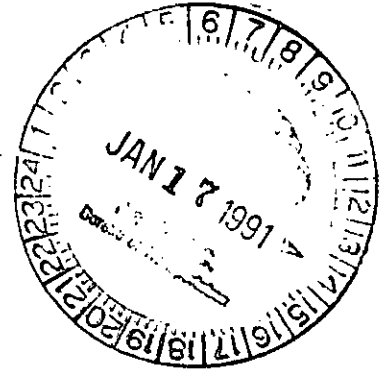

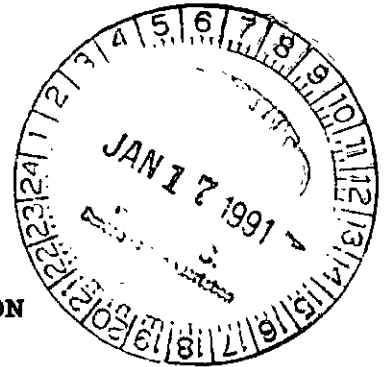

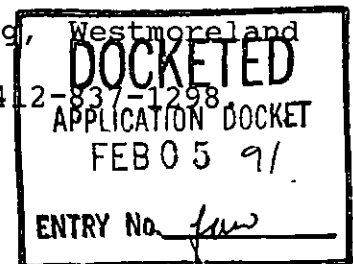

The parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Subject to the terms and conditions of this agreement, Seller shall sell and Buyer shall purchase for the sum of \$100.00, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission Operating rights held by seller and issued by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission at Docket No. 64650, Folders 1, 2 and 3.

2. The sale to Buyer is subject to the prior approval by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. Seller and Buyer shall provide the necessary information required by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and shall otherwise cooperate in obtaining such approvals.

3. Upon approval of the transfer of rights by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the Buyer shall pay the Seller the sum of \$100.00.

4. If the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission does not approve the transfer of the PUC rights or approves the transfer on

conditions which materially affect the value of the rights, the Seller or Buyer may terminate this agreement without further liability to each other.

5. Seller represents and warrant that it is the owner of the PUC rights with the right to transfer such rights under special permission from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission Order adopted November 1, 1990 and entered November 7, 1990.

APPROVING TRUCKING SERVICE

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter being before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission upon application of GLENN H. DIEHL, dated March 24, 1945, to operate motor vehicles as a common carrier, and having been duly presented in accordance with the rules of the Commission, and full investigation of the matters and things involved having been had, and it appearing that the rights granted herein are in effect a transfer of a part of the rights granted hereunder the certificate of public convenience issued to EPHRIAM GEORGE SHAPPER, trading and doing business as SHAPPER TRANSFER AND STORAGE, at No. 26592, folder 4, on November 9, 1936, the Commission finds and determines that approval of the application, limited to the following rights;

To transport, as a Class D carrier, farm produce, farm machinery and farm supplies between points in the City of Jeannette, Westmoreland County, and within fifteen (15) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said City,

To transport, as a Class D carrier, household goods and office furnishings and store equipment, in use, between points in the City of Jeannette, Westmoreland County, and within fifteen (15) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said City,

To transport, as a Class D carrier, household goods and office furnishings and store equipment, in use, from points in the City of Jeannette, Westmoreland County, and within fifteen (15) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said City to other points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa,

and subject to the following conditions, is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation or convenience of the public:

FIRST: That the certificate holder is limited and restricted to the operation of the motor vehicles as named and described in the Equipment Certificate, to be subsequently issued.

SECOND: That the approval hereby given is not to be understood as committing the Commission, in any proceedings that may be brought before it for any purpose, to fix a valuation of the property to be acquired by applicant from the present certificate holder equal to the consideration to be paid therefor, or equal to any value that may be placed thereon by applicant, or to approve or prescribe rates sufficient to yield a return thereon.

THIRD: That applicant shall not record in his utility plant accounts any amount representing the rights herein granted, except the necessary, reasonable expenses incurred by him in obtaining said rights from the Commission.

FOURTH: That applicant charge to his proprietorship account \$1947.70, being that part of the consideration payable by him to the present certificate holder in excess of the original cost less depreciation of the physical property to be acquired by him from the present certificate holder.

FIFTH: That the certificate holder shall comply with all the provisions of the Public Utility Law as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and Revised General Order No. 29, effective July 1, 1939, or as may hereafter be revised, and any other rules and regulations as may hereafter be prescribed by the Commission. Failure to comply shall be sufficient cause to suspend, revoke or rescind the rights and privileges conferred by the Certificate.

NOW, to wit, June 11, 1945, IT IS ORDERED; That upon compliance with all requirements of Sections 302 and 915 of the Public Utility Law, relative to tariffs and insurance, and with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission thereunder, a certificate of public convenience issue evidencing the Commission's approval of the right to operate, as above determined.

APPROVING TRUCKING SERVICE

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter being before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission upon application of GLENN H. DIEHL, dated May 14, 1946, to operate motor vehicles as a common carrier, and having been duly heard and submitted by the parties, and full investigation of the matters and things involved having been had, the Commission finds and determines that approval of the application, limited to the following rights:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, coal from mines in the Townships of Hempfield and Penn, Westmoreland County, to points in the said Townships and within a radius of three (3) miles thereof, provided no haul shall exceed a distance of fifteen (15) miles from point of origin to point of destination;

To transport, as a Class D carrier, coal from mines not served by railroad and stripping operations in the County of Westmoreland, to railroad sidings or coke ovens, provided no haul shall exceed a distance of twenty-five (25) miles from point of origin to point of destination;

To transport, as a Class B carrier, property between points in the City of Jeannette, Westmoreland County, and within a radius of five (5) miles thereof;

To transport, as a Class D carrier, building materials between points in the County of Westmoreland, provided no haul shall exceed a distance of twenty-five (25) miles from point of origin to point of destination;

and subject to the following conditions, is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation or convenience of the public:

FIRST: That the certificate holder is limited and restricted to the operation of the motor vehicles as named and described in the Equipment Certificate.

SECOND: That the certificate holder shall comply with all the provisions of the Public Utility Law as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and Revised General Order No 29, effective July 1, 1939, or as may hereafter be revised, and any other rules and regulations as may hereafter be prescribed by the Commission. Failure to comply shall be sufficient cause to suspend, revoke or rescind the rights and privileges conferred by the Certificate.

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter being before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission upon application of GLENN H. DIEHL, Dated July 2, 1946, to operate motor vehicles as a common carrier, and upon protests, and having been duly heard and submitted by the parties, and full investigation of the matters and things involved having been had, and it appearing that the applicant agreed to stipulation whereby some of the protests were withdrawn, the Commission finds and determines that approval of the application, limited to the following rights:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, pre-fabricated houses from railroad sidings in the County of Westmoreland to job sites in the Counties of Westmoreland and Allegheny;

To transport, as a Class D carrier, building supplies, lumber, and fixtures for pre-fabricated houses from points within a radius of sixty (60) miles of the County of Westmoreland to job sites in the County of Westmoreland;

and subject to the following conditions, is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation or convenience of the public:

FIRST: That the certificate holder is limited and restricted to the operation of the motor vehicles as named and described in the Equipment Certificate.

SECOND: That no right, power or privilege is granted to render service to or from points within a radius of ten (10) miles of the Borough of Donora, Washington County;

THIRD: That no right, power or privilege is granted to render service to or from points in the Borough of Latrobe, Westmoreland County;

FOURTH: That the certificate holder shall comply with all the provisions of the Public Utility Law as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and Revised General Order No. 29, effective July 1, 1939, or as may hereafter be revised, and any other rules and regulations as may hereafter be prescribed by the Commission. Failure to comply shall be sufficient cause to suspend, revoke or rescind the rights and privileges conferred by the Certificate.

NOW, to wit, May 12, 1947, IT IS ORDERED: That upon compliance with all requirements of Section 302 of the Public Utility Law, relative to tariffs, and with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission, thereunder, a certificate of public convenience issue evidencing the Commission's approval of the right to operate, as above determined.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before thirty days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the application insofar as it refers to all other transportation be and is hereby refused for lack of necessity.

STATEMENT OF BUSINESS DEBTS OF TRANSFEROR

The Transferor has no unsatisfied business debts, other than those occurring on a monthly basis, which are paid in the regular course of business.

EXHIBIT F

POLICY AND SAFETY PROGRAM

1. The use of alcohol or any controlled substance while on duty or prior to going on duty, where such use may affect the driver's ability to perform satisfactorily, is forbidden and will result in immediate dismissal. If any driver is accused by a company official or any other party of being under the influence of alcohol while on duty, the driver will be required to take a blood test.

2. All drivers are required to obtain a physical examination, including a drug screen, on a bi-annual basis.

3. A background check will be performed on all drivers for initial qualification. No person with a felony record in the past five years will be employed.

2. For chargeable accidents, suspensions will be applied commensurate with the severity of the accident. In case of an accident, all necessary information including names, addresses, telephone numbers, vehicle licenses, insurance company information, driver's license numbers and witness information must be obtained.

3. No weapons are permitted to be carried on any company vehicle.

4. Unauthorized passengers are not permitted on any company vehicle at any time. In addition, no personal business may be conducted using a company vehicle.

5. Pre-trip vehicle inspections must be performed and log books kept up to date.

6. Motor Vehicle Registration Checks will be performed every year.

7. Every pay day, drivers must show valid driver's license and I.C.C. card, if applicable.

8. New drivers are given a minimum of sixteen hours training on equipment they will be operating.

9. Each driver agrees that he or she will make no statements or take any action during his or her employment that would injure the reputation of the employer or a customer.

10. Vehicles are a reflection of the company, therefore drivers are expected to maintain a clean, neat vehicle. Each driver acknowledges his or her position of responsibility and trust in the company as he or she is dealing directly with company's customers.

11. All vehicles will undergo safety inspections three times a year in addition to the annual Pennsylvania state inspection.

THIS IS TO CERTIFY THAT I AM IN POSSESSION OF A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA AND I WILL NOTIFY THE COMPANY OF ANY SUSPENSIONS, TERMINATIONS, OR OTHER CHANGES IN MY DRIVER LICENSE STATUS.
