The above referenced application has been assigned for review without oral hearing. In order to reach a determination on the application, you are being required to file verified statements in accordance with 52 Pa. Code §3.381(e)(1). You will be required to file:

- A. VERIFIED STATEMENT OF APPLICANT
- B. VERIFIED STATEMENTS IN SUPPORT OF THE APPLICATION.

The verified statements should be in paragraph form. Each heading contained in the attached minimum outline should be a separate section or paragraph.

You should be aware of the fact that the verified statements will be reviewed based on the Commission's decision in the Application of Bluebird Coach Lines, Inc., A-00088807, F. 2, Am-K, which indicates: (1) the supporting witnesses must give evidence which is probative and relevant to the application proceeding; (2) the supporting witnesses must identify Pennsylvania origin and destination points between which they require transportation and those points must correspond with the scope of the operating territory specified in the application, including requests for vice versa authority; and (3) the number of witnesses which will represent a cross section of the public on the issue of need will vary with the breadth of the intended territory and commodity description.

You are being granted an initial thirty (30) days to file verified statements. They will be due on or before MAY 15, 1991.

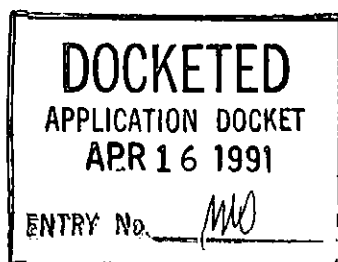
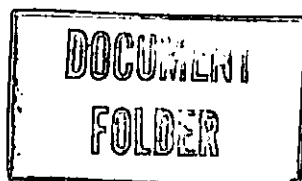

10. Safety program

The real party in interest of applicant has been engaged in motor carrier for hire transportation through this corporation since 1983 and has the experience and know-how to conduct a motor carrier operation, particularly with regard to safety, safety training of personnel and motor vehicle maintenance. Applicant conducts its own safety program in addition to its participation in the safety program of its insurance carrier.

11. Type of service currently provided to the supporting witnesses

Applicant presently serves each of the three supporting shippers in interstate commerce from their origin points set forth in their supporting statements submitted herewith to the Mid-Atlantic and New England States and vice versa for one of them. Intrastate and interstate shipments for these three shippers will be coordinated for an efficient and competitive operation. For example, an intrastate shipment will originate in Bristol, Bucks County for delivery in Scranton, Lackawanna County in the same vehicle which carries the same shippers shipment from Bristol to New York, NY.

Applicant will conduct a normal, but high quality, transportation service, designed for the convenience and needs of the supporting shippers herein, who desire quality, reliable transportation within the area applied for.

Since the authority sought for F.C.Young & Co., Inc. includes vice versa, such available transportation will help to balance the movements outbound from Philadelphia and other named origin points with inbound movements from the rest of the State.

The reason that the territorial description of the authority to serve F.C.Young & Co., Inc. specifies Bucks County as the origin point, is that such shipper intends to move its facilities to another location in Bucks County, but the exact location is yet unknown. It would seem wasteful to return in a couple of months with another application.

This supporting shipper is establishing a warehouse in Bristol Township, Bucks County.




