

AND NOW comes Respondent, Duquesne Light Company, by and through its attorneys, Tucker Arensberg, P.C., and files this Motion for Continuance of Hearing in accordance with Commission regulation 52 Pa. Code § 1.15 (b).


1. The above-captioned Formal Complaint was filed on or about July 1, 2015, and has recently been scheduled for an Initial Telephonic Hearing on Thursday, September 24, 2015, at 10:00 a.m.
2. Counsel for Duquesne Light has a scheduling conflict as he is also counsel in a trial in the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas that begins on September 21, 2015, and will likely proceed up to and through this matter's currently scheduled hearing date of September 24. Accordingly, counsel for Duquesne Light respectfully requests a two-week continuance of the hearing in this matter.
3. Respondent spoke with Complainant via telephone on September 9, 2015, to discuss this continuance request. Complainant consented to the requested two week extension in this Motion.

4. Additionally, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.103(c), Complainant would ordinarily have 20 days to answer or oppose this Motion. Since the currently scheduled hearing date will pass before the time set forth in that provision will expire, Respondent also requests that the time period be shortened to five days. Complainant consented to this request during the Parties' discussion referenced in the preceding paragraph.

WHEREFORE, Respondent, Duquesne Light Company, respectfully requests: (1) a two week continuance of the currently scheduled hearing date; and (2) that the time in which a response to this Motion must be filed be shortened from twenty to five days.


