Application of the County of Lebanon Transit Authority for approval of the suspension of a series of crossings involving the Cornwall Industrial Track of Consolidated Rail Corporation located in the City of Lebanon, Lebanon County.

To Whom It May Concern:

The subject application was filed with the Commission on December 6, 1996. The proceeding was consolidated with several Complaints and another Application, all involving the same Cornwall Industrial Track, and set for a hearing before a Commission Administrative Law Judge. During the pendency of the proceeding, Consolidated Rail Corporation transferred the subject line of track to R. J. Corman Railroad Company (R. J. Corman). An order adopted August 27, 1998 directed R. J. Corman to perform the work necessary to suspend the crossings on said track and noted that upon completion of said work the proceeding shall be marked closed. R. J. Corman was directed to apply to the Commission to either reactivate the Cornwall Industrial Track or file to abolish the involved crossings by a stipulated date.


On April 12, 2001, R. J. Corman filed an application with the Commission to abolish the involved crossings along the subject line. The application is docketed at A-00117750. R. J. Corman states that the crossings have been suspended and they are seeking approval for the abolition of the subject crossings at this time.

After careful review of the facts of this matter, and since the crossings suspended in accordance with the proceeding have been properly suspended and will now be abolished under Docket A-00117750, the Commission finds that this proceeding can be closed.

The Commission issues this Secretarial Letter in accordance with Section 2702 of the Public Utility Code and finds that the record in this proceeding be "CLOSED."

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code §5.44, file a petition with the Commission within ten (10) days of the date of this letter.
