2 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE MORRIS SOLOMON: Let's go
3 on the record at this time.

4 This is the time and place set for a public
5 hearing in the matter of the Application of Landis Trans-
6 portation, Inc., which the Commission has docketed to
7 A-00109499.

8 I have the appearance this morning of Joseph T.
9 Bambrick, Jr., Esquire, for the Applicant.

10 I am Morris Solomon, the Judge assigned to preside
11 in this case.

12 I note from correspondence submitted to me
13 earlier, and to the Commission, that A. Dewey Pyle, Inc.,
14 on January 3rd, has withdrawn its protest, and on
15 February 5th, Butler Trucking Company withdrew its protest.

16 The only remaining protest we are aware of is
17 that of Scout Trucking, Inc.

18 Mr. Bambrick, I gather you have handed to us a
19 restrictive amendment which is acceptable to Scout Trucking;
20 is that correct?

21 MR. BAMBRICK: That's correct, Your Honor.

22 JUDGE SOLOMON: They are the last protestant in
23 this proceeding, as I understand it.

24 MR. BAMBRICK: As far as I know, that's the only
25 protestant remaining in the case.

1 JUDGE SOLOMON: What we will do is we have
 2 this faxed copy of the stipulation which you have signed,
 3 and which has been signed, the original, by Mr. Ciemniecki
 4 as counsel for Scout Trucking, what we will do is we will
 5 await submission of the signed original of this stipula-
 6 tion and then submit it to the Secretary for filing, and then
 7 at that point refer the case to the Bureau of Transportation
 8 for modified procedures, if that's what you're --

9 MR. BAMBRICK: That's what we're requesting,
 10 Your Honor.

11 JUDGE SOLOMON: Fine. That's what we will do then.
 12 The case then involves no protests at this point. Upon
 13 receipt of the original, we will have it filed with the
 14 Secretary. In the meantime, we will hold this copy as
 15 evidence that the parties have indeed reached an accord on
 16 the authority sought.

17 Is there anything further we should have at this
 18 point?

19 MR. BAMBRICK: Nothing that I'm aware of,
 20 Your Honor.

21 JUDGE SOLOMON: Very well. Then this proceeding is
 22 adjourned at this time.

 24 adjourned.)
