Dear Judge Watson:

Kindly recall that this matter is scheduled for a telephonic hearing before Your Honor on August 19, 2015. I am in receipt of the Complainant, Laura Sunstein Murphy's correspondence dated July 14, 2015, requesting an extension to respond to PECO's Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings because she is recovering from surgery. PECO has no objection to a two week extension - no later than August 5, 2015, for the Complainant to respond to PECO's Motion.

This matter arises from a formal complaint filed by Ms. Murphy requesting to "opt out" of Smart Meter installation because of health and safety concerns. On July 2, 2015, PECO filed a Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings, arguing that Ms. Murphy's formal complaint should be dismissed based on Act 129 of 2008 and a progeny of Public Utility Commission ("PUC") cases that have determined that Act 129 - which mandated the implementation of an AMI plan - requires the installation of AMI meters. Moreover, neither Act 129 nor the PUC's implementing orders provide customers with an option to "opt out" of AMI meter installation.


Further, it has already been decided that PECO customers cannot "opt out" of meter installation for health reasons. See e.g., Renney Thomas v. PECO Energy, C-2012-2336225 (Final Order entered, Dec. 31, 2013); Theresa Gavin v. PECO Energy, C-2012-2325258 (Final Order entered, Jan. 24, 2013). This conclusion was reconfirmed recently in Administrative Law Judge Joel Cheskis' determination that PECO "is required by law to install AMI meters throughout its service territory." Mary Paul v. PECO Energy, C-2015-2475355 (Initial Decision issued July 1, 2015).

The pleadings in this case have now closed. PECO has no objection to a two week extension for the Complainant to respond to the Motion but would object to any additional time delay.

My husband is able to send this request to you from the Villanova Law School on my behalf as have no fax machine at home.


Thank you very much for your consideration.




