**MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT**


NOW COMES the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s (Commission) Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E), by its prosecuting attorneys, and files this Motion for Default Judgment against Raymond P. Sutherland (Respondent) pursuant to Section 5.103 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code §5.103. In support thereof, I&E respectfully represents as follows:

1. I&E commenced this action on October 2, 2014 by filing a Complaint.
2. On October 3, 2014, the Complaint was served by certified mail to Respondent at 1844 Rockville Road, Spring Grove, PA 17362.
3. This is the last known mailing address that Respondent provided to the Commission.
4. On October 8, 2014, the Complaint was returned to the Commission by the United States Post Office. It was marked as “Return to Sender” and a different address was provided.
5. On October 17, 2014, the Complaint was re-served to Respondent at 800 Randolph Street, Apartment 61, Hanover, PA 17331.
6. On October 27, 2014, this Complaint was returned to the Commission by the United States Post Office and was marked as “Return to Sender.”

7. Pursuant to the Commission's procedural regulations at 52 Pa. Code §1.53(e), the Complaint was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on January 24, 2015. *See 45 Pa. Bull.* 480 (January 24, 2015).
8. Included with the Complaint was a Notice advising Respondent that it must file an Answer within twenty (20) days.
9. The Notice also advised Respondent that if it failed to answer the Complaint, I&E would request that the Commission issue an Order imposing the penalty set forth in the Complaint.
10. Respondent did not file an Answer to the Complaint.
11. Pursuant to Section 5.61(c) of the Commission's regulations, a Respondent who fails to file an Answer to a Complaint within the 20-day response period may be deemed in default, and the relevant facts stated in the Complaint may be deemed admitted. 52 Pa. Code §5.61(c).
12. The Commonwealth Court has upheld the Commission's authority to sustain complaints that are not answered within twenty days. *See Fusaro v. Pa. PUC*, 382 A.2d 794, 797 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1978).
13. Respondent did not pay its outstanding assessment balance of \$120 or the \$1,018 civil penalty that was requested in the Complaint for Respondent's failure to pay the Commission's assessment for the 2012-2013 fiscal year and file an assessment report demonstrating its 2011 calendar year revenues.
14. I&E respectfully requests that the Commission enter a Default Order against Respondent that:
  - a. Directs Respondent to pay its outstanding assessment of \$120 for the 2012-2013 fiscal year and the requested civil penalty of \$1,018 within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order;
  - b. Directs the Bureau of Technical Utility Services to cancel Respondent's certificate of public convenience at A-00122346 if the assessment and civil penalty are not timely paid;
  - c. Notifies Respondent that a copy of this Order will be sent to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the suspension or revocation of vehicle registrations that were used under Respondent's operating authority; and

- d. Directs the Bureau of Administrative Services, Assessment Section to refer the matter to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the unpaid assessment.



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
