

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 20, 2002, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety instituted a complaint against Cranberry Limousine Service, Inc., respondent, alleging that it held itself out to transport persons for compensation between points in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania while not then holding a certificate of public convenience issued by this Commission. The total penalty for the two (2) violations is \$1,250.00.

Respondent was duly notified that, if an answer was not filed within twenty (20) days of receipt of the complaint, the penalty would be imposed.


The complaint and notice were served on respondent on September 23, 2002; and, more than thirty (30) days later, no response has been received from respondent.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the allegations in the complaint are admitted.
2. That the complaint is sustained.
3. That respondent, within twenty (20) days from the date of service of this order, pay a fine of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.00) by certified check or money order payable to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission at P.O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265, as provided in the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §§3301 and 3315.

4. That respondent cease and desist from further violation of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §§101, et seq., and the Regulations of this Commission, 52 Pa. Code §§1.1, et seq.
