

In 1987, we had our current well dug. This was needed since the spring that supplied our water system went dry.

- Our well is 120 feet deep.
- The drilling company said we should have plenty of water to meet our needs.
- Luckily, we have never run out of water.
- Although we do not take chances.
 - We rarely wash our vehicles.
 - We limit the number of clothes washings we do each week.
 - Outside vegetation is watered sparingly.

Shortly after our well was dug, sulfur gases were pumped from the well with our water.

- Once these gases are heated in our hot water heater, a foul – “rotten egg” odor consumes our house. This odor still occurs today.
- This unpleasant odor is so strong that my family and I will not drink our water.
 - We have been buying bottled water for over 15 years.

I had never had my water tested. I was concerned if I found out that it was polluted what options would I have. Would I have to drill another well? Would I have to truck in water? Due to this hearing, I decided to have our water tested by the Washington Hospitals Microbiology Department. As I figured, our water is polluted: Total Coliform bacteria are present.

Others in this township may claim they do not need public water because they have ample supply which I do as well. The “rotten egg” smell caused by the sulfur gases may not bother some who may have the same problem. Others who have never had their water tested may believe all is fine. I strongly disagree with all these individuals that Mt. Pleasant Township does not need public water.

In my case, what options do I have? Do I continue on with my foul-smelling, contaminated water? Should I sell my house that has been in my family for over 30 years and let someone else deal with this problem? It is 2003. Our township is surrounded by communities that have public water. I pay my taxes just like everyone else. What logical reason is there that I should be denied the right to have public water?

As part of the study conducted this spring to determine the feasibility of a regional water system for Independence, Cross Creek and Mount Pleasant Townships, a survey of water supplies in this area was recently completed. The purpose of our survey is to document on-lot water supply problems with regard to quality and quantity.

Samples were collected at seventy-four residences and businesses within the study area. These samples were analyzed for total coliform bacteria. Total coliform bacteria is a group of harmless "indicator" bacteria. The presence of coliform bacteria in a water supply indicates there is a possibility that pathogenic or disease-causing bacteria may also be present.

Fifty-four out of the seventy-four sites were also tested for fecal coliform bacteria. The presence of fecal coliform bacteria in a water supply indicates fecal contamination either by animal wastes or on-lot septic systems.

When any coliform bacteria is detected in a water supply, that water should not be used for human consumption unless a properly designed and operated disinfection system is in place.

Of the seventy-four supplies that were sampled, forty-one, or 55%, were found contaminated by total coliform bacteria. Of the fifty-four supplies tested for fecal coliform bacteria, nineteen, or 35%, were positive.

Sample sites are identified on the enclosed map. Sites that showed no coliform bacteria contamination are highlighted pink. Sites that are highlighted in yellow indicate supplies that were found contaminated with total coliform bacteria. Sites that are circled in red are supplies found contaminated by fecal coliform bacteria.



It should be noted that while conducting this survey approximately 90% of the supplies inspected were found to be improperly constructed. This assessment is based on design criteria established in the Department of Environmental Protection's Public Water Supply Manual. In discussions with residents, many expressed problems with their water supply. These problems included hardness, objectionable odors and water shortages. Many of the residents had to supplement their water supply by purchasing bulk water from local water haulers. This problem seemed to be most severe in the Hickory area of the study.

The results of this survey clearly support the need for a safe and reliable water system in this area.



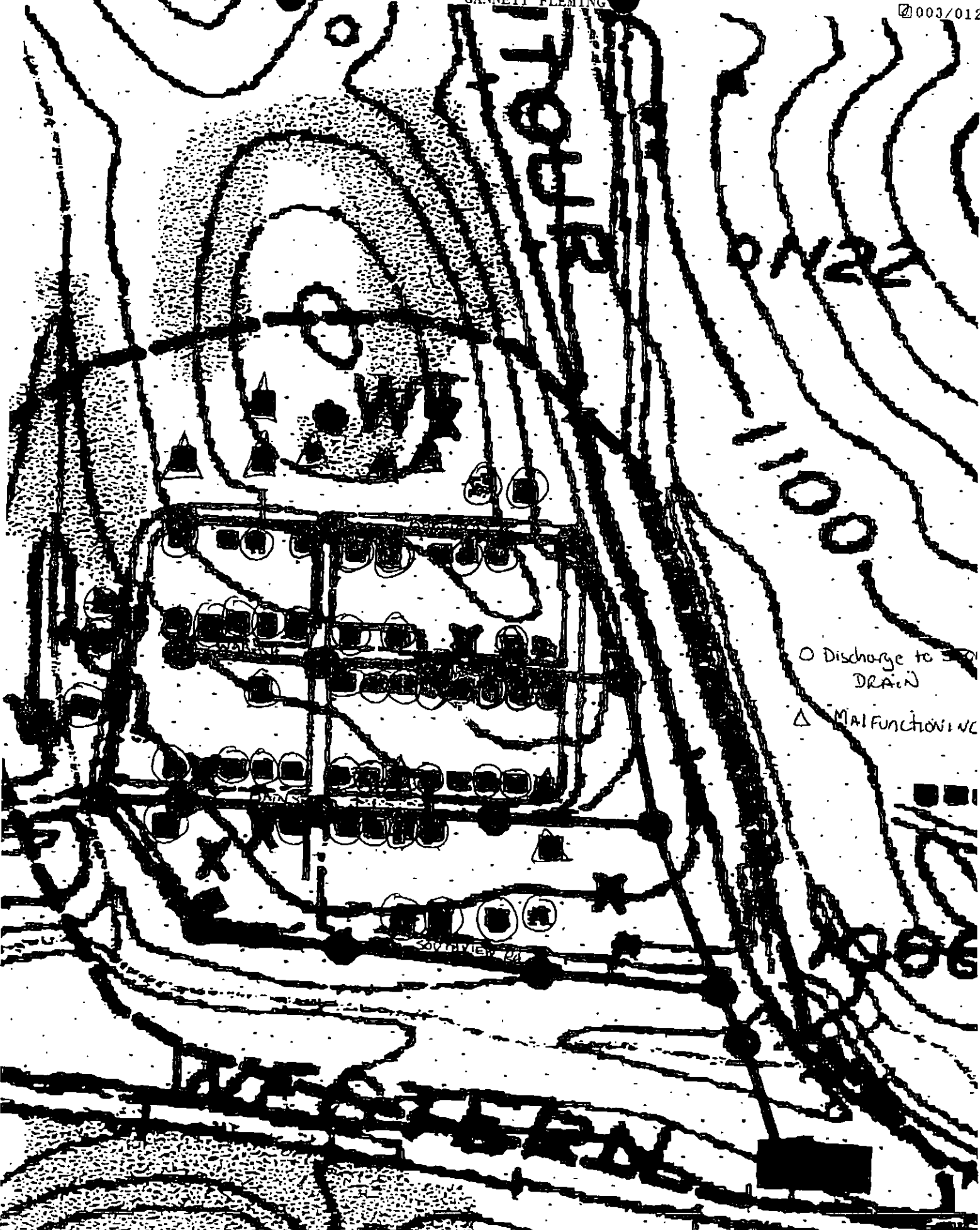

A house count of the Southview Area showed a total of 66 homes in the immediate Southview Area. Estimating from the USGS map a total of 30 homes exist along Antill Street and Second Street. The total homes in the Southview Plan Area are 96. Based on the survey results above, 24 homes have malfunctioning systems and 54 homes discharge to a storm drain. Based on these results, 81% of the homes in the Southview Plan Area have sewage needs and would be considered a mass sewage discharge area.

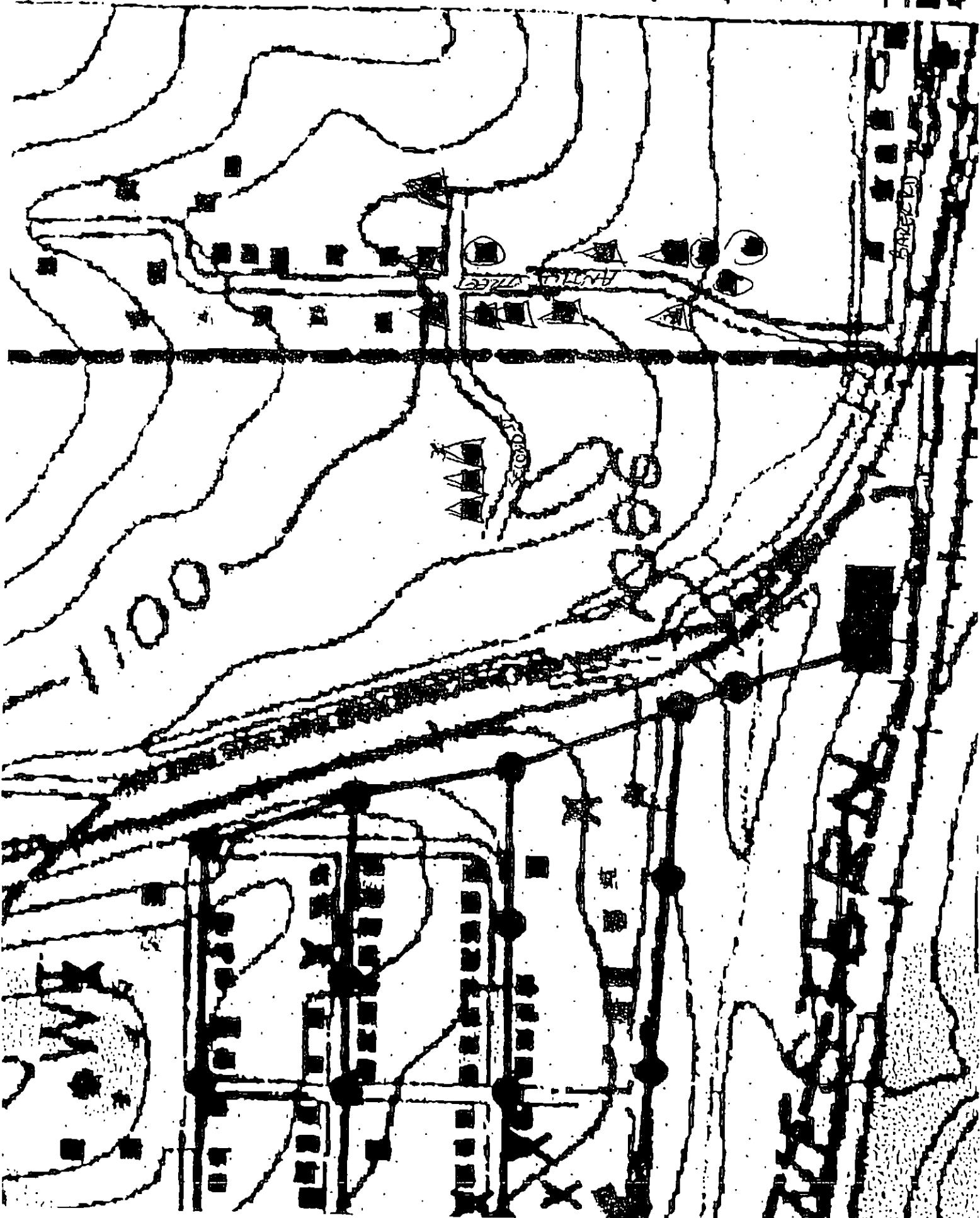

Although I have not been directly involved in the negotiations between PA American Water and Mt. Pleasant Township, I am certainly sympathetic to the obstacles faced by residents with regard to potable water supplies. As Washington County continues to develop and grow, strains on private water supplies grow more evident especially in recent drought conditions. On the other hand, the cost of constructing new water lines is extremely expensive for utility companies and, thus, must be borne in large part by residents. Often in small communities, this results in situations where the economics of a project render it non-feasible. Yet, the residents still must cope with the reality of contaminated or severely limited water. This Catch-22 is faced continuously throughout Washington County.

I will not attempt to speak to the specifics of the negotiations or financial burdens surrounding this project as I truly do not have all of the facts at this time. However, I strongly encourage all parties (PA American Water, Mt. Pleasant Township officials, residents, regulatory agencies and funding agencies) to work together toward a feasible, cost-effective solution to this problem. Perhaps the project must be considered on a larger scale or perhaps the funding sources should factor growth potential that will, inevitably, result from public infrastructure.

In this regard, I offer any assistance that Washington County may provide to accelerate these negotiations for the mutual benefit of all involved.

Home/Family:

4 bedroom, 3-1/2 bath, 96 year old wood frame house built by my great grandfather. Occupants include myself, wife Peggy White, sons Christopher White (10), Alvin D. White III (8), and James D. White III (8).

Professional:

Part owner of LLI Technologies, which is one of Pittsburgh's oldest and largest engineering, architecture, and construction firms. Registered Professional Engineer in Pennsylvania and multiple other States. Knowledgeable about the design and construction of heating, air conditioning, **plumbing and fire protection systems.**

Current Water Supply:

Collect all rainwater from the roof into gutters and downspouts that are piped to a 10,000 - gallon cistern which is approximately 75 years old. This water is used for bathing, laundry, and one toilet. Bulk water is delivered during periods of little rain. Currently the cistern needs immediate repair for a leak. The pump, piping and expansion tank have far exceeded the design life and should be replaced.

One 31 year old well ~120' deep. Water has been tested as potable multiple times. However, it is not used for drinking because of the odor. Current flow rate is less than 50 gallons per day. Frequently has extreme iron if used too much.

History of Water since 1969:

I was born in New York City and moved with my parents to the family homestead in Hickory 1969. Water system consisted of hand pump in back yard for potable water and a 10,000 - gallon cistern which collected rainwater from roof. In 1971 a well was added to provide indoor potable water and reduce the demand on the cistern. The well water always had high iron content and occasionally a sulfur smell. In 1975 the cistern was pumped dry, so it could be thoroughly cleaned from the build up of bird droppings and other debris from the roof. It was also repaired. Fairly extreme water conservation and frequent maintenance of the well and cistern remained the norm.

In 1994 my wife and I moved into the Hickory house from Alexandria Virginia with a two year old and twin baby boys. Increased water deliveries were required. Significant improvements to the cistern or well were not considered because I believed public water would soon be provided. Only emergency maintenance on the well and cistern was done.

Needed significant improvements include: coyote pump and storage, new well, iron filter system, complete water treatment system (reverse osmosis), and significant repairs to the cistern piping - pumping - expansion tank system.

Damage caused by PAWC Reneging:


Believing we would soon not need a well, I built a new deck and porch roof over the well. Significant repairs will no longer be possible.

I did not proceed with new driveway and walkway in front of house because I did not want it damaged by new water service down the street or to my house. Work was completed in back of house on walkway and patio. The new work will not match the old work as well nor will the cost be as low. Because I am unsure about the water company coming to Hickory within the next couple of years, I am still concerned about proceeding with this work.

Incredible frustration and disbelief that my community would be totally surrounded by public water and be denied access. From a general health and public safety stand point Mt. Pleasant Twp. needs water now.

Facility:

One 12,000 square foot building consisting of sanctuary, fellowship hall, class rooms, and offices. The original building is approximately 125 years old. The most recent additions and renovations were completed approximately 10 years ago.

The current property consists of 20 acres. The church is currently planning long range development of this property including a multipurpose building (7,000-10,000 square feet), amphitheater, volleyball court(s), bus and storage garage, "Habitat for Humanity" residence, and possible other uses.

Facility Use:

The church is in use 7 days per week. Current membership is approximately 650 people. There is a preschool with approximately 40 students. An active Sunday School has over 100 students weekly. Between committee meetings, choirs, youth groups, prayer and study groups, weddings, funerals, and other community meetings (Boy Scouts, etc.) the facility is used to it's maximum potential.

Current Water Supply:

A coyote system consisting of a well, 2500 - gallon cistern, and chemical injection treatment system serve the non-potable needs of the church. This system is not capable of providing enough water. The church purchases approximately \$1,000 per year in bulk water. Chemical costs are approximately \$600 per year.

Potable water is provided through multiple bottled water fountains located throughout the facility. My estimate of costs for the potable water is \$2,000 per year.

Fire Safety:


The facility is not currently in compliance with the Pennsylvania Statewide Uniform Building Code. As a result of "Grandfather Clauses" the facility can still be occupied. While the church has done everything possible such as adding a monitored smoke detection system, it is not possible to properly fire protect the property without adding a fire sprinkler system. Adding a system would currently require adding a storage system and pumping system which is cost prohibitive.


While planning and designing the new facilities, the costs of construction will be escalated as result of not having reliable water supple for a fire suppression system.

Damage caused by PAWC Reneging:

The church has spent approximately \$8,500 on surveying and planning for a new facility. The understanding that water would be available played little in moving forward with this work. However, it is now an unknown that the church must deal with as we move forward with the design of the new facilities. Specifically this will affect the design of the building with regard to a kitchen and the fire protection strategy used.
