To Whom It May Concern:

I have contacted both the bankruptcy department and billing department on several occasions since July to have the \$137.89 removed from my bill that should have been voided by my 2012 bankruptcy (Case # 12-10821). I am not sure why your company is taking so long to clear this amount which was already cleared by a Federal bankruptcy court over three years ago, or why I can never speak to an actual person in your department and instead have to always leave a message, though I suspect PECO intentionally makes it difficult for customers to clear debts already removed by Federal court order. If this is the case it is highly unethical and possibly illegal.

In any event, I am paying you today the actual amount I legally owe which is \$362.91 by postal money order, and including this certified letter so that I have positive documentation that I have repeatedly made PECO aware of my situation and you have made no effort to resolve it, despite being required to under Federal law, in the event I may need such evidence in a future legal proceeding if PECO attempts to send the unpaid amount to collections, reports it to the credit bureaus, or shuts off my service.
