Dear Mr. Secretary:

Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. (the "Company") plans to file a general wastewater rate increase based upon a historic test year ended December 31, 2006, and a future test year ending December 31, 2007. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §53.52(b)(2), the rate increase would have to be filed on or before April 30, 2006.

The Company seeks a waiver of 52 Pa. Code §53.52(b)(2) to enable it to submit an Operating Income Statement and other data for the 12-months ended December 31, 2006, in support of a general wastewater rate increase to be made on or before September 30, 2007.

The Company prepares its financial statements on a calendar year basis and the waiver requested is necessary to allow the Company to use its calendar year statements. A mid-year historic test year cut-off, while possible, would result in the incurrence of additional time and expense which the Company submits would neither be in the public interest nor necessary since the Company's rate claims will be based on future test year 2007 projections.

The Company requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, waive the requirements of 52 Pa. Code §53.52(b)(2) and allow the Company to submit an Operating Income Statement and other data based upon the 12-months ended December 31, 2006, for a general wastewater rate filing to be made on or before September 30, 2007.

CHANGES MADE BY THIS TARIFF

Supplement No.3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4, increases rates by approximately 27.1% for all Customers at Premises where water service is metered and for Flat Rate Customers at Premises where water service is not metered.

Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 institutes a Return Check Charge.

Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 (a) replaces the Definitions previously set forth in Sections 1 and 3.12 with Definitions contained in the Commission's Sample Wastewater Tariff and combines all Definitions into Section 1 of this Tariff; (b) adds provisions for Wastewater Control Regulations and Water Use Standards; and (c) makes other nonsubstantive changes to make Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 consistent with the Commission's current Regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Definitions

Wherever used in this tariff, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall have the meanings hereinafter set forth:

Annual Line Extension Cost: The sum of a Company's additional annual operating and maintenance costs, debt costs and depreciation charges associated with the construction, operation and maintenance of a line extension.

Annual Revenue (for line extension purposes): The Company's expected additional annual revenue from a line extension based on the Company's currently effective tariff rates and on the average annual usage of customers similar in nature and size to the bona fide service applicant.

Applicant: A person, association, partnership, corporation, municipality, authority, state or federal governmental agency or other entity who applies to become a customer of the Company in accordance with this tariff.

Bona Fide Service Applicant (for line extension purposes): A person or entity applying for wastewater service to an existing or proposed structure within the Company's certificated service territory for which a valid occupancy or building permit has been issued if the structure is either a primary residence of the applicant or a place of business. An applicant shall not be deemed a bona fide service applicant if:

- (a) applicant is requesting wastewater service to a building lot, subdivision or a secondary residence;
- (b) the request for service is part of a plan for the development of a residential dwelling or subdivision; or
- (c) the applicant is requesting special utility service.

Commission: The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

Company: Total Environmental Solutions, Inc., its successors and assigns, and its duly authorized officers, agents and employees, acting within the scope of their authority and employment.

Company Service Line: The wastewater line from the collection facilities of the Company which connects to the customer service line at the hypothetical or actual curb line or the actual property line.

Customer: A person or entity who is an owner or occupant and who contracts with the Company for or who takes or receives wastewater collection, treatment and/or disposal service without a contract.

Customer Service Line: The wastewater line extending from the end of the Company service line or connection to the point of connection at the customer's premise.

Debt Costs: The Company's additional annual cost of debt associated with financing a line extension investment based on the current debt ratio and weighted long-term debt cost rate for the Company or that of a comparable jurisdictional wastewater utility.

Depreciation Charges: The Company's additional annual depreciation charges associated with a specific line extension investment to be made based on the current depreciation accrual rates for that Company or that of a comparable jurisdictional wastewater utility.

Dwelling Unit: A structure or dwelling intended to be occupied as a whole by one family.

Garbage: The solid wastes from domestic cooking and dispensing of food, and from the handling and storage of produce.

Grinder pump: Any mechanical or powered device used to grind, macerate or fluidize garbage so that it can be discharged into the wastewater system of the Company.

Line extension (for line extension purposes): An addition to the Company's main line which is necessary to serve the premises of a customer.

Main: The Company's pipe, excluding service connections, located in a public highway, street, alley or private right-of-way which pipe is used in transporting wastewater.

Meter: Any device supplied for the purpose of measuring water or wastewater consumption.

Nonresidential Service: Wastewater service supplied to a commercial or industrial building, including a hotel or motel, or to a master-metered trailer park or multi-tenant apartment building, or to any customer who purchases wastewater service from the Company for the purpose of resale.

Operating and Maintenance Costs (for line extension purposes): The company's average annual operating and maintenance costs associated with serving an additional customer, including customer accounting, billing, collections, water purchased, power purchased, chemicals, and other variable costs based on the current total Company level of such costs, as well as costs particular to the specific needs of that customer, such as line flushing.

Public Utility: Persons or corporations owning or operating equipment or facilities in this Commonwealth for water, electric or wastewater collection, treatment, or disposal for the public for compensation.

Residential Service: Wastewater service supplied to an individual single-family residential dwelling unit.

Regulatory Agency: Agencies, including but not limited to the Commission, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC), which have authority over the operations of and/or discharges into and/or from the Company's treatment facilities.

Sanitary Sewer: A sewer which carries sanitary wastewater and excludes storm, surface and ground water.

Special Utility Service: Residential or business service which exceeds that required for ordinary residential purposes. See additional clarification in Section H, Part 2(e) of this tariff.

Storm Sewer: A sewer which receives discharges from stormwater building sewers and/or carries off surface, subsurface, or stormwater from the buildings, ground, streets, or other areas, including street wash.

Suspended Solids: Solids that either float on the surface of, or are in suspension in water, wastewater, or other liquids, and which are largely removable by filtration.

Tariff: All of the service rates, rules and regulations issued by the Company, together with any supplements or revisions thereto, officially approved by the Commission and contained in this document.

Toxic Substances: Any substances where gaseous, liquid or solid waste which, when discharged to a public sewer in sufficient quantities, will be detrimental to any biological wastewater treatment process, constitute a hazard to human beings or animals, inhibit aquatic life, or create a hazard to recreation in receiving waters of the effluent from a wastewater treatment plant, or as defined pursuant to PL 92-500 (Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972) or its amendments.

Wastes: Any liquid, gaseous, or solid substances or combination thereof which are discarded, leached, or spilled substances or combination thereof including sanitary wastewater but excluding storm-water.

Wastewater: A combination of the water-carried wastes from residences, together with such ground surface and storm water as may be present in sanitary sewers.

2. Application for Service

Application Required for Sewer Service

2.1 The Company may require that an application for sewer service be executed by each Customer or his duly authorized agent upon a form provided therefore by the Company and be signed by the Customer or his duly authorized agent. The Company may require a new application for service where there is any change in the person or in the nature of use of the Premises from that set forth in a prior application. Any such application for service shall be part of the contract between the Customer and the Company.

Pressurized System

3.7 Portions of the Company's sewer system are pressurized. The Company, at its sole discretion, will determine whether Premises shall be served by a gravity sewer or a pressurized sewer.

3.8 Where Premises are served by a pressurized sewer, the Company shall furnish, install and maintain, at the Company's expense, a grinder pump, tank, check valve and related equipment.

3.9 The grinder pump, tank and related equipment shall be located on the Premises. The choice of location of the grinder pump and tank shall be made by the Company, at its sole discretion, among the following locations: in a basement, crawl space, garage or buried in the yard of the Premises. Thereafter, such equipment may be relocated only by the Company and only at the sole expense of the Customer, which shall be paid in advance.

3.10 The Customer shall provide electrical power necessary to operate the grinder pump.

Prohibited Flow-Sanitary Sewage

3.11 No material, other than sanitary sewage, shall be permitted to enter the Company Service Line, and no connection, fixture, device, opening or condition shall be allowed to exist which would permit any material, other than sanitary sewage, to enter the sewerage facilities of the Company.

3.A Wastewater Control Regulations

1. (a) No storm water from pavements, area ways, roof runoff water, foundation drains, subsurface drains, water from springs, cooling water, basement sump pumps, unpolluted industrial or commercial process water or other sources shall be admitted to the Company mains.

(b) The discharge of garbage to the sewer system is expressly prohibited. Properly shredded garbage may be discharged into the sewer system when expressly authorized by the Company.

(c) This does not exclude or preclude pump-out of manholes by a utility company or of manholes on plant premises which should be kept in dry or reasonably dry condition.

Discharges

1. No person shall cause or permit to be discharged into the Company's wastewater system any toxic substances or wastes having any of the following characteristics:

(a) Wastes containing any gasoline, naphtha, fuel, oil or other liquids, solids or gases which by reason of their nature or quality may cause fire or explosion or be in any other way injurious to persons, the structures of the wastewater system or its operation.

(b) Wastes having a temperature in excess of 120 degrees F. or less than 20 degrees F.

(c) Washes having a pH lower than 6.0 or higher than 9.0 having any corrosive property capable of causing damage or hazards to structures, equipment or personnel of the wastewater system.

(d) Wastes containing any noxious or malodorous gas or substance that either singly or by interaction with sewage or other wastes is likely in the opinion of the Company to create a public nuisance or hazard to life or prevent entry to sewers for their maintenance and repair.

(e) Wastes containing ashes, cinders, sand, mud, straw, shavings, metal, glass, rags, feathers, tar, plastics, wood, hair, chemical or paint residues, greases, paunch, manure, cotton, wool, plastic or other fibers, lime, slurry or any other solid or viscous material of such character or in such quantity as in the opinion of the Company may cause an obstruction to the flow in sewers or otherwise interfere with the proper operation of the sewer system.

(f) Wastes containing insoluble, non-flocculent substances having a specific gravity in excess of 2.65.

(g) Wastes containing soluble substances in such concentrations as to cause the specific gravity to be greater than 1.1.

(h) Wastes containing any of the following substances in concentrations exceeding those shown in the following table as measured by an acceptable method:

(i) Wastes containing other matter detrimental to the operation of a sewage treatment plant or sanitary sewers causing erosion, corrosion or deterioration in sewers, equipment and structures of a sanitary or sewage treatment plant.

(j) Wastes containing more than 100 mg/l by weight of tar, fat, oil or grease.

(k) Wastes containing more than 10 mg/l of any of the following gases, hydrogen sulfide, sulfur dioxide, nitrous oxide, or any of the halogens.

(l) Wastes containing a toxic or poisonous substance, in a sufficient quantity to injure or interfere with any sewage treatment process, constitute a hazard to humans or animals or create any hazard in the sewer system operation and such toxic wastes shall include, but not be limited to wastes containing cyanide, chromium and/or copper ions.

(m) Any waste containing toxic substance in quantities sufficient to interfere with the biochemical processes of the sewage treatment works or that will pass through the sewage treatment works and exceed the state and/or federal requirements in respect thereof.

(n) Any waste containing radioactive isotopes.

Sampling and Analysis:

1. All measurements, tests and analyses of the characteristics of waters and wastes to which reference is made in these rules may be determined in accordance with the latest edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" as prepared, approved and published jointly by the American Public Health Association, the American Water Works Association, and/or the Water Pollution Control Federation or other reference sources specified by regulatory agency requirements, such as "Methods for Chemical Analysis of Water and Wastes," U.S.E.P.A. 1974 or its subsequent updated version.

2. All measurements, test, inspections and analyses deemed by the Company to be necessary under this Section or any other part of the Rules and Regulations of the Company, shall be done by the Company or its agents, employees or contractors. If the measurements, test, inspections and/or analyses determine that a customer has created a situation which is in violation of any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation then the customer shall be required to pay all costs incurred in order to measure, test, inspect, analyze and remedy the situation. Otherwise, the costs involved are to be born by the Company. Costs assessed against a Customer pursuant to this Section shall be in addition to any other fees charged by the Company. The costs shall be payable within 30 days of presentation of a bill for such costs by the Company to the Customer(s).

3. Where the Company deems it advisable, it may require any person discharging wastes to install and maintain, at his or her own expense, in a manner approved by the Company or its representative, a suitable device to continuously measure and record the pH of the wastes so discharged.

Disposal of Wastes From Septic Tanks and Cesspools

No person shall dispose of wastes from septic tanks, cesspools, or other such sources of sanitary sewage to the Company's wastewater system, except as designated by the Company.

Penalties

The Company reserves the right to deny wastewater service for violation of any provision of these regulations, subject to PUC rules and regulations.

Damage to System and Indemnification

In the event of any damage to the Company's wastewater system caused by a customer, such damage shall be immediately reported to the Company and said customer shall reimburse the Company for the costs of such repairs.

RESERVED FOR FUTURE USE

3.B. Main Extensions

1. Whenever a developer, owner or occupant of a property within the service territory of the Company requests the Company to extend service to such property, the Company will extend service under the following conditions:

Requests by Bona Fide Service Applicant: Each Company shall file with the Commission, as part of its tariff, a rule setting forth the conditions under which facilities will be extended to supply service to an applicant within its service area. Upon request by a bona fide service applicant, a utility shall construct line extensions within its franchised territory consistent with the following directives:

- (a) Line extensions to bona fide service applicants shall be funded without customer advance where the annual revenue from the line extension will equal or exceed the Company's annual line extension costs.
- (b) If the annual revenue for the line extension will not equal or exceed the Company's annual line extension costs, a bona fide service applicant may be required to provide a customer advance to the utility's cost of construction for the line extension. The utility's investment for the line extension shall be the portion of the total

- (d) Special Utility Service shall mean residential or business service which exceeds that required for ordinary residential purposes. Rule 1, parts (a) through (c) of this Section 3.13 does not apply to special utility service. By way of illustration and not limitation, special utility service shall include: the installation of facilities such as oversized mains, booster pumps and storage tanks as necessary to provide adequate flows or to meet specific pressure criteria, or service to large water consuming commercial and industrial facilities. An otherwise bona fide applicant requesting service which includes a “special utility service” component is entitled to Bona Fide applicant status, including the corresponding Company contribution toward the costs of the line extension which do not meet the special utility service criteria.
3. Requirement for Extension Deposit Agreement: Where extension of facilities is not fully funded by the Company pursuant to Rule 1 of this Section, the execution by the applicant of an Extension Deposit Agreement for customer contribution or advance shall be a condition extending the facilities. Upon notice that the Company is prepared and able to go forward with the work, the applicant will deposit with the Company the amount specified in the Extension Deposit Agreement.
4. Size of Line: The Company shall have the exclusive right to determine the type and size of lines to be installed and the other facilities required to render adequate service. However, where the Company decides to install a pipe larger than necessary to render extension of adequate service to the applicant, estimated or actual cost figures in the Extension Deposit Agreement shall include only the material and installation cost for a pipe the size of which is necessary to provide adequate service to the applicant. Any incremental costs of a larger pipe will be the responsibility of the Company. All estimated or actual cost figures referred to in the Extension Deposit Agreement shall include a reasonable allowance for overhead costs and taxes as appropriate.
5. Length of Extension: In determining the necessary length of an extension, the terminal point of such extension shall be at that point in the curb line, which is equidistant from the side property lines of the last lot for which water service is requested. A Company Service Connection will be provided only for customer service lines that extend at right angles from the curb line in a straight line to the premises to be served.

Back-Filling Trench – Customer Service Line

- 4.4 Trenches shall be back-filled by placing loose, fine earth or limestone screenings, free from stones, brick-bats or large clods, under the sides and around the pipe to a distance of one foot from the bottom of the trench, thoroughly tamped in six inch layers. From this point to top of trench, the earth may be tamped by hand or settled by flushing. NO trench shall be back-filled until inspected and approved by the Company.

Main Trap and Vent – Customer Service Line

- 4.5 There shall be a main or intercepting trap on each Customer Service Line. The trap shall be located, wherever possible, within the cellar of the building and shall consist of a double-plugged, cast-iron trap, a cast-iron service tee with a riser extending upward and out through the wall and terminating in the outside air with a suitable grated vent. Where no cellar exists, or the foregoing construction is impossible, a main or intercepting trap may, if approved by the Company, be placed between the Company Service Line and the Premises, and in such case, the trap shall be vented by a suitable sidewalk vent, or cowl type vent. The vent must be located to prevent surface water or floods from entering the sewer system.

Standard of Quality of Construction – Customer-Owned Facilities

- 4.6 All construction, reconstruction and alterations of facilities owned by the Customer shall be done and installed in a competent, workmanlike manner in accordance with recognized standards of the plumbing trade. The Company may require reconstruction of any work done improperly.

Water Use Standards for Certain Plumbing Fixtures

4.7 This rule establishes maximum water use criteria for certain plumbing fixtures installed in all new construction or renovation. Such standards have been implemented to achieve maximum efficiency of water use which the Commission has determined is technologically feasible and economically justified.

- (a) Maximum permitted water usage levels shall be as follows:

Plumbing Fixture	Maximum Water Use
Water Closets	1.6 gallons/flush
Urinals	1.5 gallons/flush

(b) The Company may exempt particular customers, or classes of customers, when it is determined that the water use standards for plumbing fixtures listed above are unreasonable, cannot be accommodated by existing technology or are otherwise inappropriate.

5. Apartment Complexes

5.1 Sanitary sewer service, after application therefore by the Customer, will be supplied to an apartment complex consisting of two or more buildings containing apartment dwelling units together with any related facilities requiring sanitary sewer service (collectively called the “apartment complex”), where all the following conditions are satisfied:

- a. There shall be only one Customer contracting for sanitary sewer service to the entire apartment complex who shall be the owner of the entire apartment complex.

7. Metered Service

Availability

- 7.1 Where a Customer receives metered water service, charges for sanitary sewer service shall be determined based upon metered usage of water in accordance with Schedule "A".

Registration Conclusive

- 7.2 The quantity of water recorded by the water meter or the Company's estimate, in accordance with the Company's regular procedures, shall be conclusive on both the Customer and the Company, except when the meter has been found to be registering inaccurately or has ceased to register. In such case, an estimated quantity may be determined on the basis of meter registration or such regular estimating procedures during similar preceding periods. No abatement of sewer charges will be made for leaks or for water wasted by damaged or defective fixtures, except as described in 52 Pa. Code Section 56.12(6).

Metering of Former Flat-Rate Service

- 7.3 Where a Customer previously has received flat-rate water service and where, thereafter, water service to the Customer is metered, sewer service will be based upon metered usage of water in accordance with Schedule "A".

Separate Meters for Centers, Apartments and Condominiums

- 7.4 Where a separate water meter has been installed for each individual unit in a commercial or industrial center or for each dwelling or other unit in an apartment building or condominium building or apartment complex or condominium complex, sewer service charges will be calculated based upon each meter and each meter reading.

8. Responsibility for Service

Limitation of Liability of Company

- 8.1 Except for damage or injury resulting solely from the negligence of the Company or of the Company's employees or agents acting within the scope of their authority, the Company shall not be liable for damage to or within any Premises resulting from leakage or stoppage in the sewer system or for any damage or inconvenience to the Customer or for any claim against the Company for other cause.

If, for any reason, the Company is found liable for any damage, injury or loss to any person or property, the liability of the Company shall be limited to the lesser of (1) its liability under generally applicable legal principles or (2) one year's charges, rates and fees for sewer service to the Customer.

Interruption of Service for Repairs or Due to Emergency

- 8.2 If the Company deems it to be necessary, the Company shall have the right to interrupt sewer service temporarily in order to make necessary repairs, connections, etc.; the Company shall use reasonable and practicable measures to notify the Customer of such interruption of service as set forth in 52 Pa. Code Section 56.71.

9. Discontinuance of Service

By Customer

- 9.1 All Customers desiring discontinuance of sewer service shall give written notice at the office of the Company. In addition, where applicable, a Customer who is not a resident of the Premises where service is to be terminated shall comply with the requirements of 52 Pa. Code Section 56.72(2). A Customer may not request service discontinuance to avoid accrual and payment of ready-to-serve or availability charges.

By Company

- 9.2 Service to any Customer may be terminated for any reason specifically set forth in the rules and regulations of the Public Utility Commission.

Service may be terminated, pursuant to the Commission's regulations, if a customer fails to arrange for an inspection of facilities within 14 days of the mailing by the Company of a request to inspect facilities. Such failure also may result in termination of water service by Total Environmental Solutions, Inc.

Service also may be terminated, pursuant to the Commission's regulations, if the customer connects a sump pump, french drain or other facility that places storm water into the system and the customer fails to disconnect such facility from the system and arrange for re-inspection by the Company within 14 days following an inspection by the Company. Such failure also may result in termination of water service by Total Environmental Solutions, Inc.

2. Deposits may be required from Customers taking service for a period of less than thirty (30) days in an amount equal to the estimated gross bill for such temporary period. Deposits may be required from all Customers provided that, in no instance, will deposits be required of residential customers in excess of the estimated gross bill for any single billing period plus one month (the maximum period not to exceed four months) with a minimum of \$5.00.
3. Interest on deposits made by residential Customers will be paid by the Company in accordance with regulations of the Public Utility Commission at 52 Pa. Code Section 56.57.

In accordance with your instructions, we have prepared the following report containing responses to Tariff Regulations of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission related to the proposed Supplement No.3 to Tariff Wastewater - Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 of Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. - Treasure Lake Sewer Division, to be issued October 31, 2007.

Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Water - Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 increases the existing rate schedule. The proposed rate schedule increases existing revenue requirements by approximately 29.5%. The Supporting Data for the operating revenues and expenses were obtained from the operating books and records of the company. The adjustments to the operating revenues and expenses as of December 31, 2006 and December 31, 2007 were made to normalize or amortize the operating expenses for the historic and future test year periods.

The proposed increase in annual operating revenues will produce an additional \$286,615. The proposed increase will provide a pro forma return of \$295,032 or approximately 9.60% on the measures of value of Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. - Treasure Lake Sewer Division as of December 31, 2007.

The above conclusions are supported by detailed schedules contained in this report.

Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. is filing Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater - Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 on October 31, 2007 with a requested effective date of December 30, 2007 for the purpose of increasing sewer service revenue by \$286,615 per annum, based upon future test year operations ended December 31, 2007.

For the twelve months ended December 31, 2006 and December 31, 2007, the future test year period in this filing, utility operations produced a net operating income (loss) as follows:

The current rate filing is necessary to realize a reasonable rate of return on the company's fixed capital investment and to recover increased operating expenses. As a result of the customer audit and the customer bill frequency analysis, adjustments were required to the book level of operating revenue as set forth in response to Tariff Regulation b(4), Sheet No. 1a to reflect the removal of the PennnVest surcharge revenues and the proper level of annual revenue based upon the number of customers gained or lost during the test year periods at December 31, 2006 and December 31, 2007. These adjustments result in an overall increase of (\$163,354) in operating revenue producing a going-level operating revenue at present rates of \$971,777.

Operating Expenses

During 2007, the Company anticipates completing construction projects that total \$113,862. The detail for these amounts are contained in Supporting Schedule No. 5.

The original cost of the utility plant in service at December 31, 2007 is \$7,452,239 and is contained in Supporting Schedule No. 6 by fixed capital plant account.

Accrued Depreciation

The calculations of annual and accrued depreciation in this report are based upon the Straight Line/Average Remaining Life Method and applied to the original costs at December 31, 2006 and December 31, 2007. The accrued depreciation at December 31, 2006 (adjusted) and December 31, 2007 amounted to \$3,085,858 and \$3,225,441.

Annual Depreciation Expense

The annual depreciation expense of \$102,130 shown on Supporting Schedule No. 6, Section 2, is based upon the depreciable original cost base at December 31, 2007 excluding the contributions in aid of construction. The book annual depreciation expense as of December 31, 2006 amounted to \$111,026. A going-level adjustment of (\$8,896) to the booked operating expenses [Tariff Regulation c(1) - Sheet 1a] at December 31, 2007 was made to reflect the proper level of annual depreciation expense for the future test year.

Supplement No.3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4, increases rates by approximately 27.1% for all Customers at Premises where water service is metered and for Flat Rate Customers at Premises where water service is not metered.

Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 institutes a Return Check Charge.

Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 (a) replaces the Definitions previously set forth in Sections 1 and 3.12 with Definitions contained in the Commission’s Sample Wastewater Tariff and combines all Definitions into Section 1 of this Tariff; (b) adds provisions for Wastewater Control Regulations and Water Use Standards; and (c) makes other nonsubstantive changes to make Tariff Wastewater – Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 consistent with the Commission’s current Regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Definitions

Wherever used in this tariff, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall have the meanings hereinafter set forth:

Annual Line Extension Cost: The sum of a Company's additional annual operating and maintenance costs, debt costs and depreciation charges associated with the construction, operation and maintenance of a line extension.

Annual Revenue (for line extension purposes): The Company's expected additional annual revenue from a line extension based on the Company's currently effective tariff rates and on the average annual usage of customers similar in nature and size to the bona fide service applicant.

Applicant: A person, association, partnership, corporation, municipality, authority, state or federal governmental agency or other entity who applies to become a customer of the Company in accordance with this tariff.

Bona Fide Service Applicant (for line extension purposes): A person or entity applying for wastewater service to an existing or proposed structure within the Company's certificated service territory for which a valid occupancy or building permit has been issued if the structure is either a primary residence of the applicant or a place of business. An applicant shall not be deemed a bona fide service applicant if:

- (a) applicant is requesting wastewater service to a building lot, subdivision or a secondary residence;
- (b) the request for service is part of a plan for the development of a residential dwelling or subdivision; or
- (c) the applicant is requesting special utility service.

Commission: The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

Company: Total Environmental Solutions, Inc., its successors and assigns, and its duly authorized officers, agents and employees, acting within the scope of their authority and employment.

Company Service Line: The wastewater line from the collection facilities of the Company which connects to the customer service line at the hypothetical or actual curb line or the actual property line.

Customer: A person or entity who is an owner or occupant and who contracts with the Company for or who takes or receives wastewater collection, treatment and/or disposal service without a contract.

Customer Service Line: The wastewater line extending from the end of the Company service line or connection to the point of connection at the customer's premise.

Debt Costs: The Company's additional annual cost of debt associated with financing a line extension investment based on the current debt ratio and weighted long-term debt cost rate for the Company or that of a comparable jurisdictional wastewater utility.

Depreciation Charges: The Company's additional annual depreciation charges associated with a specific line extension investment to be made based on the current depreciation accrual rates for that Company or that of a comparable jurisdictional wastewater utility.

Dwelling Unit: A structure or dwelling intended to be occupied as a whole by one family.

Garbage: The solid wastes from domestic cooking and dispensing of food, and from the handling and storage of produce.

Grinder pump: Any mechanical or powered device used to grind, macerate or fluidize garbage so that it can be discharged into the wastewater system of the Company.

Line extension (for line extension purposes): An addition to the Company's main line which is necessary to serve the premises of a customer.

Main: The Company's pipe, excluding service connections, located in a public highway, street, alley or private right-of-way which pipe is used in transporting wastewater.

Meter: Any device supplied for the purpose of measuring water or wastewater consumption.

Nonresidential Service: Wastewater service supplied to a commercial or industrial building, including a hotel or motel, or to a master-metered trailer park or multi-tenant apartment building, or to any customer who purchases wastewater service from the Company for the purpose of resale.

Operating and Maintenance Costs (for line extension purposes): The company's average annual operating and maintenance costs associated with serving an additional customer, including customer accounting, billing, collections, water purchased, power purchased, chemicals, and other variable costs based on the current total Company level of such costs, as well as costs particular to the specific needs of that customer, such as line flushing.

Public Utility: Persons or corporations owning or operating equipment or facilities in this Commonwealth for water, electric or wastewater collection, treatment, or disposal for the public for compensation.

Residential Service: Wastewater service supplied to an individual single-family residential dwelling unit.

Regulatory Agency: Agencies, including but not limited to the Commission, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC), which have authority over the operations of and/or discharges into and/or from the Company's treatment facilities.

Sanitary Sewer: A sewer which carries sanitary wastewater and excludes storm, surface and ground water.

Special Utility Service: Residential or business service which exceeds that required for ordinary residential purposes. See additional clarification in Section H, Part 2(e) of this tariff.

Storm Sewer: A sewer which receives discharges from stormwater building sewers and/or carries off surface, subsurface, or stormwater from the buildings, ground, streets, or other areas, including street wash.

Suspended Solids: Solids that either float on the surface of, or are in suspension in water, wastewater, or other liquids, and which are largely removable by filtration.

Tariff: All of the service rates, rules and regulations issued by the Company, together with any supplements or revisions thereto, officially approved by the Commission and contained in this document.

Toxic Substances: Any substances where gaseous, liquid or solid waste which, when discharged to a public sewer in sufficient quantities, will be detrimental to any biological wastewater treatment process, constitute a hazard to human beings or animals, inhibit aquatic life, or create a hazard to recreation in receiving waters of the effluent from a wastewater treatment plant, or as defined pursuant to PL 92-500 (Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972) or its amendments.

Wastes: Any liquid, gaseous, or solid substances or combination thereof which are discarded, leached, or spilled substances or combination thereof including sanitary wastewater but excluding storm-water.

Wastewater: A combination of the water-carried wastes from residences, together with such ground surface and storm water as may be present in sanitary sewers.

2. Application for Service

Application Required for Sewer Service

2.1 The Company may require that an application for sewer service be executed by each Customer or his duly authorized agent upon a form provided therefore by the Company and be signed by the Customer or his duly authorized agent. The Company may require a new application for service where there is any change in the person or in the nature of use of the Premises from that set forth in a prior application. Any such application for service shall be part of the contract between the Customer and the Company.

Pressurized System

3.7 Portions of the Company's sewer system are pressurized. The Company, at its sole discretion, will determine whether Premises shall be served by a gravity sewer or a pressurized sewer.

3.8 Where Premises are served by a pressurized sewer, the Company shall furnish, install and maintain, at the Company's expense, a grinder pump, tank, check valve and related equipment.

3.9 The grinder pump, tank and related equipment shall be located on the Premises. The choice of location of the grinder pump and tank shall be made by the Company, at its sole discretion, among the following locations: in a basement, crawl space, garage or buried in the yard of the Premises. Thereafter, such equipment may be relocated only by the Company and only at the sole expense of the Customer, which shall be paid in advance.

3.10 The Customer shall provide electrical power necessary to operate the grinder pump.

Prohibited Flow-Sanitary Sewage

3.11 No material, other than sanitary sewage, shall be permitted to enter the Company Service Line, and no connection, fixture, device, opening or condition shall be allowed to exist which would permit any material, other than sanitary sewage, to enter the sewerage facilities of the Company.

3.A Wastewater Control Regulations

1. (a) No storm water from pavements, area ways, roof runoff water, foundation drains, subsurface drains, water from springs, cooling water, basement sump pumps, unpolluted industrial or commercial process water or other sources shall be admitted to the Company mains.

(b) The discharge of garbage to the sewer system is expressly prohibited. Properly shredded garbage may be discharged into the sewer system when expressly authorized by the Company.

(c) This does not exclude or preclude pump-out of manholes by a utility company or of manholes on plant premises which should be kept in dry or reasonably dry condition.

Discharges

1. No person shall cause or permit to be discharged into the Company's wastewater system any toxic substances or wastes having any of the following characteristics:

(a) Wastes containing any gasoline, naphtha, fuel, oil or other liquids, solids or gases which by reason of their nature or quality may cause fire or explosion or be in any other way injurious to persons, the structures of the wastewater system or its operation.

(b) Wastes having a temperature in excess of 120 degrees F. or less than 20 degrees F.

(c) Washes having a pH lower than 6.0 or higher than 9.0 having any corrosive property capable of causing damage or hazards to structures, equipment or personnel of the wastewater system.

(d) Wastes containing any noxious or malodorous gas or substance that either singly or by interaction with sewage or other wastes is likely in the opinion of the Company to create a public nuisance or hazard to life or prevent entry to sewers for their maintenance and repair.

(e) Wastes containing ashes, cinders, sand, mud, straw, shavings, metal, glass, rags, feathers, tar, plastics, wood, hair, chemical or paint residues, greases, paunch, manure, cotton, wool, plastic or other fibers, lime, slurry or any other solid or viscous material of such character or in such quantity as in the opinion of the Company may cause an obstruction to the flow in sewers or otherwise interfere with the proper operation of the sewer system.

(f) Wastes containing insoluble, non-flocculent substances having a specific gravity in excess of 2.65.

(g) Wastes containing soluble substances in such concentrations as to cause the specific-gravity to be greater than 1.1.

(h) Wastes containing any of the following substances in concentrations exceeding those shown in the following table as measured by an acceptable method:

Phenolic Compounds, e.g., As C ₆ H ₅ OH	1.00 mg/l
Cyanides as CN	0.00 mg/l
Cyanates as CNO	0.00 mg/l

Trivalent Chromium as CR plus three	0.05 mg/l
Hexavalent Chromium as CR. plus six	0.05 mg/l
Nickel as Ni	0.05 mg/l
Copper as Cu	0.50 mg/l
Lead as Pb	0.50 mg/l
Zinc as Zn	0.50 mg/l
Mercury as Hg	0.00 mg/l

(i) Wastes containing other matter detrimental to the operation of a sewage treatment plant or sanitary sewers causing erosion, corrosion or deterioration in sewers, equipment and structures of a sanitary or sewage treatment plant.

(j) Wastes containing more than 100 mg/l by weight of tar, fat, oil or grease.

(k) Wastes containing more than 10 mg/l of any of the following gases, hydrogen sulfide, sulfur dioxide, nitrous oxide, or any of the halogens.

(l) Wastes containing a toxic or poisonous substance, in a sufficient quantity to injure or interfere with any sewage treatment process, constitute a hazard to humans or animals or create any hazard in the sewer system operation and such toxic wastes shall include, but not be limited to wastes containing cyanide, chromium and/or copper ions.

(m) Any waste containing toxic substance in quantities sufficient to interfere with the biochemical processes of the sewage treatment works or that will pass through the sewage treatment works and exceed the state and/or federal requirements in respect thereof.

(n) Any waste containing radioactive isotopes.

Sampling and Analysis:

1. All measurements, tests and analyses of the characteristics of waters and wastes to which reference is made in these rules may be determined in accordance with the latest edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" as prepared, approved and published jointly by the American Public Health Association, the American Water Works Association, and/or the Water Pollution Control Federation or other reference sources specified by regulatory agency requirements, such as "Methods for Chemical Analysis of Water and Wastes," U.S.E.P.A. 1974 or its subsequent updated version.

2. All measurements, test, inspections and analyses deemed by the Company to be necessary under this Section or any other part of the Rules and Regulations of the Company, shall be done by the Company or its agents, employees or contractors. If the measurements, test, inspections and/or analyses determine that a customer has created a situation which is in violation of any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation then the customer shall be required to pay all costs incurred in order to measure, test, inspect, analyze and remedy the situation. Otherwise, the costs involved are to be born by the Company. Costs assessed against a Customer pursuant to this Section shall be in addition to any other fees charged by the Company. The costs shall be payable within 30 days of presentation of a bill for such costs by the Company to the Customer(s).

3. Where the Company deems it advisable, it may require any person discharging wastes to install and maintain, at his or her own expense, in a manner approved by the Company or its representative, a suitable device to continuously measure and record the pH of the wastes so discharged.

Disposal of Wastes From Septic Tanks and Cesspools

No person shall dispose of wastes from septic tanks, cesspools, or other such sources of sanitary sewage to the Company's wastewater system, except as designated by the Company.

Penalties

The Company reserves the right to deny wastewater service for violation of any provision of these regulations, subject to PUC rules and regulations.

Damage to System and Indemnification

In the event of any damage to the Company's wastewater system caused by a customer, such damage shall be immediately reported to the Company and said customer shall reimburse the Company for the costs of such repairs.

RESERVED FOR FUTURE USE

3.B. Main Extensions

1. Whenever a developer, owner or occupant of a property within the service territory of the Company requests the Company to extend service to such property, the Company will extend service under the following conditions:

Requests by Bona Fide Service Applicant: Each Company shall file with the Commission, as part of its tariff, a rule setting forth the conditions under which facilities will be extended to supply service to an applicant within its service area. Upon request by a bona fide service applicant, a utility shall construct line extensions within its franchised territory consistent with the following directives:

- (a) Line extensions to bona fide service applicants shall be funded without customer advance where the annual revenue from the line extension will equal or exceed the Company's annual line extension costs.
- (b) If the annual revenue for the line extension will not equal or exceed the Company's annual line extension costs, a bona fide service applicant may be required to provide a customer advance to the utility's cost of construction for the line extension. The utility's investment for the line extension shall be the portion of the total

- (d) Special Utility Service shall mean residential or business service which exceeds that required for ordinary residential purposes. Rule 1, parts (a) through (c) of this Section 3.13 does not apply to special utility service. By way of illustration and not limitation, special utility service shall include: the installation of facilities such as oversized mains, booster pumps and storage tanks as necessary to provide adequate flows or to meet specific pressure criteria, or service to large water consuming commercial and industrial facilities. An otherwise bona fide applicant requesting service which includes a “special utility service” component is entitled to Bona Fide applicant status, including the corresponding Company contribution toward the costs of the line extension which do not meet the special utility service criteria.
3. Requirement for Extension Deposit Agreement: Where extension of facilities is not fully funded by the Company pursuant to Rule 1 of this Section, the execution by the applicant of an Extension Deposit Agreement for customer contribution or advance shall be a condition extending the facilities. Upon notice that the Company is prepared and able to go forward with the work, the applicant will deposit with the Company the amount specified in the Extension Deposit Agreement.
4. Size of Line: The Company shall have the exclusive right to determine the type and size of lines to be installed and the other facilities required to render adequate service. However, where the Company decides to install a pipe larger than necessary to render extension of adequate service to the applicant, estimated or actual cost figures in the Extension Deposit Agreement shall include only the material and installation cost for a pipe the size of which is necessary to provide adequate service to the applicant. Any incremental costs of a larger pipe will be the responsibility of the Company. All estimated or actual cost figures referred to in the Extension Deposit Agreement shall include a reasonable allowance for overhead costs and taxes as appropriate.
5. Length of Extension: In determining the necessary length of an extension, the terminal point of such extension shall be at that point in the curb line, which is equidistant from the side property lines of the last lot for which water service is requested. A Company Service Connection will be provided only for customer service lines that extend at right angles from the curb line in a straight line to the premises to be served.

Back-Filling Trench – Customer Service Line

- 4.4 Trenches shall be back-filled by placing loose, fine earth or limestone screenings, free from stones, brick-bats or large clods, under the sides and around the pipe to a distance of one foot from the bottom of the trench, thoroughly tamped in six inch layers. From this point to top of trench, the earth may be tamped by hand or settled by flushing. NO trench shall be back-filled until inspected and approved by the Company.

Main Trap and Vent – Customer Service Line

- 4.5 There shall be a main or intercepting trap on each Customer Service Line. The trap shall be located, wherever possible, within the cellar of the building and shall consist of a double-plugged, cast-iron trap, a cast-iron service tee with a riser extending upward and out through the wall and terminating in the outside air with a suitable grated vent. Where no cellar exists, or the foregoing construction is impossible, a main or intercepting trap may, if approved by the Company, be placed between the Company Service Line and the Premises, and in such case, the trap shall be vented by a suitable sidewalk vent, or cowl type vent. The vent must be located to prevent surface water or floods from entering the sewer system.

Standard of Quality of Construction – Customer-Owned Facilities

- 4.6 All construction, reconstruction and alterations of facilities owned by the Customer shall be done and installed in a competent, workmanlike manner in accordance with recognized standards of the plumbing trade. The Company may require reconstruction of any work done improperly.

Water Use Standards for Certain Plumbing Fixtures

4.7 This rule establishes maximum water use criteria for certain plumbing fixtures installed in all new construction or renovation. Such standards have been implemented to achieve maximum efficiency of water use which the Commission has determined is technologically feasible and economically justified.

(a) Maximum permitted water usage levels shall be as follows:

Plumbing Fixture	Maximum Water Use
Water Closets	1.6 gallons/flush
Urinals	1.5 gallons/flush

(b) The Company may exempt particular customers, or classes of customers, when it is determined that the water use standards for plumbing fixtures listed above are unreasonable, cannot be accommodated by existing technology or are otherwise inappropriate.

5. Apartment Complexes

5.1 Sanitary sewer service, after application therefore by the Customer, will be supplied to an apartment complex consisting of two or more buildings containing apartment dwelling units together with any related facilities requiring sanitary sewer service (collectively called the “apartment complex”), where all the following conditions are satisfied:

- a. There shall be only one Customer contracting for sanitary sewer service to the entire apartment complex who shall be the owner of the entire apartment complex.

7. Metered Service

Availability

- 7.1 Where a Customer receives metered water service, charges for sanitary sewer service shall be determined based upon metered usage of water in accordance with Schedule "A".

Registration Conclusive

- 7.2 The quantity of water recorded by the water meter or the Company's estimate, in accordance with the Company's regular procedures, shall be conclusive on both the Customer and the Company, except when the meter has been found to be registering inaccurately or has ceased to register. In such case, an estimated quantity may be determined on the basis of meter registration or such regular estimating procedures during similar preceding periods. No abatement of sewer charges will be made for leaks or for water wasted by damaged or defective fixtures, except as described in 52 Pa. Code Section 56.12(6).

Metering of Former Flat-Rate Service

- 7.3 Where a Customer previously has received flat-rate water service and where, thereafter, water service to the Customer is metered, sewer service will be based upon metered usage of water in accordance with Schedule "A".

Separate Meters for Centers, Apartments and Condominiums

- 7.4 Where a separate water meter has been installed for each individual unit in a commercial or industrial center or for each dwelling or other unit in an apartment building or condominium building or apartment complex or condominium complex, sewer service charges will be calculated based upon each meter and each meter reading.

8. Responsibility for Service

Limitation of Liability of Company

- 8.1 Except for damage or injury resulting solely from the negligence of the Company or of the Company's employees or agents acting within the scope of their authority, the Company shall not be liable for damage to or within any Premises resulting from leakage or stoppage in the sewer system or for any damage or inconvenience to the Customer or for any claim against the Company for other cause.

If, for any reason, the Company is found liable for any damage, injury or loss to any person or property, the liability of the Company shall be limited to the lesser of (1) its liability under generally applicable legal principles or (2) one year's charges, rates and fees for sewer service to the Customer.

Interruption of Service for Repairs or Due to Emergency

- 8.2 If the Company deems it to be necessary, the Company shall have the right to interrupt sewer service temporarily in order to make necessary repairs, connections, etc.; the Company shall use reasonable and practicable measures to notify the Customer of such interruption of service as set forth in 52 Pa. Code Section 56.71.

9. Discontinuance of Service

By Customer

- 9.1 All Customers desiring discontinuance of sewer service shall give written notice at the office of the Company. In addition, where applicable, a Customer who is not a resident of the Premises where service is to be terminated shall comply with the requirements of 52 Pa. Code Section 56.72(2). A Customer may not request service discontinuance to avoid accrual and payment of ready-to-serve or availability charges.

By Company

- 9.2 Service to any Customer may be terminated for any reason specifically set forth in the rules and regulations of the Public Utility Commission.

Service may be terminated, pursuant to the Commission's regulations, if a customer fails to arrange for an inspection of facilities within 14 days of the mailing by the Company of a request to inspect facilities. Such failure also may result in termination of water service by Total Environmental Solutions, Inc.

Service also may be terminated, pursuant to the Commission's regulations, if the customer connects a sump pump, french drain or other facility that places storm water into the system and the customer fails to disconnect such facility from the system and arrange for re-inspection by the Company within 14 days following an inspection by the Company. Such failure also may result in termination of water service by Total Environmental Solutions, Inc.

2. Deposits may be required from Customers taking service for a period of less than thirty (30) days in an amount equal to the estimated gross bill for such temporary period. Deposits may be required from all Customers provided that, in no instance, will deposits be required of residential customers in excess of the estimated gross bill for any single billing period plus one month (the maximum period not to exceed four months) with a minimum of \$5.00.
3. Interest on deposits made by residential Customers will be paid by the Company in accordance with regulations of the Public Utility Commission at 52 Pa. Code Section 56.57.

The news release is as follows:

Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. ("TESI" or "Company") Treasure Lake Sewer Division has filed a request with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to increase sewer rates as of December 30, 2007. TESI has petitioned the Public Utility Commission to allow an overall base rate increase of \$286,615 per year (an increase of approximately 29.5% over current base rates). Since all active sewer use customers are also charged a monthly surcharge to repay a PennVest loan, which surcharge is not being changed, the proposed overall rate increase is 27.1%. The Company was last granted an increase in sewer rates effective May 6, 1999. A copy of the filing is available for inspection at the Company's office.

The Company's increase in rates is necessary in order to allow TESI to realize a reasonable rate of return on the Company's investment and to recover increased operating expenses.

TESI has requested a base rate increase of \$286,615 per year, or a base rate increase of approximately 29.5% for all residential and commercial customers at premises where water service is metered. Since all active sewer use customers are also charged a monthly surcharge to repay a PennVest loan in addition to base rates, which surcharge is not being changed, the proposed overall rate increase is 27.1%.

If the Company's entire request is approved, sewer base rates for a typical residential customer where water service is metered using 2,000 gallons of water would increase from approximately \$24.73 to \$31.43 per month. The typical residential customer's overall annual sewer bill, including the PennVest surcharge, would increase from approximately \$296.76 to \$377.16 per year. Sewer base rates for a typical commercial customer where water service is metered using 1,000 gallons per month would also increase from approximately \$24.73 to \$31.43 per month.

The mediator does not give advice, represent any party, evaluate or make a decision. Instead, the mediator serves as an impartial facilitator who helps the parties resolve their disputes. In other words, mediation is a process which allows the parties to control the outcome of their dispute, as opposed to a hearing where the Administrative Law Judge and the Commission control the outcome.

Moreover, mediation is different from a settlement conference which is based on competitive negotiations. In mediation, the parties agree to work together toward a final resolution of their differences considering how any solution must address the interests of all parties.

There is no court reporter at a mediation session and discussions are **confidential**, unless otherwise provided for by law. The mediation is not binding (except for an agreement reached) and any party may withdraw from the mediation at any time. Mediation is ordinarily an efficient and economical procedure compared to a hearing which is often expensive and time-consuming.

There can be no mediation unless the party with the burden of proof, and all other necessary parties, consent to mediate. If the party with the burden of proof consents, in proceedings subject to a statutory deadline for adjudication, that party must also agree, in writing, to extend the statutory deadline by, at least, 60 days.

PREHEARING MEMORANDUM
OF THE
OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE

Pursuant to Section 333 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 333, and the Initial Prehearing Conference Order of the Presiding Officer, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) provides this Prehearing Memorandum.

On October 31, 2007, Total Environmental Solutions Inc., Treasure Lake Wastewater Division (TESI Sewer) filed Supplement No. 3 to Tariff Wastewater - Pa. P.U.C. No. 4, to become effective December 30, 2007. The Commission suspended the tariff filing on December 20, 2007. The OCA filed its Formal Complaint and public statement in this matter on November 30, 2007.

The Company, by filing this tariff supplement, seeks Commission approval of an increase of \$286,615 in rates for providing service to its ratepayers. TESI Sewer serves approximately 1,982 usage customers and 3,454 availability customers in Sandy Township, Clearfield County.

I. ISSUES

The proposed increase represents an approximate 29.49% increase in the Company's

annual revenues. For the average customer this would produce an approximate 37% increase the customer charge, from \$18.00 to \$24.70, and along with the 2,000 gal/mo allowance, an approximate 37% increase in usage rates from \$5.17 to \$7.09 above the 2,000 gal/mo allowance. For a ¾ inch service line customer using 5,000 gallons per month this would amount to an increase from \$33.51 per month to \$45.97 or \$12.46 per month.

The OCA will develop its issues after reviewing TESI Sewer's interrogatory responses and direct testimony. After TESI Sewer files its testimony setting forth support for its claims, the OCA will also file testimony that will set forth specific issues to be addressed in this proceeding. At that time, the OCA will also be able to make and quantify its specific recommendations.

II. WITNESSES

The OCA intends to present the direct testimony of Marilyn J. Kraus, Senior Regulatory Analyst with the Office of Consumer Advocate.


V. SCHEDULE
