The amount that must be deposited with the Company, above the Company investment, before work is initiated, is based on the Company's estimate of the total project cost. The difference between the estimated and actual costs is paid by, or refunded to, the applicants, as applicable, upon completion of the main extension.

The total Company investment for these 23 locations (\$142,600) exceeds the estimated main installation costs (\$120,033) and provides an estimated credit of \$22,567 to the Mt. Pleasant project.

Public water in Mount Pleasant Township

My wife and I have been residents of Hickory/Mt. Pleasant Township for 40+ years. We constructed a new home, drilled a well and built a cistern to supply water for our home. Since that time the water table in our area has decreased. As a result we have very limited supply of well water. Of course our cistern is subject to the amount of rainfall. Over the past number of years the summers have been very dry. We can not use the cistern as drinking water.

The septic systems in our area are very old and most (95%) do not work as designed. Most of them run out on the surface. We live down stream from the main street in Hickory. I can assure you that all the homes septic systems that are up stream from us do not work. If you do not believe me, please visit us during a hot summer day and you will personally experience the odor of the septic systems. We have a health hazzard in Hickory waiting to happen.

The Pennsylvania American Water Company (PAWC) as a monopoly has the responsibility to supply water to residents of Pennsylvania. For over 20+ years Hickory/Mt. Pleasant Township has been held hostage by PAWC. The Township has incurred the expense of conducting many engineering studies over the years. We have even gone so far as to devise a plan to develop our own water supply and system. This we found to be cost prohibitive.

As our representatives, my wife and I are asking for your support of our position. PAWC has requested substantial customer contributions in order to extend services to Mt. Pleasant Township residents. Such contributions would make the water project much to expensive for the residents of Mt. Pleasant Township. A large number of the residents are retired and on fixed/limited incomes.

Mr. Larry Gesoff, Administrative Law Judge's rational that no Bona Fide Service applicants of Hickory have applied to PAWC for services is flawed. PAWC does not have water service in Mt. Pleasant Township that a resident can apply for in the Hickory area. The nearest water main is 6 or 7 miles from Hickory.

It is my understanding that PAWC has recently applied for a 15+% rate increase. Maybe some of this increase, if granted could be used to offset the main extension cost.
