

DECISION

DECISION

I. INTRODUCTION

A. SUMMARY

In this Decision, the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority, formerly known as the Department of Public Utility Control, finds that GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy possesses the technical, financial and managerial capability to operate as an Electric Supplier and grants it an Electric Supplier License to serve commercial customers throughout Connecticut.

B. BACKGROUND OF THE PROCEEDING

By application submitted on October 28, 2011 (Application), filed pursuant to §16-245 of the General Statutes of Connecticut (Conn. Gen. Stat.), as amended by Public Act 11-80, An Act Concerning the Establishment of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and Planning for Connecticut's Energy Future, and §§16-245-1 to 16-245-6, inclusive, and of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (Conn. Agencies Regs.), GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy (Think Energy or Company) requested the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority's (Authority or PURA) approval for a license to operate as an Electric Supplier in Connecticut.

C. CONDUCT OF THE PROCEEDING

There is no statutory requirement for a hearing, no person requested a hearing, and none was held.

D. PARTICIPANTS

The Authority recognized GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy 1990 Post Oak Blvd, Houston, Texas 77056; and the Office of Consumer Counsel, Ten Franklin Square, New Britain, Connecticut 06051, as participants to this proceeding.

II. AUTHORITY ANALYSIS

A. COMPANY STRUCTURE

Think Energy is a limited liability company formed under the laws of the State of Delaware on April 18, 2011. Application, Exhibits A-8 and A-9. The Company is seeking a license to serve commercial customers throughout Connecticut. Application, B-1. Think Energy is currently a licensed retail electric provider in Massachusetts, Maryland and Texas. Application, Exhibit B-4.

B. TECHNICAL CAPABILITY

Think Energy stated that it expects to serve 634 customers with an expected total electric generation load of 50 MW. Application, D-1. The Company indicated that it has a contractual relationship with its affiliate, GDF Suez Energy Marketing NA, Inc. (GDSERNA), an active participant in the wholesale market in the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL), to meet all of Think Energy's wholesale supply, scheduling and settlement needs pursuant to the Master Supply Agreement between the Company and GDSERNA. Application, Exhibit D-4b. Based on the foregoing, the Authority finds that Think Energy has sufficiently demonstrated its technical capability, as required under Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245, to operate as an Electric Supplier in Connecticut to serve commercial customers.

C. FINANCIAL CAPABILITY

The GDF Suez Energy North America, Inc. and Subsidiaries' consolidated financial statements and Independent Auditors' Report was provided for the years ending December 31, 2010 and 2009. Application, Exhibit C-1. In addition, as security, GSERNA currently has a letter of credit in the amount of \$250,000. Application, Exhibit F-2. Based on the foregoing, the Authority finds that Think Energy has sufficiently demonstrated its financial capability as required under Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245, to operate as an Electric Supplier in Connecticut and serve commercial customers in Connecticut.

D. MANAGERIAL CAPABILITY

Applicant's parent company, GSERNA has been an active electric supplier in the Connecticut market since 2004. In 2010, it served over 500,000 MWs of load to Connecticut customers. GSERNA also provides risk-managed electric energy supply to commercial and industrial customers in Delaware, Illinois, Texas, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, Maine, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia, and Ohio, and serves approximately 4,500 businesses and 60,000 accounts in the United States. The Company will have access to shared services and oversight by its parent company for day to day managerial operational activities. Application, Exhibit E-1. The Authority has reviewed the managerial information and concludes that Think Energy possesses adequate managerial capability, as required under Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245, to service commercial customers in Connecticut.

E. CUSTOMER SERVICE

Think Energy provided its toll-free telephone number for customer service and complaints. Application, Section A-5. The Company stated that there have been no fines, sanctions or penalties in any state for violation of consumer protection law or regulation. Application, Section A-14. The Authority reviewed Think Energy's Standard Service Contract and Customer Service Plan that contains the Company's termination policies and customer service procedures, and finds them acceptable. Application, Exhibits B-2 and B-3; Responses to Interrogatories CSU-6 through CSU-7.

The Authority finds that Think Energy's customer service information to be satisfactory. Based on the foregoing, the Authority finds that Think Energy's proposed customer service policies and procedures should ensure that high quality customer service is provided to its Connecticut customers.

III. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Think Energy is a limited liability company formed under the laws of the State of Delaware on April 18, 2011.
2. Think Energy does not currently, nor did it ever, provide electric generation services in another state.
3. Think Energy indicated that it has a contractual relationship with its affiliate, GSERNA, an active participant in the wholesale market in NEPOOL.
4. Think Energy has no history of bankruptcy, dissolution, merger or acquisition.
5. Think Energy's management team has several years' experience working within the retail electric market.
6. Think Energy has not been fined, sanctioned or otherwise penalized for violation of any consumer protection law or regulation.
7. GSERNA has a \$250,000.00 Letter of Credit.

IV. CONCLUSION AND ORDERS

A. CONCLUSION

Think Energy has adequate technical, managerial and financial capabilities, as required under Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245 to provide electric generation services to commercial customers in Connecticut. Therefore, the Authority grants Think Energy an Electric Supplier License to serve commercial customers, subject to Think Energy complying with the Orders in this Decision and all post-licensing requirements.

B. ORDERS

For the following Orders, submit one original of the required documentation to the Executive Secretary, 10 Franklin Square, New Britain, CT 06051, and file an electronic version through the Authority's website at www.ct.gov/pura. Submissions filed in compliance with Authority Orders must be identified by all three of the following: Docket Number, Title and Order Number.

1. Think Energy is under continuing obligation to notify the Authority of any changes to the information provided in the Application.
2. Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245p(a), an Electric Supplier is required to submit annual reports containing information on rates and any other information deemed relevant by the Authority. Think Energy shall file such annual report not later than 30 days following December 31 of every year. Each annual report shall contain at minimum all information enumerated in subsection (b) of Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245p, as amended.
3. Pursuant to Conn. Agencies Regs. § 16-245a-1(a) and Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-243q, an Electric Supplier is required to submit an annual report demonstrating its compliance with the renewable energy portfolio standard requirements set forth in Conn. Gen. Stat. §§16-245a and 16-243q. The report shall indicate the percent of total electricity output or services generated from Class I, Class II and Class III renewable energy sources during the previous calendar year. If the Electric Supplier does not provide electric service during any calendar year, said report for that year should indicate so. Think Energy shall file its annual compliance report for each calendar year not later than October 15 of the following year.
4. No later than 20 days before Think Energy executes its first contract for the sale of electric generation services to an end use customer in Connecticut, Think Energy shall file with the Authority an affidavit concerning its capability to exchange data with the electric distribution companies in accordance with Conn. Agencies Regs. §16-245-3(b).
5. Think Energy shall provide the Authority with any changes to its customer service practices, procedures or policies in writing at least 10 business days prior to the effective date of such changes.
6. Think Energy shall maintain its customer complaint records to indicate: (1) the date of the complaint; (2) the name and address of the complainant; (3) the address or location of the complaint; (4) a description of the complaint; and (5) a description of the resolution of the complaint.
7. Pursuant to Order No. 2 in the Decision dated February 27, 2008 in Docket No. 07-05-33, DPUC Administration of Disclosure Label Requirements and Examination of Direct Billing by Electric Suppliers, the Authority requires that Electric Suppliers and Distribution Companies submit their copy of the Authority

approved format for the two-page standard disclosure label which includes the "Questions to Ask Suppliers and Aggregators." Think Energy must submit its initial disclosure label, under the instant docket, no later than 20 days before it executes its first contract for the sale of electric generation services to an end user in Connecticut. The Disclosure Label forms, accessible electronically in Word and Excel formats for supplier and EDC use, can be found under the Authority homepage at www.ct.gov/pura under Electric, then select Information for Electric Suppliers and Aggregators, refer to list under Disclosure Label Documents.

8. Pursuant to Order No. 3 in the Decision dated February 27, 2008 in Docket No. 07-05-33, in compliance with Conn. Gen. Stat. §16-245p(b), suppliers must post their information, e.g., rates and charges, resource mix percentages, air emissions and all disclosure labels going forward to the Authority's "Electric Supplier Information Database" as discussed in Section II.A. Statutory Requirements Regarding Disclosure of that Decision. The "Electric Supplier Information Database" can be found via the Authority's homepage www.ct.gov/pura under Electric, select Information for Electric Suppliers and Aggregators, then select link Electric Supplier Info Database (ESID).
9. Pursuant to Order No. 4 in the Decision dated February 27, 2008 in Docket No. 07-05-33, the Authority requires that Electric Suppliers submit updates to pricing information for generally all-inclusive offers on a form prescribed by the Authority. This form can be found via the Authority home page at www.ct.gov/pura top menu bar, select Forms, Electric, Electric Supplier Price Filing. This information is posted to www.ctenergyinfo.com website page "Compare Generation Service Charges (GSC) Offers."

DECISION APPROVING EXPANSION OF ELECTRIC SUPPLIER LICENSE

On March 19, 2014, the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (Authority or PURA) received an application from GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy (Think Energy or Company) requesting that the Authority allow the Company to expand its electric supplier license to supply electric generation services to residential customers.

By Decision dated February 22, 2012, in Docket No. 11-10-14, Application GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy for an Electric Supplier License, the Authority granted the Company an electric supplier license to supply electric generation services to commercial and industrial customers in Connecticut.

Pursuant to §§16-245-2(b)(2), (b)(3) and (b)(18)-(b)(23) and §16-245-2(c) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (Conn. Agencies Regs.), the Company submitted the required information including, but not limited to, its Electric Service Contract. The Authority has reviewed the Company's Electric Service Contract and finds it to be acceptable and in accordance with applicable statutes and regulations. Application, Exhibit B-2.

Think Energy stated that no changes have been made to its customer service policies and procedures. Response to Interrogatory EL-2. Since its inception as a licensed electric supplier, the Authority is aware of one complaint filed against the Company with the PURA's Consumer Affairs Unit. Consumer Affairs Intake Forms dated March 10, 2014.

Think Energy has provided an updated name, address, telephone number, fax number and e-mail address of the Company employee that the Authority should contact

regarding customer complaints. Response to Interrogatory EL-1. The Authority has also reviewed the Company's policy for switching customers. Response to Interrogatory EL-1, Exhibit 2. Based upon the foregoing, the Authority finds that Think Energy's existing customer service policies and procedures should continue to ensure that high quality customer service is provided to its Connecticut customers.

In this re-opened proceeding, the Authority has also re-examined the Company's technical, financial and managerial capabilities and finds that it has sufficient capabilities to serve commercial and industrial, as well as residential, customers. Therefore, the Authority hereby approves the Company's application to expand the scope of its electric supplier license. The Company's new license shall begin upon the issuance of this Decision and pursuant to Conn. Agencies Regs. §16-245-2(f), it shall be subject to renewal five years from the date of this Decision.



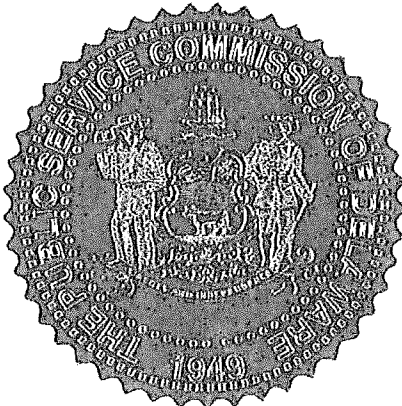

ELECTRIC SUPPLIER CERTIFICATE

This 17th day of April, 2012, the Commission determines and Orders the following:

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2011, GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy ("Think Energy" or "Company") filed an application seeking certification as a retail electric supplier. See 26 Del. C. §§1001(3), 1001(14), and 1012. Under the Electric Utilities Restructuring Act of 1999 (the "Act"),¹ "Electric Suppliers"² are not "public utilities" and the resulting sales of Electric Supply Service to Retail Electric Customers are not subject to traditional forms of rate regulation. See 26 Del. C. §§ 102(2) and 202(f); and

WHEREAS, in its application, Think Energy reports that it is an Electric Supplier that will be providing Electric Supply Service to Small Commercial Customers; and

WHEREAS, Staff reports that the Company's application fulfills all the requirements for the Company to obtain an Electric Supplier Certificate to act as an Electric Supplier as set forth in the

Commission's Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers, 26 *Del. Admin. C.* §3001 (the "ES Rules"). In particular, Staff reports that the Company appears to possess the financial, operational, managerial, and technical capabilities to operate as an Electric Supplier. As required by Section 2.2 of the ES Rules, the Company provided the appropriate affidavits of publication of notice of its application in the Delaware State News and The News Journal. Staff confirms that there were no comments, interventions, or protests filed in the instant docket within the required 20-day notice period. Because Staff reports that the Company has fulfilled all of the requirements for an Electric Supplier Certificate, Staff recommends that the Commission issue such an Electric Supplier Certificate to Think Energy to allow it to offer Electric Supply Service in this State consistent with the scheme adopted by the Act and the ES Rules;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE
VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:

1. That GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy is hereby granted, under *Del. C.* § 1012(a) and *Del. Admin. C.* §3001, a certificate to do business and operate as an "Electric Supplier" within the State of Delaware. Under this certificate, GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy is authorized to provide Electric Supply Service within this State in accordance with 26 *Del. C.* Ch. 10.

2. That the Company shall at all times provide its Electric Supply Service in accordance with the requirements imposed by 26 *Del. C.* Ch. 10 and 26 *Del. Admin. C.* §3001 as presently adopted or as may be hereafter amended or supplemented. The Company is hereby notified

that a violation of any applicable statute, rule or other controlling authority may be enforced by the sanctions permitted by 26 Del. C. §§1012(a) and 1019 and 26 Del. Admin. C. §3001-10.2.

3. That GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy shall file, pursuant to the provisions of 26 Del. C. §1012(c)(2) and §§3001-3.9 and 3.10, such reports and pay such fees and assessments as may be required or may be imposed by 26 Del. C. §§114 and 115.

4. That GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy consents to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Delaware for all acts or omissions related to its offering of Electric Supply Services in this State.



Order No. 8133 issued in PSC Docket No. 11-482 required GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy ("Think Energy" or "Company") to submit its contract for residential customers twenty-one days prior to utilization. On May 27, 2015 the Company submitted an amendment to the original certification to add a fixed price residential contract for review by Staff as required in section 3.4 of 26 *Del. Admin. C.* §3001 (the "Supplier Rules").

Staff reviewed the documents for compliance with Sections 2.1.1.9, 3.4 and 4.1 of the Supplier Rules. On June 11, 2015, Staff submitted a request to Think Energy for revisions to the contract. On June 15, 2015, the Company submitted a revised contract but upon further review, Staff requested an additional revision on June 17, 2015. The Company submitted a second revised fixed price residential contract

Staff believes the revised contracts submitted on June 17, 2015 are in compliance with the Supplier Rules. No further action is required.

By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") grants a license to GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy ("GSRES" or "Applicant") to function as an electricity supplier in the District of Columbia.¹ Specifically, GSRES intends to operate as a marketer of electricity for commercial and industrial customers in the District of Columbia, pursuant to Section 34-1505 of the "Retail Electric Competition and Consumer Protection Act of 1999 ("Act")."²

2. On October 31, 2011, GSRES filed its license application.³ Pursuant to the Commission's licensing requirements as set forth in Order No. 11796,⁴ GSRES has provided the following information:

- a) Proof of technical and managerial competence;
- b) An affidavit of compliance with applicable Federal and District of Columbia environmental laws and regulations dated September 27, 2011;
- c) Proof of financial integrity to include financial statements;
- d) Proof that GSRES has registered with the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs to do business in the District of Columbia;
- e) An affidavit that GSRES is subject to all applicable taxes;

ORDER

By the Commission:

I. INTRODUCTION

On June 19, 2011, GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC ("Applicant") filed a verified application with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") requesting a Certificate of Service Authority authorizing it to operate as an alternative retail electric supplier ("ARES") in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451, "Certification of Alternative Retail Electric Suppliers," ("Part 451"). Applicant submitted its certificate of publication showing that on July 22, 2011, proper notice of the application was published in the official State newspaper. The Administrative Law Judge requested clarification of certain matters contained in the application. Applicant filed a verified response to the Administrative Law Judge, as well as a motion seeking leave to amend certain attachments to the application, on August 8, 2011. Thereafter, the Administrative Law Judge sought additional clarification, which Applicant provided on August 31, 2011. On September 9, 2011, Applicant supplemented its August 31, 2011 filing.

II. BACKGROUND AND AUTHORITY SOUGHT BY APPLICANT

Applicant is a wholly-owned, sole member-managed subsidiary of GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc., which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of GDF Suez Energy NA, Inc. GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc. is the retail operating group for GDF Suez Energy NA, Inc. The latter engages in electricity generation and cogeneration, natural gas and liquefied natural gas, renewable energy, and asset-based trading and origination. GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc. currently provides risk-managed electric energy supply to commercial and industrial customers as an ARES in Illinois pursuant to authority granted in Docket No. 05-0257. GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc. also provides risk-managed electric supply to commercial and industrial customers in Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, and the District of Columbia. GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc. serves approximately 4,500 businesses and 60,000 accounts in the United States.

Applicant seeks authority to offer the sale of electricity and power to all eligible residential and nonresidential customers in the service territory of Commonwealth Edison Company ("ComEd"), pursuant to Subpart D of Part 451. GDF Suez Energy Resources NA, Inc. formed Applicant to market to and serve small commercial customers in Illinois. Applicant plans to offer a variety of electric energy based products to small commercial customers, including fixed-price products and index-based products. Applicant tentatively plans to enter the residential market in early/mid 2013. Applicant is not licensed to sell electric supply services in any other states. Applicant, however, currently has similar applications pending in Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and Texas. Applicant reports that it has not had any complaints filed against it for its provision of any services in the electric or gas industry in this or any other jurisdiction.

III. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE ACT

Applicant is a limited liability company organized under the laws of Delaware. Applicant does not intend to install, operate, or maintain generation, transmission, or distribution facilities within the State of Illinois. Therefore, no demonstration of compliance with the requirements of Section 451.20(d)(2) has been made and Applicant's employees are not permitted to perform such functions, and other entities are not permitted to perform such functions pursuant to contractual arrangements with Applicant.

Applicant certifies that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will provide service only to retail customers eligible to take such services; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-112 of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ARES. Additionally, Applicant agrees to submit good faith schedules of transmission and energy in accordance with applicable tariffs. Applicant also agrees to adopt and follow rules relating to customer authorizations, billing records, and retail electric services and agrees to retain requests for delivery services transmitted to utilities for a period of not less than two calendar years after the calendar year in which they are created. Applicant agrees further to adopt and follow rules and procedures to preserve the confidentiality of its customers' data. Applicant agrees as well to procure renewable energy resources as required by subsection (d) of Section 16-115 and Section 16-115D of the Act. Applicant also certifies that it will source electricity from clean coal facilities as required by Section 16-115(d)(5) of the Act.

Pursuant to the requirements of Subpart D of Part 451, Applicant certifies that any marketing materials that make statements concerning prices, terms, and conditions of service shall contain information that adequately discloses the prices, terms, and conditions of the products or services that it is offering or selling to the customer. Applicant also certifies that before any customer is switched from another supplier, it

shall give the customer written information that adequately discloses, in plain language, the prices, terms, and conditions of the products and services being offered and sold to the customer. Applicant further certifies that it will provide documentation to the Commission and to customers that substantiates any claims made regarding the technologies and fuel types used to generate the electricity offered or sold to customers. Applicant commits to provide to its customers itemized billing statements that describe the products and services provided to the customer and their prices; and an additional statement, at least annually, that adequately discloses the average monthly prices, and the terms and conditions, of the products and services sold to the customer.

Applicant certifies that it will include materials comprising the consumer education program pursuant to Section 16-117 of the Act with all initial mailings to potential residential and small commercial retail customers and before executing any agreements or contracts with such customers. Applicant certifies that it will provide such materials at no charge to residential and small commercial retail customers upon request. Applicant certifies that it will provide to residential and small commercial retail customers on a semi-annual basis information on how to obtain a list of ARES that have been found in the last three years by the Commission to have failed to provide service in accordance with the terms of their contracts pursuant to Section 16-117(g)(4)(C) of the Act.

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 451.50 of Part 451, Applicant provided a License or Permit Bond in the amount of \$300,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact business in Illinois. Attachment 3 to the application is a copy of the required License or Permit Bond.

IV. FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL, AND MANAGERIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 16-115

Applicant asserts that it meets the financial qualifications set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1) of the Act. Applicant provided documents intended to show that it is a member of the PJM Interconnection and certifies that it will purchase 100% of its physical electric energy from that regional transmission organization for delivery to the ComEd service territory. This information is intended to demonstrate compliance with Section 451.320(a)(3).

Applicant represents that it meets the technical and managerial qualifications set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1) as well as Sections 451.330 and 451.340 of Part 451. In Amended Attachments 5 and 6 to its application and the response for clarification mentioned above, Applicant identifies the personnel who purportedly satisfy the criteria and provides biographical information for these individuals. In its supplemental response to the August 16, 2011 Administrative Law Judge ruling, Applicant indicates that it is relying on individuals employed by an affiliate, GDF Suez Energy Marketing NA, to meet the managerial requirements of Section 451.340. Applicant does not employ anyone that has four years of experience in electric system operations and

relies on Section 451.340(c) to remedy this requirement. Section 451.340(c) provides that in the event an applicant does not meet the managerial qualifications set forth in this Section, the applicant shall demonstrate the extent that its managerial resources and abilities match the services that it intends to provide to its customers. That provision also provides that the Commission may impose such terms and conditions as deemed necessary in order to insure the applicant is managerially qualified, commensurate with the anticipated scope of the service to be provided and customers to be served. Given all of the information provided by Applicant, it appears to the Commission that it possesses the managerial qualifications required to provide service to the customers for which it seeks a Certificate of Service Authority. However, consistent with the requirements of Section 451.350, the Commission directs Applicant to ensure that all of its agents or contractors comply with all Sections of Part 451 applicable to the function or functions to be performed by the respective agent or contractor. Finally, Applicant provides a telephone number and e-mail address where its staff can be directly reached at all times.

V. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the application, amended attachments, and responses to the Administrative Law Judge rulings regarding the technical, financial, and managerial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 451 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements. The Commission concludes, therefore, that Applicant's request for a Certificate of Service Authority to operate as an ARES in Illinois should be granted and should include the following authority:

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS CERTIFIED that GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC is granted service authority to operate as an Alternative Retail Electric Supplier as follows:

SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED: The sale of electricity and power.

CUSTOMERS TO BE SERVED: All eligible residential and nonresidential retail customers.

GEOGRAPHIC REGION SERVED: The service area of Commonwealth Edison Company.

VI. FINDINGS AND ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) Applicant seeks a Certificate of Service Authority to operate as an ARES under Section 16-115 of the Act;
- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over Applicant and the subject matter hereof;
- (3) the recitals of fact and conclusions reached in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact, as required by Section 16-115(d)(1) of the Act;
- (4) Applicant has demonstrated that it possesses sufficient financial, managerial, and technical resources and abilities to provide power and energy to eligible residential and nonresidential retail customers throughout the area certified herein;
- (5) Applicant has complied with Section 16-115(d)(1) through (5) and (8) of the Act and Part 451; and
- (6) Applicant should be granted the Certificate of Service Authority set forth in Section V of this Order authorizing it to operate as an ARES.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC is hereby granted the Certificate of Service Authority set forth in Section V of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC shall comply with all applicable Commission rules and orders now and as hereafter amended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.

ORDER

By the Commission:

I. Preliminary Matters

On May 11, 2015, GDF Suez Retail Energy, LLC, d/b/a Think Energy, (“GDF”) filed a verified Application requesting a certificate of service authority as an alternative retail electric supplier (an “ARES”) in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act, (the “Act”) 220 ILCS 5/16-115 *et seq.* and also 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.10 *et seq.* On May 14, 2015, notice of its Application was published in the official state newspaper.

Because the information provided by the Applicant fully satisfied the regulatory requirements, the Administrative Law Judge determined that no hearing was necessary.

II. The Authority Sought in the Application

The Applicant, GDF, is a Delaware limited liability company. It is currently licensed as an alternative retail electric supplier in Illinois. GDF was granted a certificate to operate as an ARES in Docket 11-0531 to operate in the service territory of Commonwealth Edison Company. It is also licensed as an ARES in Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, Ohio, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Texas.

GDF stated that it has never had a lawsuit filed against it and no formal complaints have been filed against it with state regulatory agencies.

GDF seeks to serve all customer classes within the territory of Ameren Illinois Company. Additionally, it provided documentation from the Illinois Secretary of State demonstrating that it is licensed to transact business in Illinois. It has not been denied an electric supplier license in any state and it has not had an electric supplier license

suspended or revoked in any state.

III. Statutory Requirement for Certification

a. General Requirements

GDF certified that it will comply with all of the regulations that apply to it; that it will provide service only to retail customers that are eligible to take such services; that it will comply with the regulatory informational and reporting requirements; and that it will comply with all other applicable federal, state, regional and industry laws. It also has agreed to submit good-faith schedules of transmission and energy in accordance with applicable tariffs. It has agreed to adopt and follow rules regarding customer authorizations, billing records, and retail electric services. Further, it agreed to retain records regarding requests for delivery services transmitted to utilities for a period of not less than two calendar years after the calendar year in which they are created. GDF has agreed to adopt and follow rules and procedures which will preserve the confidentiality of its customers' personal information.

GDF additionally agreed to procure renewable energy resources, as is required by Section 16-115D and Section 16-115(d) of the Act. It also certified that it will procure electricity from clean coal facilities as required by Section 16-116(d)(5) of the Act. It further stated that it will not use electric generation, transmission or distribution facilities that it owns, controls, or operates in serving customers.

Pursuant to the requirements set forth in Subpart D of Part 451 of the Commission's regulations, (83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.300-370) GDF averred that any marketing materials that make statements concerning its prices and terms and conditions of service shall contain information that adequately discloses the prices, terms and conditions of the products or services that it is offering or selling to the customer. It additionally contended that before any customer is switched from another supplier, it shall give the customer written information that adequately discloses, in plain language, the prices, terms and conditions of the products and services being offered and sold to the customer. GDF further certified that it will provide documentation to the Commission and to customers that substantiates any claims made regarding the technologies and fuel types used to generate the electricity offered or sold to customers. It committed to providing to its customers with itemized billing statements that describe the products and services provided to the customer and their prices; and also providing an additional statement, at least annually, that adequately discloses the average monthly prices, and the terms and conditions, of the products and services sold to the customer.

Additionally, GDF averred that it will include materials that conform to the requirements for a consumer education program in Section 16-117 of the Act with all initial mailings to potential residential and small commercial retail customers and also before executing any agreements or contracts with such customers. It also stated that it will provide consumer education program materials pursuant to Section 16-117 of the

Act at no charge to residential and small commercial retail customers, upon request. GDF maintained that it will provide information to residential and small commercial retail customers on a semi-annual basis as to how to obtain a list of alternative retail electric suppliers that have been found in the last three years by the Commission to have failed to provide service in accordance with the terms of their contracts pursuant to 220 ILCS 5/16-117(g)(4)(C). Additionally, pursuant to the requirements set forth in 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.50, GDF provided a License or Permit Bond in the amount of \$300,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact business in Illinois.

b. Financial, Technical and Managerial Qualifications

Included in the attachments to GDF's Application is information demonstrating that it meets the criteria set forth in Section 16-115(d)(1) of the Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.330 and 451.340. Section 451.330 provides that an applicant shall be deemed to possess sufficient technical capabilities to serve retail customers if it has at least one individual on its staff with at least four years of experience buying and selling power and energy in wholesale markets and one year of scheduling experience working for an entity that is either a member of PJM, a market participant in the Midwest ISO, or has a system operator certificate from NERC, or has earned Certified Energy Procurement Professional status by the Association of Energy Engineers or equivalent certification. The information that GDF has provided establishes that it meets these criteria.

Additionally, Section 451.40 states that an applicant shall be deemed to possess sufficient managerial capabilities to serve retail customers if it has three or more individuals in management positions with four or more years of experience with enterprise financial and administration responsibilities, including profit and loss responsibilities, four years of experience buying and selling power and energy in wholesale markets, and four years of electric system operational experience. 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.40. The information that GDF provided establishes that it meets these criteria.

Further, GDF provided a telephone number and facsimile number through which it states a staff member can be reached at all times. GDF also certified that all of its agents or contractors will comply with all of the sections of Part 451 that are applicable to the function or functions to be performed by any respective agent or contractor.

GDF also meets the financial qualifications set forth in 220 ILCS 16-115(d)(1) and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.10 *et seq.* Section 451.320(a)(3) of the Commission's rules provides that: "An applicant is deemed to possess sufficient financial resources to be certified as an ARES if it demonstrates and certifies it is a member of one or more RTOs and purchases 100% of its physical electric energy from the RTOs for delivery to the service territories of the utilities for which the applicant is seeking a certificate." 83 Ill. Adm. Code 451.320(a)(3). GDF has provided documentation establishing that it meets this regulatory criterion.

IV. Commission Conclusions, Finding and Ordering Paragraphs

The Commission has reviewed the Application and the attachments thereto. Subject to the conditions herein, the Commission finds that the Application satisfies the requirements in the Public Utilities Act and in the pertinent regulations. The Commission concludes that the request made in this Application should be granted as is set forth below:

The Commission, having considered the entire record and being fully advised in the premises, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) The Applicant, which is a limited liability company organized pursuant to the law of the state of Delaware, is licensed to do business in Illinois and it seeks to operate as an Alternative Electric Supplier pursuant to Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act;
- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over the Applicant and subject-matter jurisdiction;
- (3) the recitals of fact set forth in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact;
- (4) as is required by Section 16-115 of the Act, the Applicant possesses sufficient technical, financial and managerial resources and abilities to provide power and energy to all eligible residential and non-residential retail customers throughout the service area of Ameren Illinois Company;
- (5) the Applicant should be granted a Certificate of Service Authority as is set forth below, and shall thereafter comply with all of the applicable laws or Commission orders.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that GDF Suez Retail Energy, LLC, d/b/a Think Energy, is hereby granted a Certificate of Service Authority as an Alternative Retail Electric Supplier, and that this Certificate of Service Authority is as follows:

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that GDF Suez Retail Energy, LLC, d/b/a Think Energy, is granted service authority to operate as an Alternative Retail Electric Supplier as follows:

SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED: The sale of electricity.

CUSTOMERS TO BE SERVED: All eligible customers.

I. SUMMARY

In this Order, we license GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC, d/b/a Think Energy to operate as a competitive electricity provider furnishing supplier service to the non-residential customer class in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Bangor-Hydro Electric Company pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

II. APPLICATION AND DECISION

On November 17, 2011, GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC, d/b/a Think Energy (GSRES) applied to the Commission to operate in Maine as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305. GSRES proposes to provide supplier service to all non-residential customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Bangor-Hydro Electric Company. GSRES met all the Chapter 305 filing requirements, including filing the letter of credit required when providing service to the small non-residential customer class. As a licensed competitive electricity provider, GSRES is required to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations, including all conditions of licensing, customer protection rules, and the filing of annual reports.

Pursuant to a Delegation Order dated April 23, 2008 in Docket No. 2008-185, *PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION, Delegation of Authority to License Competitive Electricity Providers*, the Commission delegated to the Director of Technical Analysis the authority under 35-A M.R.S.A., § 3203 (1)(2) and Chapter 305, §2 to license competitive electricity providers. On September 12, 2009, in Docket No. 2009-260, statutory changes took effect that change the title of this position. P.L. 2009, ch. 122. The Director of Technical Analysis will be the Director of Electric and Gas Utility Industries. All existing delegation orders that delegate Commission authority to the Director of Technical Analysis will now read that we delegate our authority to the Director of Electric and Gas Utility Industries.

Accordingly, it is

O R D E R E D

1. That GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy is hereby issued a license to operate as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules, to provide supplier services to the non-residential customer class in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Bangor Hydro-Electric Company; and
2. That this license is effective on the date of this Order and valid until revoked or suspended by the Commission pursuant to section 3(A)(4) of Chapter 305, or abandoned by the licensee pursuant to sections 2(D)(10) and 2(D)(11) of Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

ORDER AMENDING LICENSE

VANNOY, Chairman; LITTELL, and MCLEAN, Commissioners

I. SUMMARY

In this Order, we amend the license issued to GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy on November 20, 2011 to also allow it to provide supplier services to the residential customer class as well as the non-residential customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's Bangor District pursuant to Chapter 305.

II. APPLICATION AND DECISION

On November 22, 2011, GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy (Think Energy) received a license to operate in Maine as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305 to provide supplier services to the non-residential customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's Bangor District. On April 27, 2015, we received a request from Think Energy to amend its license to allow it to provide supplier services to the residential customer class in the same service territories. Think Energy had previously provided financial security pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 305. As Think Energy continues to meet all the Chapter 305 filing requirements, we will amend Think Energy's license to allow it to provide supplier services in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's Bangor District to the residential customer class in addition to the non-residential customer classes. As a licensed competitive electricity provider, Think Energy is required to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations, including all conditions of licensing, customer protection rules, and the filing of annual reports.

Pursuant to a Delegation Order dated April 23, 2008 in Docket No. 2008-185, *PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION, Delegation of Authority to License Competitive Electricity Providers*, the Commission delegated to the Director of Technical Analysis the authority under 35-A M.R.S.A., § 3203 (1)(2) and Chapter 305, §2 to license competitive electricity providers. On September 12, 2009, in Docket No. 2009-260, statutory changes took effect that changed the title of this position. P.L. 2009, ch. 122. The Director of Technical Analysis will be the Director of Electric and Gas Utility

Industries. All existing delegation orders that delegate Commission authority to the Director of Technical Analysis will now read that we delegate our authority to the Director of Electric and Gas Utility Industries.

Accordingly, it is

O R D E R E D

1. That the license issued to GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC d/b/a Think Energy to allow it to operate as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules, is hereby amended to allow Think Energy to provide supplier services to all customer classes in the service territories of Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's Bangor District; and
2. That this license is effective on the date of this Order and valid until revoked or suspended by the Commission pursuant to section 3(A)(4) of Chapter 305, or abandoned by the licensee pursuant to sections 2(D)(10) and 2(D)(11) of Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS TO REVIEW OR APPEAL

NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice grants GDF Suez Retail Energy Solutions, LLC (the Applicant) certification as a Retail Electric Provider (REP) for the geographic area of the entire State of Texas. The Commission provided notice of the application to interested parties. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice. No protests, motions to intervene, or requests for hearing were filed. The Applicant and the Commission Staff are the only parties to the proceeding. Commission Staff recommends approval of the application. The application is approved.

Statutory Findings

1. The application complies with PURA¹ § 39.352.
2. The Applicant has met the business name, office, and threshold residential service level requirements specified in subsection (e) of P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107.
3. The Applicant is entitled to approval of this application, having demonstrated that it possesses the financial and technical resources to provide continuous and reliable electric service to its customers in the area for which certification is sought, and the

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- managerial and technical ability to supply electricity at retail in accordance with customer contracts.
4. The Applicant has demonstrated that configuration of the proposed geographic area, if any, does not discriminate in the provision of electric service to any customer because of race, creed, color, national origin, or any other basis prohibited by law or P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107(h)(1).
 5. The Applicant has demonstrated that it possesses the resources needed to meet the customer protection requirements, disclosure requirements, and marketing guidelines as specified in P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107(h).
 6. The Applicant has demonstrated that it has ownership or lease of an office located within this state for the purpose of providing customer service, accepting service of process, and making available in that office books and records sufficient to establish the retail electric provider's compliance with the requirements of PURA § 39.352(b)(4).
 7. The name(s) under which the Applicant has requested that the REP certificate be issued are not deceptive, misleading, vague, or otherwise contrary to P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.272, or duplicative of a name previously approved for use by an existing REP certificate holder.
 8. The Applicant has agreed to comply with P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107(f)(3), and P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.108 relating to the billing and collection of transition charges.
 9. The Applicant is financially qualified to be certified as a REP in Texas.
 10. The Applicant has sworn and affirmed that it will register with or be certified by the ERCOT ISO or another independent organization, and will comply with the technical and managerial requirements of P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107 or that all entities with whom the Applicant has a contractual relationship to purchase power are registered with or certified by the independent organization and comply with all system rules and standards established by the independent organization, providing such proof of registration or certification after REP certification but at least 21 days before providing electric retail service to customers in Texas.

11. Commission Staff stated that the Applicant has met the requirements in P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107 to be certified as a REP in Texas, recommending that the application be approved.

Ordering Paragraphs

1. The application for retail electric provider certification is approved.² The Applicant is granted REP Certificate No. 10204 for the geographic area of the entire State of Texas.
2. The Applicant shall continuously maintain an office located within Texas for the purpose of providing customer service, accepting service of process, and making available in that office books and records sufficient to establish the REPs compliance with the requirements of PURA, and applicable Commission rules.
3. The Applicant shall notify the Commission within 30 days of any change in its office address, business address, telephone number(s) or contact information.
4. This certificate is not transferable without prior approval by the Commission and shall continue in force until further order of the Commission, pursuant to P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107.
5. This certificate shall not be construed to vest exclusive service or property rights in and to the area for which the certificate is granted pursuant to P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107.
6. The Applicant shall comply with all renewable energy portfolio standards in accordance with P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.173.
7. The Applicant shall comply with any customer protection requirements, disclosure requirements, marketing guidelines and anti-discrimination rules adopted by the Commission pursuant to §§ 17.001 - 17.004 and Chapter 39 of PURA.
8. Pursuant to P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.107(f)(2), the Applicant shall maintain records on an on-going basis for any deposits or advance payments received from customers. Financial obligations to customers shall be payable to them within 30 calendar days from the date the REP notifies the commission that it intends to withdraw its






