(1) The Board of Directors of the Corporation is hereby empowered to authorize the issuance from time to time of shares of its stock, with or without par value, of any class,

, for such consideration as said Board of Directors may deem advisable irrespective of the value or amount of such considerations.

(2) No contract or other transaction between this Corporation any other corporation and no act of this Corporation shall in any way be affected or invalidated by the fact that any of the directors of this corporation are pecuniarily or otherwise interested in, or are directors or officers of, such other corporation; any directors individually, or any firm of which any director may be a member, may be a party to, or may be pecuniarily or otherwise interested in, any contract or transaction of this Corporation, provided that the fact that she/he or such firm is so interested shall be disclosed or shall have been known to the Board of Directors or a majority thereof; and any director of this Corporation who is also a director or officer of such other corporation or who is so interested may be counted indeterming the existence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors of this Corporation, which shall authorize any such contract or transaction, and may vote thereat to authorize any such contract or transaction, with like force and effect as is she/he were not such director or officer of such other
