(a) Application of Keyco Distributors, Inc., Nanticoke, Luzerne County, for emergency temporary authority, to transport, as a common carrier, U.S.D.A. donated foods and foodstuffs, from the warehouse facilities of Keyco Distributors, Inc. located in the township of Hanover, Luzerne County, to points in the counties of Cameron, Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Potter, Snyder, Tioga, Union, Bradford, Carbon, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Wayne, Wyoming and Elk.

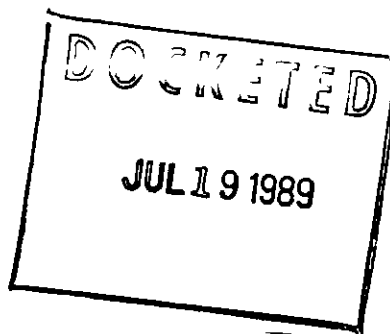

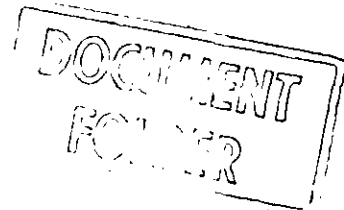

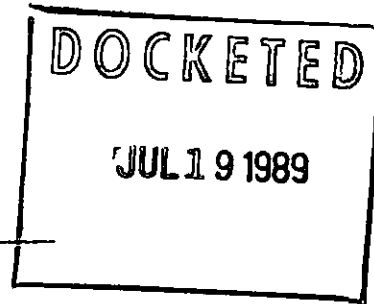

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application for emergency temporary authority filed June 9, 1989. Corresponding applications for temporary and permanent authority have also been filed.

Keyco Distributors, Inc. (applicant or Keyco) operates a distribution center located in Hanover Township, Luzerne County. By the instant application, Keyco seeks a grant of emergency temporary authority which would authorize it to transport U.S.D.A. donated food and foodstuffs from its distribution facility in Hanover Township, to destinations in 21 northcentral and northeastern counties.

Keyco was recently awarded a contract by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. Pursuant to said contract, Keyco is to provide transportation for U.S.D.A. donated food and foodstuffs from its own warehouse to destinations designated by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. The commodities in question, were transported to the applicant's warehouse by other carriers. The contract is to become effective on July 1, 1989 and is to run for two years, with three one (1) year extensions.

After review of the record, we find that there is an emergency situation existing which creates an immediate need for service; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for temporary authority be and is hereby approved, granting the following right:


To transport, as a Class D carrier, U.S.D.A. donated food and foodstuffs, from the warehouse facilities of Keyco Distributors, Inc., located in the township of Hanover, Luzerne County, to points in the counties of Cameron, Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Potter, Snyder, Tioga, Union, Bradford, Carbon, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Wayne, Wyoming and Elk.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall charge the rates set forth in its application for emergency temporary authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That approval of the emergency temporary authority application shall have no bearing on the applications for temporary and permanent authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the emergency temporary authority granted herein shall become effective immediately.
