PETITION TO FOR LEAVE TO WITHDRAW  
THE PETITION TO INTERVENE OF  
UTILITY WORKERS UNION OF AMERICA, SYSTEM LOCAL 102

---

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94, Utility Workers Union of America, System Local 102 (“UWUA”), hereby petitions for leave to withdraw the Petition to Intervene that it filed on September 9, 2014, in the above-captioned proceeding. In support of this Petition, UWUA states as follows:

1. UWUA is the authorized collective bargaining representative for more than 100 employees of Pennsylvania Electric Company (“Penelec”).
2. On August 4, 2014, Penelec filed a request for an increase in base rates and various riders totaling approximately \$119.8 million.
3. On September 9, 2014, UWUA filed a Petition to Intervene because of its concerns that issues may be raised in the case that directly affect the interests of UWUA’s members as customers and employees of Penelec.
4. UWUA carefully reviewed the information provided by Penelec and other parties throughout this proceeding. UWUA had expressed specific concerns with Penelec’s reliability of service, among others. UWUA notes that some of its concerns

also were addressed by other parties, including the Office of Consumer Advocate ("OCA").

5. On January 7, 2015, UWUA was informed that Penelec, OCA, and other parties had reached an agreement in principle to settle issues related to customer service and reliability, among others.

6. While UWUA does not take a position on all of the matters included in the agreement in principle, UWUA believes that the agreement makes progress toward addressing the issues of primary concern to UWUA in this proceeding. Consequently, UWUA has concluded that its participation in this proceeding is no longer required to protect the interests of its members, as employees and customers of Penelec.

WHEREFORE, Utility Workers Union of America, System Local 102, respectfully requests leave to withdraw its Petition to Intervene in this proceeding.
