rates of \$0.90 monthly business dial tone and PBX monthly rates of \$0.50 monthly. In addition, non-dial tone rate increases are also proposed, with the supporting information included in this filing.

The proposed changes are a result of an annual recalculation of CTCo's price cap form of regulation and the price cap formula, also submitted to the Commission on February 1, 2007. Please also note that under separate cover, CTCo has a filed petition before the Commission at Docket No. P-00961024 to treat Exhibits 1 & 2 as "Highly Confidential"

CTCo respectfully requests the Supplements be approved to become effective April 1, 2007.

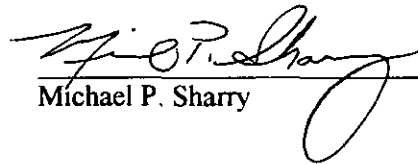

In order to maintain the indexes at PUC-authorized levels, a rate modification is indicated. CTCo respectfully requests approval of the following proposed tariff changes:

Adjustment of Basic Local Service Rates --- This filing proposes an increase in existing local primary residential dial tone line rates of \$0.90 monthly; business dial tone/PBX rates increase \$0.50 per line monthly.

Changes in Other Services --- CTCo proposes the following rate increases to several non-dial tone services:

FX Mileage Charges- per 1/10 mile increment – increases by \$0.15; proposed rate: \$0.65 per 1/10

Non Published Numbers monthly rate – increases by \$0.75; proposed rate \$2.25 monthly

CTCo's approved Chapter 30 Plan requires that the PUC review the PSI/SPI filing, and any accompanying tariff changes. This filing ensures that CTCo's Chapter 30 plan methodology has been properly followed; the result produces an annualized rate increase opportunity of approximately \$4.92 million. However, only approximately \$4.11 million in rate changes are proposed in this filing. This filing is made consistent with the terms as they relate to rate increases of the proposed settlement filed at Docket Nos. A-310800F0010, A-311095F0005 and A-311225F0003, "Joint Application of Commonwealth Telephone Company, CTSI, LLC and CTE Telecom, LLC d/b/a Commonwealth Long Distance Company for all approvals under the public utility code for the acquisition by Citizens Communications Company of all of the stock of the joint applicants corporate parent, Commonwealth Telephone Enterprises, Inc."

CTCo also acknowledges that it had previously requested a rate increase for non published number service at PA PUC Docket No. R-00050551, and that request was denied by the Commission on the grounds that CTCo failed to justify the request. CTCo notes that after its 2005 PSI filing, the Commission approved a similar request submitted by United Telephone (now Embarq), who was aware of the CTCo decision, and presented additional information, as CTCo does now in this filing. CTCo submits that it is proposing a rate change to its non-published number service in this filing that is either at or below currently applied rates for: Verizon, Embarq, and Windstream service areas in Pennsylvania. The now accepted price points for non-published number service indicates no overwhelming hardships have resulted from the Commission's past actions approving non published number rates in the \$2.25 - \$3.50 range.

CTCo further submits that it is in a unique situation relative to concessions made to advance its proposed merger with Citizens Communications, including a series of local dial tone rate caps and a prohibition against banking unrealized price change opportunity revenues over a three-year period. *This situation is not dissimilar to the LECs in Pennsylvania at or near the \$18.00 affordable residential dial tone rate cap, and possessing relatively few non-dial tone categories to absorb the increases associated with their respective Chapter 30 plans.*

CTCo respectfully contends its proposed price point for non published number service would become consistent with what has become industry standards relative to rates applied for non published number service in Pennsylvania, and CTCo respectfully requests the Commission approve the price change in its entirety due to CTCo's unique circumstance.

The breakdown of lines and service units affected is included in Exhibit 2.

Please refer to Exhibit 2, which details the affect of the rate change by type of service rendered and applicable dial tone rate group based on the demand units for each type of service as well as the affected demand units for the non-dial tone categories.

5. The effect, whether direct or indirect, of the proposed change on the utility's revenue and expenses.

Implementation of the proposed changes will keep CTCo's price indexes consistent with the provisions contained in the Company's Chapter 30 Plan, approved by the PUC at Docket No. P-00961024. In this case, an annualized revenue increase of approximately \$ 4.92 million is indicated; however, \$4.11 million in rate changes are proposed in this filing.

6. The effect of the change on the service rendered by the utility.

Approval of this tariff supplement will have no adverse impact on the service provided by CTCo.

7. A list of factors considered by the utility in making this change.

CTCo's approved Chapter 30 Plan governs PUC review of the PSI/SPI filing, and any accompanying tariff changes. The filing of accompanying tariff supplements ensures that the Company's Chapter 30 Plan, including the price cap formula, is properly followed.

Further, CTCo has limited the otherwise authorized increase in residential and business dial tone rates, consistent with the agreed to terms of the "Joint Petition for Approval of Unanimous Settlement Agreement" at Docket Nos. A-310800F0010, A-311095F0005, and A-311225F0003, which is currently pending approval at the Commission.

(continued)P. TELEPHONE NUMBERS

The Telephone Company reserves the right to change the telephone number or numbers of a customer's service or the central office designation thereof as the exigencies of the business may require.

The charge for a customer requested number change is contained in Section 3. Charges for Customized Telephone Numbers may be found in Section 5.

Q. NON-PUBLISHED NUMBERS

A telephone number is nonpublished when, at the customer's request, it is omitted from the directory and the information lists of the Telephone Company. The nonpublished telephone number must be known by the calling party for completion of the call to a customer who has nonpublishing telephone service and is not available through the information sources of the Telephone Company.

A non-published telephone number is provided at the rate of \$2.25 each per month. In addition, the customer is required to sign a written statement releasing the Telephone Company for all liability for losses resulting from such an arrangement. (I)

At the customer's request, a nonpublished telephone number can be made available through the directory assistance information source of the Telephone Company. A nonpublished but directory listed number is provided at the rate of \$2.25 per month. (I)

Upon request, a nonpublished telephone number can be made available to pay telephone line service customers.

A non-recurring charge will apply for each change of telephone number required to establish a nonpublished number. NRC's are filed in Section 3.

R. TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES

Telephone directories issued by the Telephone Company to its customers and patrons without charge are the property of the Telephone Company and shall be surrendered to the Telephone Company upon termination of service or distribution of a subsequent issue, in as good condition as reasonably wear and tear permits. No binder, holder or auxiliary cover, except where furnished by the Telephone Company, may be used in connection with any directory furnished by it.

The Telephone Company, except as provided herein, shall not be liable for damage claimed on account of errors in, or omissions from, its directories, nor for the result of publication of such errors in the directory, nor will the Telephone Company be a party to controversies arising between customers or others as the result of listings published in its directories.

C. FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE

Foreign exchange service does not come within the Telephone Company's general undertaking, nor does the Telephone Company obligate itself to furnish such service generally, but will do so where facilities of such a character are available as will permit satisfactory telephone transmission.

Foreign exchange service is offered only an intraLATA basis and is limited to one-party or PBX trunk lines. When foreign exchange service is furnished by means of a branch exchange trunk line, connections to the trunk at the branch exchange switchboard are restricted to the stations connected with and in the immediate vicinity of the branch exchange switchboard.

A customer located in the territory served by this company must subscribe to service from the normal exchange of the same class (business or residence), and at the same location, during the time that foreign exchange service is furnished from the exchange of another company. The use of the foreign exchange service will be limited to calls within the local service area of that foreign exchange.

Foreign exchange service is provided upon a contract for a minimum period of six (6) months.

D. FOREIGN EXCHANGE MILEAGE MEASUREMENTS

When foreign exchange service is provided between exchanges served by this Company, mileage is the air line distance between the rate centers of the local and foreign exchanges.

If one of the exchanges is operated by another telephone company, which applies its established foreign exchange mileage charges for the portion of the service furnished by it, the mileage to which this Company's rates apply is the air line distance between the rate center of the exchange operated by this Company and the point where the air line between rate crosses the other company's territorial boundary or such other measuring point on the boundary or in the other company's territory to which the other company's mileage is measured as provided in the other company's tariff.

If the customer is located outside the local base rate area, one-party exchange line mileage charges apply or the same differential over the base rate as for individual line local exchange service apply.

E. FOREIGN EXCHANGE RATES

The charge for the foreign exchange service is the established rate for the grade of service in the foreign exchange, plus the following monthly charges:

Mileage Charge

For each 1/10 air line mileage or fraction \$ .65 (I)

IntraLATA Intercompany Loop Charge

For each local loop . . . a charge equal to 85% of the business, one-party rate of that exchange for business customers, and 85% of the residence one-party rate of that exchange for residence customers.

G. TRUNK HUNTING SERVICE

1. A group of individual exchange lines furnished to the same customer may be arranged, at the customer's request, so that all calls to the group will be directed automatically to an idle line of the group.

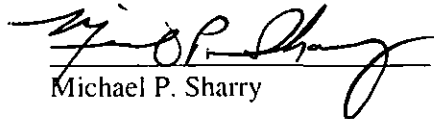

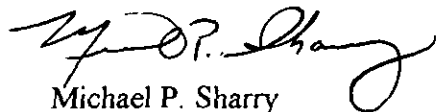
