

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

Joseph P. Riley & Sons Moving Co., Inc., has filed Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 3 on June 12, 2003 and proposes a total increase in revenues of \$54,066 (interstate \$13,907, intrastate hourly \$30,709 and new accessorial services \$9,450) to cover increased operating expenses.

Carrier proposes to increase its hourly 3 men and vehicle normal complement charge by 9.8%. Carrier currently charges \$82.00 per hour and proposes an increase to \$90.00 per hour. The carrier also proposes to offer new accessorial services such as grandfather clock and lamp cartons, mattress bags, larger cubic boxes, bubble wrap and crates. The carrier projects from prior requests that the additional services will produce new assessorial services revenue of \$9,450.

Carrier's total household goods revenue is \$700,240, which is composed of interstate revenue of \$278,139 and intrastate revenue of \$422,101 (the revenue effected by this proposal is \$313,357).

Carrier requests that tariff freight Pa. PUC No. 3 becomes effective September 22, 2003. The current rates have been in effect since November 30, 2000. The carrier proposed an increase in hourly charges of \$30,709 and new accessorial services of \$9,450.

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Carrier submitted detailed financial records and other supporting data in support of its request. Carrier has calculated that the increase will produce additional PUC revenues of 40,159 ($313,359 \times 9.8\% = 30,709$) and new accessorial services of 9,450.

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COMPANY CLAIMED ADJUSTMENTS TO OPERATING EXPENSES

Maintenance expense – will increase by \$1,197 or 2% due to increased heating and air-conditioning expense of \$549, and the purchase expense of \$648 for thirty additional (30) dollies to assist in moving furniture.

<u>Transportation expense</u> – will increase by \$27,541 or 7.8%. Carrier employs seven drivers, ten (10) full time helpers and two (2) summer helpers. Carrier has increased the drivers hourly wage by \$1.00 and helpers hourly wage by \$.50. It guarantees all full time workers a forty (40) hour week including the slow periods of the year (winter months). Employees will receive one week vacation and overtime at the rate of time and a quarter.

<u>Terminal expense</u> – will increase by \$6,656 or 72.6% for the price of a new business computer purchased this year.

<u>Depreciation expense</u> – will increase by \$5,140 or 22.1% for equipment purchased this year.

<u>Insurance expense</u> – will decrease by (\$12,761) or 12.2% due to carrier combining policies with a new broker.

Administrative – will increase by \$3,900 or 2.2% for a \$75.00 weekly salary increase for the office manager ($$75.00 \times 52$ weeks = $3,900$).

ANALYSIS

Carrier proposes a total \$40,159 (intrastate hourly \$30,709 and new accessorial services \$9,450) increase in PUC revenue to cover increased expenses of \$31,673.

In order to generate this revenue increase, Carrier proposes to increase its 3 men and vehicle normal complement charge of \$82.00 per hour to \$90.00 per hour. The carrier also proposes to offer new accessorial services such as grandfather clock and lamp cartons, mattress bags, larger cubic boxes, bubble wrap and crates. We conclude that the data compiled and submitted by the carrier supports this increase.

Staff review of Commission records reveals that Eric Wright Enterprise, Inc., at A-00113409, Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 3, effective April 23, 2001, is charging \$90.00 per hour. C. James Link t/a Walls Delaware Valley Moving & Storage/Havertown/Westtown Moving & Hauling, at A-00106821, 4th Revised Page to Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 54, effective September 30, 2002, is charging \$95.00 per hour.

CONCLUSION

We have determined that the above financial justification supports the proposed PUC revenue increase of \$40,159. The carrier avers that operating ratio will be sufficient to provide safe, dependable and continuous service to the public: THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. That Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 3 be approved to become effective September 22, 2003.
- 2. That a copy of this order be served upon the carrier.
