

TENTATIVE DECISION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission by an application for emergency temporary authority filed on March 8, 1990. Applications for temporary and permanent authority were also filed on the same date.

The transferor, H. C. Gabler, Inc., holds a considerable amount of Pennsylvania intrastate operating authority at A-00083975, Folders 3, 4, 5 and 6, and has been providing service since 1957. In addition, it holds ICC authority together with intrastate authority in Virginia and North Carolina. The corporation desires to sell all of its operating authority; however, the corporation will continue in other business endeavors. Upon approval and consummation of the application for transfer of the operating authority, the business of H. C. Gabler, Inc., will be the tire business, the ownership and development of real estate in the nature of truck terminals and warehouses, and in equipment rental.

Gabler Trucking, Inc. (or applicant) has a temporary transfer application pending before the Interstate Commerce Commission and if granted, will necessitate Gabler Trucking, Inc., being able not only to handle interstate freight, but to also handle Pennsylvania intrastate traffic at the same time. Pennsylvania is the most important state so far as intrastate and interstate revenues are concerned. The inability to coordinate the intrastate and interstate traffic in the event the ICC grants temporary authority, would be difficult since Gabler Trucking, Inc. would try to provide interstate service and H. C. Gabler, Inc., would try to provide intrastate service.

The applicant has made arrangements to secure the necessary application forms for transfer of the Virginia and North Carolina authorities. Although every effort is being made to coordinate the transfer of all state operations as quickly as possible, these states are not as important as their operations can be deferred to some extent.

The stockholder in the applicant corporation has initially been designated as Ernest P. Wiemer who will hold the stock as nominee for ENW-IV Holdings, Inc., until such time as the transaction has been approved. Upon consummation, the stock will be turned over to the corporation at which time the sum of \$750,000 will be paid to the transferor. In the event payment is not made, the stock in Gabler Trucking, Inc., will then be issued to Harold C. Gabler; Harold C. Gabler, Jr.; Eleanor S. Gabler and P. Thomas Gabler.

The stockholders of H. C. Gabler, Inc., are Eleanor S. Gabler and Valley Bank and Trust Company, trustees for Harold C. Gabler, Sr., which consists of all of the preferred stock, both voting and non-voting. The voting and non-voting common stock is held by Harold C. Gabler, Jr., and P. Thomas Gabler. In effect, the operating authority will be placed in the hands of a new entity, rather than into the hands of the same entity with merely a change in operating name.

While the applicant has outlined its desires and plan of action for the purchase and take-over of the transferor's operating authority, we fail to recognize an emergency condition which necessitates the need to operate the authority immediately. Even in the event the ICC approves the application placed before it for temporary authority to operate the interstate authority, we do not believe the applicant would be subjected to severe hardship until such time as we have published and reviewed the application for temporary authority placed before us; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for emergency temporary authority be and is hereby denied for failure of the applicant to show that an emergency situation exists which creates an immediate need for the applicant to operate the rights of the transferor.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That, unless exceptions are received within twenty (20) days of the date this order is entered, the order shall become final.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED. That our action in this application :
