
Since filing the formal complaint I was informed that my job was being terminated on March 10<sup>th</sup> 2015 due to the sale of the company I work for. I was also told that I will be receiving a small severance which I planned to put on my electric bill when I receive it.

Since that time my employment has been terminated actually a week earlier than stated on February 6<sup>th</sup> 2015. I am now waiting to receive my severance so that I can apply it to my bill and work out some type of payment plan.

As of right now I have no income until my unemployment benefits kick in or until I find new employment.

Also I really did not fully understand how documents were to be presented and since I was rushed for time I did not have any other alternative but to deliver it this way.

My intention was not to show any disrespect for the court at all and I ask that my letter stating my desire to drop the case would be accepted, and that my case would not be dismissed with prejudice.
