EMERGENCY ORDER

By an application filed November 8, 1995, Tad's Delivery Service, Inc., t/d/b/a T & N Van Service (T& N or applicant), seeks emergency temporary authority to assist in the relocation of office furnishings for General Accident Insurance Co. (shipper) between points in Lehigh County. The application covers a specific move and limits the applicant's service to moving a file library between the dates of November 12, and 19, 1995.

The proposed move requires specialized equipment that local carriers - Fisher Hughes and O'Brien Van Lines - do not have in sufficient quantities. T & N has "library carts" that will allow the shipper's files to remain accessible while in transit, waiting for new racking to be built, and while waiting for files to be transferred to new racking. Without such moving equipment the shipper would have to rely on traditional moving techniques that would require packing and unpacking the files from boxes. This method would incur considerable loss of work time and increase the likelihood of error.

In consideration of the foregoing, I have determined that an immediate need for service exists and that a grant of emergency authority is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for emergency temporary authority be and is hereby approved as follows:

To transport, as a common carrier, a file library for
