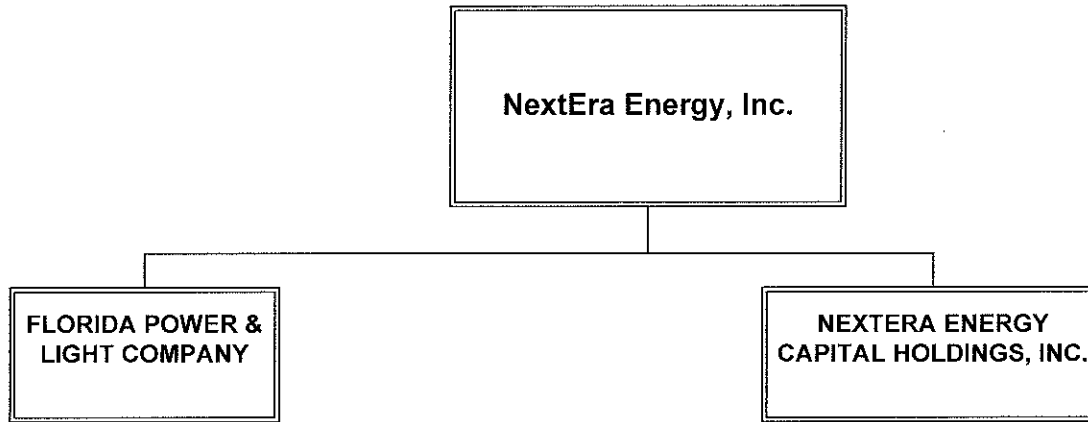

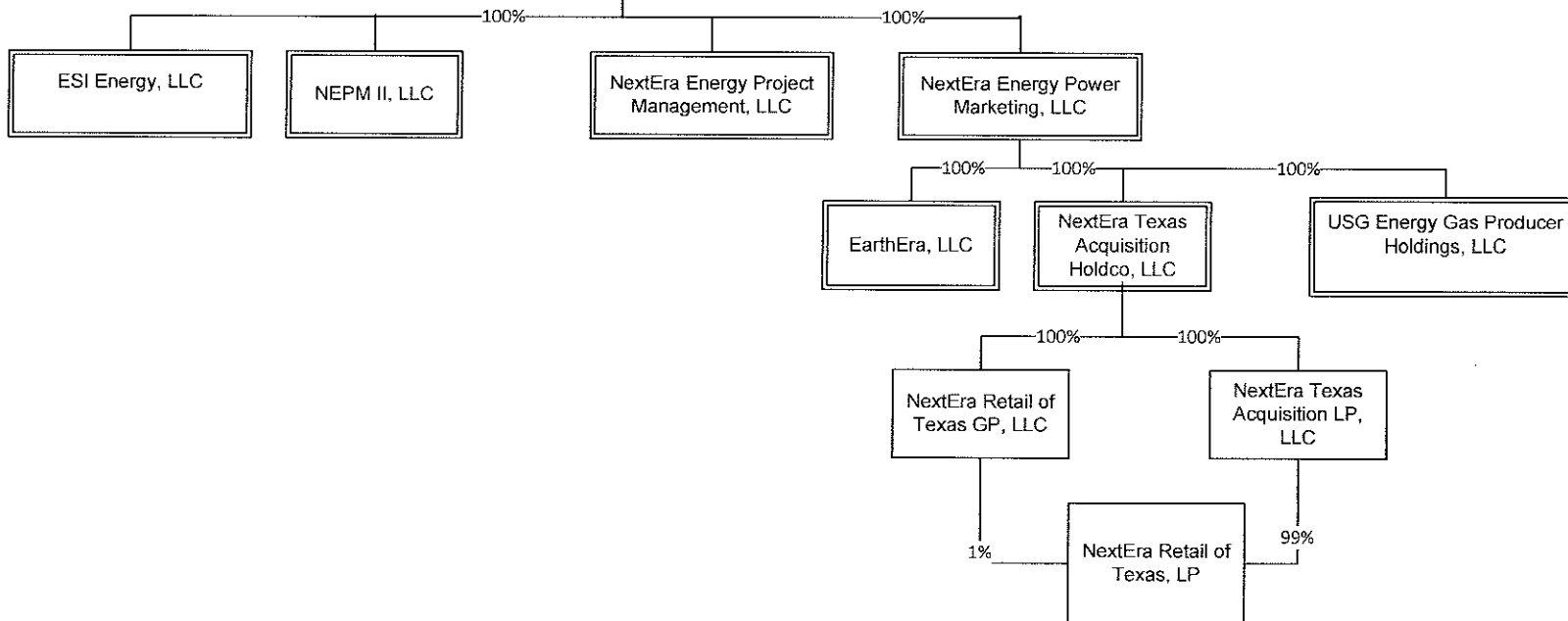
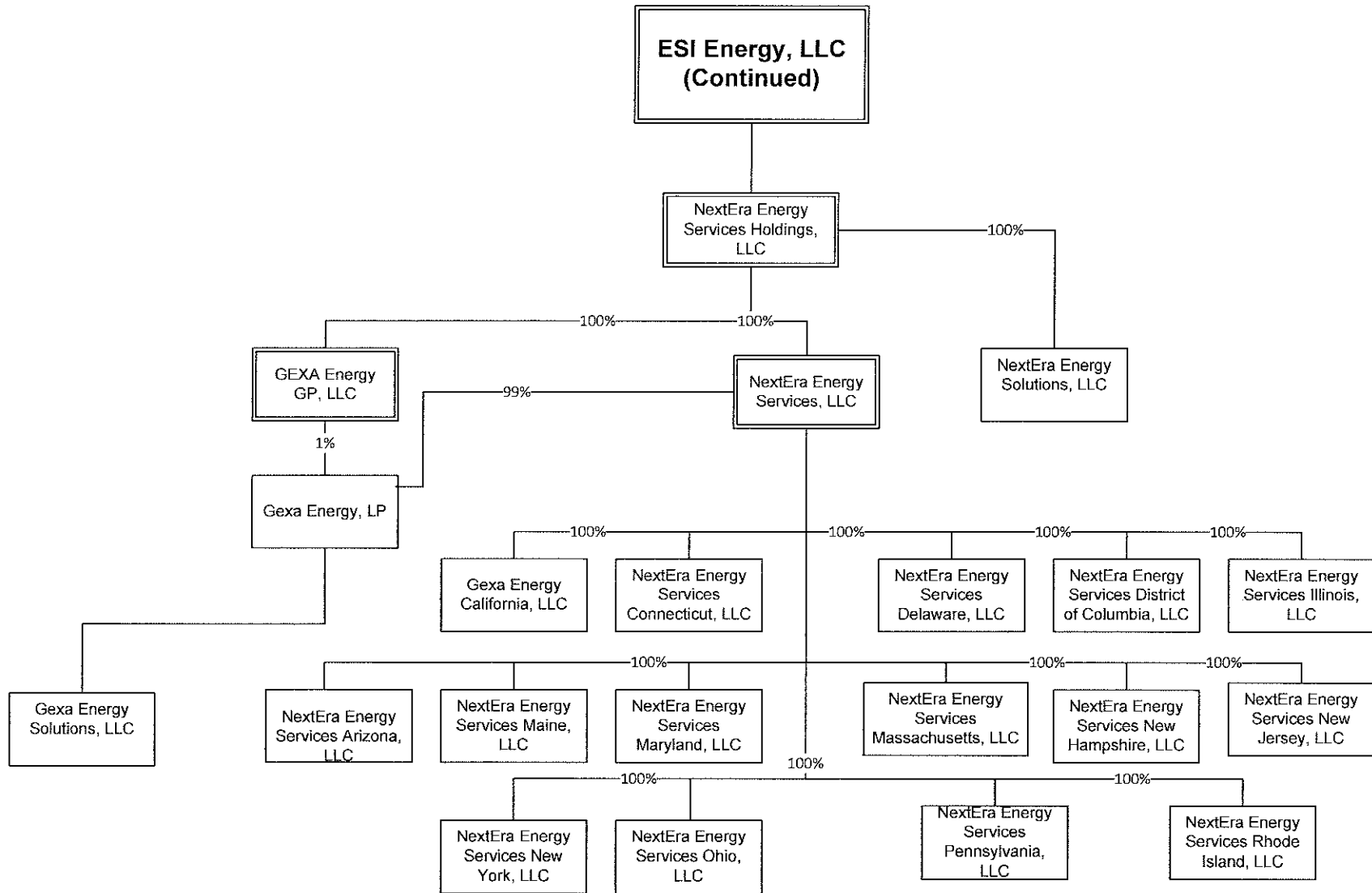

NextEra Energy, Inc. Entity Organization Chart

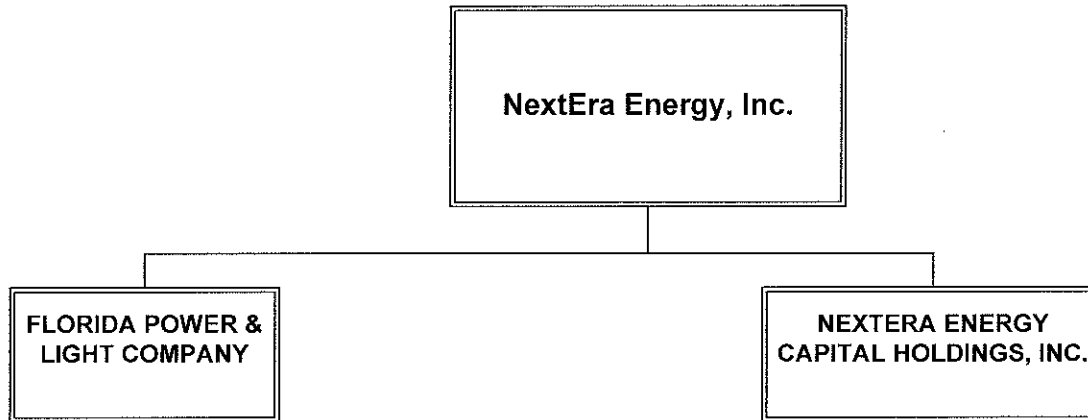

Outlook: Stable

Our rating outlook on NextEra and its subsidiaries is stable and reflects a business profile that is less affected by higher-risk merchant energy activities than in the recent past and a utility that presents a much better credit profile than its peers.

We also base the stable outlook, in part, on Standard & Poor’s baseline forecast that NextEra will experience improved bondholder protection measures, attaining adjusted funds from operations (FFO) to debt approaching 25%, and adjusted debt to EBITDA of about 3.3x over the next few years and stabilizing thereafter. Although year-to-year fluctuations in weather (including hurricanes), fuel cost recovery, and burdensome spending on renewable projects could temporarily affect measures, we expect the company to adapt its financial risk management and the pace of its capital spending to account for these and other factors so it can achieve these measures.

Downside scenario

We could lower ratings if financial measures do not improve and we think they will remain resiliently at less-supportive levels, including an FFO-to-debt ratio that averages less than 23%. We could also lower ratings if regulatory risk permanently deteriorated or investment decisions demonstrated a shift in risk appetite.

Upside scenario

We could raise ratings if cash flow measures considerably improve, such that FFO to debt averages above 30%. In addition, we would expect debt to EBITDA of less than 2.5x. We could also consider a higher rating if the company were to reduce exposure to higher-risk business activities to a degree that resulted in a higher assessment of its business risk profile.

Company Description

NextEra is a large, diversified energy holding company that owns an integrated electric utility and electric transmission companies; develops and operates merchant generating facilities, mostly renewable; and invests in natural gas production ventures. Trading operations engage in risk management activities as well as speculative trading electricity and natural gas markets.

Business Risk: Strong

NextEra's business risk profile is anchored by the company's core electric utility operations in Florida, which exhibit proficiency in almost every area of analysis. The service territory has historically fared better than most of the rest of the country despite its lagging performance during the recession, the customer mix is mostly residential and commercial, costs and rates are low, and reliability and customer satisfaction are high. While Florida is not immune to overall economic trends, we expect the state to attract new residents and jobs over the long term and resume an above-average growth trajectory. NextEra's large and growing reliance on natural gas to fuel utility generation could eventually turn from an advantage (because of its favorable environmental status and currently low prices) to a weakness if gas prices are erratic over time. Regulatory risk, the most important risk a utility faces, is well managed.

NER, the main subsidiary under unregulated NextEra Energy Capital Holdings Inc., engages in electric generation, transmission, marketing, and trading throughout the U.S. and Canada. NER's focus is on geographic and fuel diversity and on developing environmentally advantageous facilities that benefit from public policy trends. The merchant generator's capacity of over 18,000 megawatts consists of more than half wind turbines, one-quarter natural-gas-fired stations, and the rest mainly nuclear facilities. More than three-quarters of the wind projects and over 60% of the total portfolio operate under largely fixed-price, long-term contracts. The rest of the portfolio, including one nuclear plant, is merchant capacity that can be exposed to market prices for its output. While a policy of actively hedging the commodity price risk of plant inputs and outputs helps to reduce the risks associated with merchant energy activities, NER faces an inherent level of commodity price risk. In addition, NER's extensive project financing (approximately half of installed capacity) of its assets diminishes its cash flow quality, but this is offset by lower financial risk. NER's risks hinder NextEra's credit quality, especially in light of the influence that marketing and high-risk proprietary trading results have on NER's earnings and cash flows.

- The company effectively manages the pace and risk profile of its unregulated investments.

Island and Maryland. NEES PA will use Energy Services Group to manage EDI transactions. Customers will generally be invoiced on a consolidated basis by the applicable utility, with necessary coordination and review by NEES PA. Where required for more sophisticated products, NEES PA will manage the billing of the energy portion of the charges. Bills prepared at the direction of NEES PA will be done so in accordance with all applicable rules of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

As mentioned above, customer service will be ultimately managed by NEES PA's key personnel in Texas. Any customer with a question or complaint regarding billing or other generation service matters may contact a NEES PA Customer Care representative at a dedicated toll free number or email address provided in the customer contract. NEES PA Customer Care personnel will make every effort to respond to the customer's inquiry or resolve its complaint in a timely and satisfactory fashion. If a mutually agreeable resolution cannot be reached at that level, the Customer Care manager or supervisor will review the complaint and then notify the customer of the outcome. At that time, the customer will also be notified of its right to file a complaint with the PAPUC and NEES PA will provide the telephone number, facsimile number and website of the PAPUC for the customer's convenience.

NEES PA will exercise rigorous quality control over the service rendered by such provider and will ensure that its customer service representatives are well trained in applicable law and PAPUC rules governing the provision of retail gas service. NEES PA also expects that it will work closely with the applicable utilities to resolve billing disputes for those customers who can only be billed for delivery service by the utilities under applicable Pennsylvania law.

NextEra Energy Services provides training to all personnel and stresses the importance and understanding of each of the following objectives:

- Knowledge and aware NEES PAs of applicable Pennsylvania laws and regulations governing marketing and consumer protection.
- Knowledge and understanding of responsible and ethical sales practices.

This right to rescind does not extend to service requests for establishing electric service at a new location.

Definitions

- “Delivery Charges” for transmitting natural gas to the gas distribution lines of the NGDC, and distributing the gas to the meter at your service address.
- “NGDC” means your Natural Gas Distribution Company, which is named below in this Disclosure Statement.
- “NGDC Charges” means all the charges imposed by NGDC in connection with the Service including, without limitation, all charges authorized under the NGDC’s tariffs and Delivery Charges.
- “Service” means the full-requirements natural gas supply provided by us to the account associated with your service address.

Terms of Service

5. Penalties, Fees and Exceptions - An Early Termination Fee (“ETF”) may apply. By signing this Agreement, or by verbal authorization received over telephone (the “Verbal Authorization”), you hereby agree that, as of the Effective Date or upon receipt of the Agreement, whichever is later, you have read, and agree to, all the terms and conditions of this Agreement. TERMS OF SERVICE

Eligibility: This Agreement is only for Pennsylvania residential and small commercial customers – i.e., commercial customers whose maximum registered peak load was less than 25 kW within the last 12 months. Any other customers are not eligible.

Enrollment. You hereby authorize us to cause the NGDC to enroll the account associated with your service address for Service from us. In such regard, you agree to cooperate with us and provide to us any requested information. We will not be responsible for any delayed enrollment due to any reason beyond our control.

Customer's Service. We agree to sell to you, and you agree to buy from us, the Service during the term of this Agreement. You hereby grant us authority to obtain your current and historical gas cost and usage data from the NGDC, as well as your payment and credit history, and other information reasonably requested by us. You are responsible for keeping us updated with your current address, email address and telephone number.

Term. This Agreement shall be effective upon the date it has been executed by both parties (the "Effective Date" set forth by our signature). Service from Supplier will continue through the Initial Term, and thereafter if applicable, as described in the Disclosure Statement, incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

Price. You will pay the price set forth in the Disclosure Statement during the Initial Term, subject to any adjustments under the "Pass-Through Charges" Section below. After the end of the Initial Term of the Agreement, your price will be a variable price, as described in the Disclosure Statement.

Payments. You are required to pay Supplier the total monthly charge for Service ("Supplier Gas Charge") each month, which is the sum of (i) the product of your total metered gas usage for the account during an NGDC billing cycle and the applicable price, (ii) pass-through charges, and (iii) taxes (other than the Pennsylvania gross receipts tax). Bills from the NGDC must be paid on or before the due date set by the NGDC. If we ever bill you, you must pay the full amount of the bill within 20 days after the date of the bill. Late fees, as described in the Disclosure Statement, may apply.

Pass-Through Charges. Pass-through charges are primarily the NGDC Charges described in the Disclosure Statement, which NGDC Charges are in effect as of the Effective Date or at any time during the effective term of this Agreement. You also agree to pay, as pass-through charges, any increased costs or charges resulting from federal, state or local laws or regulatory actions that impose new or increased costs or charges. See the "Change in Law or Regulation" Section below. Depending on the bill format, pass-through charges may appear on your bill as a line item or price adjustment.

Billing. You will receive one bill each month setting forth your Supplier Gas Charge. If the NGDC fails to timely obtain or transmit a meter reading, Supplier may issue or cause to be issued a bill to you based on its estimated gas usage and charges. In the event of a billing error, Supplier may issue a corrective invoice, which you are required to pay.

Credit and Deposits. If we are required to bill you directly, we may use credit reporting agencies to evaluate your credit and/or payment history. If you do not meet our credit standards or cannot demonstrate satisfactory credit, we may require a deposit from you or may refuse to provide gas supply. If a deposit is required, the amount required will comply with applicable law. We may apply to any deposit you have provided us, plus any accrued interest required by applicable law, to all amounts due from you, including any ETF. Any excess amount will be refunded to you.

Change in Law or Regulation. If there is a change (including changes in interpretation) in any federal, state or local law, regulation, rule, ordinance, order, directive, filed tariff, decision, writ, judgment, or decree by a governmental authority, or if any of the foregoing which is existing as of the Effective Date of this Agreement is implemented or differently administered, and such change results in us incurring new or increased costs and charges in providing the Service to you, these costs and charges may, at our option, be assessed to you as new or increased pass-through charges. If you are paying a fixed price, or a variable price that is based on a specific formula or index, at the time we intend to assess such additional costs and charges, we will treat it as a change to this Agreement under the "Agreement Expiration/Change in Terms" Section of the Disclosure Statement. If you are paying a discretionary variable price (i.e., one that is not based on specific formula or indexed) at the time we intend to assess such additional costs and charges, we will not provide notice to you and the additional costs and charge may, at our option, be assessed in your monthly bills for service as additional or increased pass-through charges.

Title. You shall be deemed to be in exclusive control of the gas at the point it is delivered to your meter. You are responsible for any damages or injury caused by your natural gas supply, once the gas is delivered to your meter. We will have delivered the gas to the meter at your service address, and cease to have title and the associated risk of loss related to, the gas when it is delivered to the interconnection point of the distribution gas lines where the NGDC accepts the gas.

Force Majeure. We will not be in breach, nor will we be liable, for any delay or failure in our performance of this Agreement to the extent such performance is prevented or delayed due to a Force Majeure Event. For purposes of this Agreement, a "Force Majeure Event" shall mean any act or event that (i) renders it impossible or impractical for the us to perform any of our obligations under the

Agreement, and (ii) is beyond our reasonable control including, but not limited to, events such as storms or floods, lightning, earthquakes and other acts of God, wars, civil disturbances, revolts, terrorist activity, sabotage, theft, vandalism or other actions by third parties, fires, explosions, failures of suppliers, utility action or inaction, and actions of a governmental authority.

Your NGDC's price for gas supply may be higher than the price under this Agreement. We will notify you in writing at least ten (10) days prior to cancellation of this Agreement for non-payment or other failure of performance, or such other period as may be required by applicable rules.

If you cancel Service before the end of the Initial Term, or we cancel Service to your account because of your failure

to pay or other failure on your part to perform this Agreement, you must pay us, in addition to any outstanding amounts due, the ETF. The ETF is described in the Disclosure Statement.

Regardless of the method or reason for cancellation of the Agreement, you are responsible for payment of all outstanding charges incurred through the date on which the cancellation becomes effective.
