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I note for the record the appearance of Richard T. Mulcahey, Junior, Esquire, on behalf of Adam's Moving and Hauling, Incorporated. This was originally scheduled to be a hearing, however, it was changed to a prehearing conference at the request of the applicant.

I understand from a conversation with the applicant's attorney this morning, Mr. Mulcahey, that there has been a new development in this case. Mr. Mulcahey, why don't you state for the record what the present status of this matter is?

MR. MULCAHEY: Good morning, Your Honor.

JUDGE RAINEY: Good morning.

MR. MULCAHEY: Yesterday I received a voice-mail message from William Casey who represents the protestants in the case, I believe there are six protestants, indicating that after further consideration, they had decided to withdraw their protest to the case and he said that he would ask me

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to represent that to Your Honor and apologize that it was such a late time.

Unfortunately, I only confirmed that by talking to him this morning at about 8:30 and by the time I reached Your Honor, it was too late to cancel the hearing. I certainly apologize for that, as well.

That being the case, Your Honor, I would request that this matter be transferred to the Bureau of Transportation under the Commission's modified procedure to provide along those guidelines.

JUDGE RAINEY: I think that would be an order. Let me just note for the record that there are six protestants who are represented by Mr. Casey, those protestants being: One, Clemmer Moving & Storage, Inc.; two, Dillon Moving, Incorporated; three, Morgan Moving and Storage Limited; four, O'Brien's Moving and Storage, Incorporated; five;, Read's Van Service, Incorporated, and six, Shelly Moving and Storage, Incorporated.

MR. MULCAHEY: Your Honor, to be fair to Mr. Casey --

JUDGE RAINEY: Sure.

MR. MULCAHEY: -- he mentioned to me that it was difficult contacting six clients and getting them

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to agree to anything, let alone withdrawing.
JUDGE RAINEY: Yes.
MR. MULCAHEY: So that was the cause for the
delay. But both of us had anticipated that this
would happen and that's why we requested this hearing
to be a prehearing conference. Unfortunately, we
couldn't cancel it on a timely basis.
JUDGE RAINEY: Thank you for that apology and
representation. It's my understanding that there are
no other protests to the application?
MR. MULCAHEY: That's correct, Your Honor.
JUDGE RAINEY: I will assume that Mr. Casey
will file his withdraw of the protest to the
application pursuant to 52 PA Code, Section 5.94 B
and that withdrawal should be filed with the
Commission with a copy to myself.
Also, this matter may be transferred to the

Commission's technical staff in the Bureau of
Transportation and Safety to consider the application
under modified procedures appearing at 52 PA Code,
Section 3.381 C iii and the three is represented by
lower case Roman numerals, A and that's a capital A.
Is there anything further which we need to take up,
Mr. Mulcahey?

MR. MULCAHEY: No, Your Honor.

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JUDGE RAINEY: If not, thank you very much
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     for your appearance here today.
              MR. MULCAHEY: Thank you, Your Honor.
