

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

On May 18, 2001, Dominion Telecom, Inc. (Applicant) filed four (4) Applications seeking Certificates of Public Convenience pursuant to the

Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 U.S.C. §§201, *et seq.*, (TA-96)<sup>1</sup> and to Chapter 11 and 30 of the Public Utility Code (Code) (66 Pa. C.S. §1101, *et seq.*, and §§3001, *et seq.*) evidencing authority to provide the following telecommunication services to wholesale customers as well as large and medium-sized business customers:

- (1) As a Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services (“IXC Reseller”) throughout the Commonwealth;
- (2) As a Reseller of Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Services (“CLEC”) Limited to Data Services in the service territories of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania and as a Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier (“CLEC”) Limited to Data Services throughout the Commonwealth;
- (3) As a Competitive Access Provider (“CAP”) throughout the Commonwealth; and
- (4) As a Facilities-Based Interexchange Carrier throughout the Commonwealth.

The Applicant complied with Section 5.14 of our regulations, 52 Pa Code §5.14, relating to applications requiring notice. On June 8, 2001, Thomas, Thomas, Armstrong & Niesen filed an objection on behalf of the Pennsylvania

Rural Telephone Companies to Docket No. A-311102F0002. The objection was based on the inclusion of resold competitive local exchange service in the rural territories. Resold competitive local exchange service in rural territories under the Commission's existing rules for CLEC certification triggers certain rights. Subsequently Dominion Telecom, Inc. amended the Application to no longer seek statewide authority to provide competitive local exchange service on a resold basis by excluding the territories served by the Pennsylvania Rural Telephone Association. Since the rural service territories are no longer implicated under the amended Application, the Pennsylvania Rural Telephone Association's June 8, 2001 objection is rendered moot. No protests against the amended Application were filed. No hearings were held.

The Applicant is a Virginia Corporation with its principal place of business at 701 East Cary Street, Richmond, Virginia, 23219, phone (804) 775-5000, fax (804) 775-5588. Correspondence to resolve complaints may be directed to Complaints Analyst at (804) 775-5000 at the principal place of business. The Applicant complied with 15 Pa. C.S. §4124, relating to foreign corporations. The Applicant's registered office provider is CT Corporation System, 1515 Market Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The Applicant is not currently doing business in Pennsylvania. The Applicant has no affiliates rendering or predecessors, which have rendered public utility service outside Pennsylvania. Dominion Resources, Inc. is a major investor in the Company and is currently the majority owner. Currently the Applicant is providing utility service in Virginia.

The Applicant intends to assemble and operate a dedicated and private line fiber optic network communications infrastructure that utilizes SONET and DWDM technology. The Applicant will enable its system with the latest

generation of integrated optical networking equipment that provides access, multiplexing, switch extension and transport services to carriers and service providers. The Applicant's network is capable of using the highest commercially available capacity transmission (OC-192) and, therefore, can support advanced capacity-intensive data technologies such as frame relay and ATM as well as multimedia and Internet-related applications. The Applicant intends to target its marketing efforts to other certified telecommunication carriers, government entities and business customers such as Internet Service Providers.

The Applicant requests authority to provide services as a Facilities-Based CLEC Limited to Data Services throughout the Commonwealth and as a Reseller of CLEC Limited to Data Services in the service territories of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania. The Applicant served a copy of the Application upon Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania. The Applicant requested that it be afforded the same treatment as BlueStar Networks, Inc. at Docket No. A-310862F0002. The Applicant also stated that it would not provide voice grade services. The Applicant also requests authority to provide services as a Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services, CAP and Facilities-Based IXC.

Therefore, we will allow Dominion Telecom, Inc. to operate as a CLEC Limited to Data Services in Pennsylvania.<sup>2</sup> However, the Applicant is reminded that as and when it decides to provide voice-related services, it shall apply to the Commission for approval to offer that service and to comply with all

the requirements that are required of a CLEC providing data as well as voice services.

Issues affecting CLECs have been addressed and are being addressed in a number of Commission proceedings.<sup>3</sup> A CLEC applicant is expected to adhere to the requirements relative to universal service and Lifeline programs, as initially set forth or as subsequently enlarged or modified.<sup>4</sup> Further, Section 253(b) of the TA-96 permits a state commission to impose, on a competitively neutral basis and consistent with the Universal Service Section, requirements necessary to preserve and advance universal service, protect the public safety and welfare, ensure the continued quality of telecommunication services, and safeguard the rights of consumers. In response, we articulated explicit concerns relative to an applicant's financial fitness, tariff compliance, and rates.<sup>5</sup>

The Applicant has provided financial information to support its Applications. We, therefore, conclude that the Applicant has demonstrated that it is financially capable of providing telecommunication services as a Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services, a Reseller and Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Limited to Data Services, a Competitive Access Provider and a Facilities-Based Interexchange Carrier to the public in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

We conclude that the Applicant has met the requirements for certification as an IXC Reseller, a Reseller and Facilities-Based CLEC Limited to

Data Services, a CAP<sup>5</sup> and a Facilities-Based IXC consistent with this Order. Premised upon our review of the Applications and the proposed tariffs, and consistent with our Orders, the Code, our Regulations and the TA-96, we conclude that the Applicant's proposed services do not raise concerns at this time regarding safety, adequacy, reliability, or privacy as contemplated by Section 3009(b)(4) of the Code. We note, however deficiencies in the proposed tariffs. See Appendix A for a list of deficiencies found in the proposed tariffs.

We shall direct the Applicant to revise the proposed tariffs in accordance with the changes noted in Appendix A of this Order.<sup>6</sup> The Applicant shall thereafter file its Initial Tariffs reflecting the requested changes on or before sixty (60) days from the date of entry of this Order. Copies of the Initial Tariffs shall also be served upon the same entities receiving service of the original Application, including the ILECs. If the time required for such resolution and filing exceeds sixty (60) days, the Applicant may request an extension of an additional sixty (60) days with the Commission's Secretary. Thus, if the Initial Tariffs are not filed within 60 days (120 days including the extension) of the entry of this Order, the Applications will be dismissed and the authority granted herein will be revoked without further Commission Order. To the extent that the proposed tariffs contain rates, the Initial Tariffs may become effective on one (1) day's notice from the date upon which they are filed and served.

### Conclusion

Accordingly, we shall grant the Applications and render the June 8, 2001 objection by the Pennsylvania Rural Telephone Association moot. The Applicant has had provisional authority under our *Implementation Order* (p. 7, para. B.1.c.4) and our *Implementation Reconsideration Order* (p. 5) to provide the proposed IXC, CAP and CLEC services pursuant to its proposed tariffs during the pendency of the application process. Upon the establishment of filed rates and the approval of the Initial Tariffs, a Certificate of Public Convenience shall be issued evidencing the Applicant's authority to provide services as an IXC Reseller, a CAP and a Facilities-Based IXC in the Commonwealth and as a Facilities-Based CLEC Limited to Data Services throughout the Commonwealth or as a CLEC Reseller Limited to Data Services in the service territories of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania consistent with this Order and our decisions in the *MFS* and such other proceedings; **THEREFORE,**

#### **IT IS ORDERED:**

1. That the Application of Dominion Telecom, Inc. at Docket No. A-311102, for authority to operate as a Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services throughout the Commonwealth is granted, consistent with this Order.

2. That the Application of Dominion Telecom Inc at Docket No. A-311102F0002, for authority to operate as a Reseller of Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Limited to Data Services within the service territories of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania and as a Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Limited to Data Services throughout the Commonwealth is granted, consistent with this Order.

3. That the Application of Dominion Telecom, Inc. at Docket No. A-311102F0003, for authority to operate as a Competitive Access Provider throughout the Commonwealth is granted, consistent with this Order.

4. That the Application of Dominion Telecom, Inc. at Docket No. A-311102F0004, for authority to operate as a Facilities-Based Interexchange Carrier throughout the Commonwealth is granted, consistent with this Order.

5. That the Applicant is directed to revise its proposed tariffs to reflect the changes noted in Appendix A of this Order.

6. That the Applicant shall file its Initial Tariffs consistent with the requisite changes noted in Appendix A of this Order, within sixty (60) days after the date of entry of this Order. The Applicant shall serve copies of its Initial Tariffs on each entity receiving a copy of the original Applications. To the extent the Proposed Tariffs contained rates, the Initial Tariffs may become effective on or after one (1) days' notice from the date upon which they are filed and served. If the Proposed Tariffs did not contain rates, the Initial Tariffs may not become effective prior to sixty (60) days' notice. The Initial Reseller of Interexchange Services shall be labeled "Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services Tariff". The Initial Reseller and Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Tariff Limited to Data Services shall be labeled "Reseller and Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier Tariff Limited to Data Services". The Initial Competitive Access Provider Tariff shall be labeled "Competitive Access Provider Tariff". The Initial Facilities-Based Interexchange Carrier Tariff shall be labeled "Facilities-Based Interexchange Toll Services".

7. That the Applicant shall comply with all the provisions of the Public Utility Code, as now exist or as may be hereafter amended, and with all pertinent rules, regulations, and Orders of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, now in effect or as may be prescribed by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, including but not limited to: the *MFS Intelenet, et al.*, Docket Nos. A-310203F0002, *et al.*; and the *Universal Service Investigation*, Docket No. I-00940035; and the *Global Order*, Docket No. P-00991648, *et al.*

8. That the authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the Applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right to the Applicant.

9. That the Applicant maintains separate accounting systems for its Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services, Competitive Local Exchange Carrier operations, that is limited to data services, Competitive Access Provider operations and Facilities-Based Interexchange Services.

10. That the Applicant shall file such affiliated interest agreements as may be necessary relative to any transactions with affiliates.

11. That in the event that the Applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days (120 days including an approved extension) from the date of entry of this Order, complied with the requirements set forth herein, the Applications at Docket Nos. A-311102, A-311102F0002, A-311102F0003 and A-311102F0004 may be dismissed and the authority granted herein revoked without further Commission Order.

12. That upon the establishment of filed rates and the approval of the Initial Tariffs, a Certificate of Public Convenience shall be issued authorizing the Applicant to furnish services as a Reseller of Interexchange Toll Services, Competitive Access Provider and a Reseller of Interexchange Toll within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and to furnish services as a Facilities-Based Competitive Local Exchange Carrier, limited to data services, throughout the Commonwealth and a Reseller of Competitive Local Exchange Services within the service territories of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc., Verizon North, Inc. and Sprint/United Telephone of Pennsylvania consistent with this Order.

13. That the objection filed by the Pennsylvania Rural Telephone Association on June 8, 2001 is rendered moot.
