





3.

SET THE DATE

If possible, avoid the beginning and end of each month, since movers are the busiest at these times. Plan to have the mover come in a day or two earlier to do the packing.

HELPFUL HINTS

■ AIR CONDITIONERS:

Consult your authorized dealer or service man on your particular model. Some sealed units should be bolted down.

■ BEDDING:

Place bedding in clean cartons. Light articles such as blankets or pillows may be put into furniture drawers.

■ BEDS:

The movers will dismantle your beds and set them up in your new residence.

■ BOOKS:

Books should be packed in small, strong, securely tied cartons. They should be placed cover to cover, alternating bindings to prevent the pages from becoming interlocked and damaged. Wrap valuable books individually. Do Not pack books in furniture drawers or leave them in portable bookshelves or bookcases.

■ BRIC-A-BRAC:

Wrap separately and pack in cartons, boxes or barrels. Cushion well with newsprint. Pack largest and heaviest items in bottom of container. Do not pack over edge of container.

■ CLOTHING:

Before moving day, remove curtains from the rods and fold them neatly in drawers or clean, white tissue-lined cartons.

■ DRAPERIES:

These may be placed on hangers and transferred to wardrobe cartons, or they may be folded and placed in cartons. To save handling, they can be sent to the cleaners and delivered directly to your new home.

■ DRAWERS IN FURNITURE:

Articles such as blankets, cushions, pillows and clothing may be left in drawers. Do not pack heavy items in dresser, bureau, server or buffet drawers. NEVER leave liquids, breakables or firearms in drawers.

(For consumer's protection, we recommend emptying all drawers.)

■ DRYERS, ELECTRIC OR GAS:

Check with your service man. Motors may need to be checked and secured. We can arrange this service for you or recommend a reliable service company.

■ FOOD:

Dispose of food in open containers that might spill or spoil enroute. The carrier will not be liable for damage caused by food spilling on other items. Perishable food should never be stored or shipped.

■ FREEZERS:

These appliances must be completely defrosted one or two days prior to moving. They should be dried and aired to avoid musty odor. Safety of contents cannot be guaranteed so it is best to empty your freezer and plan meals that will use up perishable contents. Check with your service man to be sure the motor is bolted, if necessary.

■ GLASS TOPS TO FURNITURE:

For complete safety, these items should be crated. This is a "must" when storing or shipping; for local moving however, they frequently can be removed and replaced by the mover who will pad them safely in the van.

■ GLASSWARE:

Stemware and glassware should be wrapped individually and placed in barrels or placed in the top of china containers. Do Not nest unwrapped glasses in each other. Place wrapped glassware right side up, not on their sides.

■ GRANDFATHER CLOCKS:

Remove chimes. Secure weight chains tightly against the base of the clock with wire or strong string and remove weights and pendulums. If it is going a long distance, call a reputable clock man to prepare the works against damages.

■ JEWELRY:

Keep valuable jewelry in your immediate possession.

■ KITCHEN UTENSILS:

Kitchen utensils should be clean and placed in cartons or barrels. Durable, heavy pieces placed on the bottom, light ones on the top with each piece padded against dents, chipping or scratching. Toasters, irons, waffle irons, mixers, etc., may be wrapped individually and placed in cartons with other kitchen utensils.

■ LAMPS

Remove ornamental tops and put in a safe place... one you will remember. Small lamps may be wrapped and placed in cartons for safe moving.

HELPFUL HINTS

■ LAMPSHADES:

Wrap in white, clean tissue paper only, place in cartons, mark "Fragile". Do not use newsprint. They may be nested but do not pack them so as to tear lining or puncture parchment shades.

■ LINENS:

Table and bed linens should be put into strong cartons or trunks. They should be lined with tissue or clean white or brown paper to protect from dust. Do not use newsprint as a liner as the ink may soil the fabric.

■ LINOLEUM:

The moving company is not responsible for the safe moving of linoleum which has been used or tacked to the floor; or which cracks and breaks when rolled.

■ MATTRESSES:

Our moving men will protect your mattress with a bag or carton for a slight charge. Do not try to roll or handle as this may result in damaged springs or fabrics. You may protect them with a sheet or mattress cover if you like.

■ MEDICINES:

Seal bottles and jar stoppers. Wrap individually, placing them upright in small cartons or metal waste containers.

■ MIRRORS:

For storage or long distance moving, they must be crated for safe handling. Wall mirrors will be removed by the movers, if they are not fastened to the walls. Mirrors will not be installed on walls at the new residence. Mirror tops on furniture will be taken off and replaced at destination.

■ MOWERS AND GASOLINE POWERED TOOLS:

Gas tanks should be drained and oil reservoirs emptied. No flammable mixtures or articles may be transported on public carriers.

■ PAINTINGS - PICTURES

Small pictures can be safely placed between the folds of blankets or pillows in drawers or cartons. Large and valuable pictures and paintings must be padded, wrapped and crated for moving.

■ STEREOS:

Secure the tone arm and turntable against the movement by tying. Secure the changer to avoid its moving forward. On delicate, expensive players, it is wise to have this done by an experienced serviceman.

■ RECORDS, TAPES AND CD PLAYER'S:

Pack records on end, side by side, to provide the greatest resistance to weight pressure. Use small cartons only.

■ PLANTS:

These should be handled personally by you or given to your florist to send to your destination. The moving company will not assume responsibility for living plants.

■ REFRIGERATORS:

Defrost and thoroughly dry your refrigerator before moving. This is very important. The doors should be left open several hours to air after defrosting. All pans, trays, crispers, shelves or removable parts should be removed and wrapped separately. Have your refrigerator serviced. Motor may have to be bolted down before moving. Do not plug it in at the new home until it has been unbolted.

■ RUGS:

It is not necessary to remove rugs from floors. Our men will do this for you. They will be rolled to avoid crushing. If they are to be stored, have them cleaned. Tacks should be removed from carpeting before our movers arrive.

■ SEWING MACHINES:

These do not need special servicing for local moving. For long distance, the driver will stuff paper in and around the machine and place paper between the lid and base to prevent rubbing.

■ SILVERWARE:

Leave in original containers or wrap in cloth or low sulphur-content paper, or tissue and pack in boxes. Place padding in silver chests to prevent moving and scratching.

■ STOVES:

Must be disconnected prior to pickup. Be sure gas lines are shut off tight and capped, if possible. For electric ranges, if the coils are loose, they must be removed together with griddles, deep fryers and removable parts, then packed separately.

■ TELEVISION SETS:

Some sets require that they be checked before moving. Some color TV's must be serviced both before and after moving. Television antennas should be removed from roof tops and disassembled.

■ TOILET ARTICLES:

Seal the corks and stoppers of cosmetics, medicines and perfume bottles with natural nail polish, paraffin or masking tape before wrapping separately in paper and placing upright in cartons or metal waste containers.

■ TOOLS:

If they are valuable, wrap separately. Tools, as a rule, can be put into small strong cartons without wrapping individually.

■ VALUABLES:


Legal documents, all important papers, jewels and currency should be handled by you personally. Keep them in your immediate possession.

■ WASHERS:

Automatic washers must be serviced by an authorized service man. Motors should be checked and secured, tumbler action protected and fastened in place.

PREFACE

The following information and instructions contained in this Guide have been prepared to make the packing and moving easier for our employees and to reduce unnecessary delays for the moving company selected. Following these instructions will help for a smooth and efficient transfer to our new location.

I

General Information in preparation for the "move"

1. SUPERVISORS:

It is your responsibility to have your staff follow these instructions.

Be sure that all employees in your department or section receive this Office Moving Guide.

Personnel will be functioning in the new offices on a normal basis immediately after reporting to work, if the move is properly preplanned.

2. EMPLOYEES:

You will be responsible for your own packing before the actual move.

Follow the instructions contained in this booklet. They will be of assistance to you, not only before the move, but when you unpack at the new offices.

All Packing Should Be Completed Prior To The Start Of The Actual Move.

IMPORTANT:

ONLY PERSONNEL DIRECTLY INVOLVED WITH THE MOVE SHOULD BE PRESENT DURING THE COURSE OF THE MOVE.

PACKING INSTRUCTIONS

II

1. PERSONAL ITEMS

The mover cannot be responsible for your personal possessions, such as legal papers, money, lighters, fountain pens, etc. For your own protection, we suggest that you move these items privately. If you need special containers, ask your Move Consultant.

2. CARTONS

Be sure that all cartons are properly assembled. Leave a two inch space at top of each carton. The mover has special cartons and boxes available for electronic equipment, libraries, bulk supplies, lamps and other breakables. If you require special boxes or packing services, ask your supervisor to advise the Move Consultant.

3. DESKS

Pack all contents. This includes current working papers, letter trays, books and other desk top items.


IMPORTANT

SEAL PAPER CLIPS, PENCILS AND ALL OTHER LOOSE MATERIALS IN ENVELOPES AND THEN PACK THEM IN CARTONS.

PROTECT ALL GLASS RECEPTACLES WITH PAPER OR OTHER STUFFINGS. LEAVE GLASS TOPS AND PADS ON TOP OF DESKS FOR THE MOVER.

4. FILING CABINETS

Move with contents intact. Tighten the internal drawer plate in each drawer to hold contents in place.



PACKING INSTRUCTIONS

5. SECURITY FILES

All files should be locked prior to moving. If security regulations necessitate escorts, advise the Move Consultant and he will make arrangements with the mover. Security files may then be consolidated and moved on one or more vans as required.

6. SUPPLY OR STORAGE CABINETS

Pack all contents in cartons. Cabinet doors should then be locked, taped or tied.

7. BOOK CASES

Remove all books and pack in cartons.

8. COAT RACKS OR LOCKERS

Pack all items and contents.

9. OFFICE MACHINES

Do Not Pack These Machines!
Leave the machines on top of their desk or stand. Typewriter carriages must be centered and all machines must be unfastened and disconnected. Pads and covers for machines should be placed in a carton. Mover will give particular attention to all these units.

10. KEYS

Where locks and keys are available for any items being moved, keys should be wire tagged and coded to the locks they fit and packed in a safe place.

11. PICTURES, MAPS & BULLETIN BOARDS

If secured, remove these items from the wall. Tag each piece according to Tagging Instructions; place them on end, back-to-back in carton. If the item does not fit in a carton, lean it against the wall and the mover will take it from there. Consolidate small pictures in container. Cushion with packing material, i.e. newspaper.

PAC ING INSTRUCTIONS

12. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

Professional servicing may be required for Xerox, IBM or other data processing equipment. This service is available from either the mover or the manufacturer's service department. If you require electricians, plumbers or machinists, the Supervisor should advise the Move Consultant well before the moving date.

IMPORTANT:

ALL EQUIPMENT CONTAINING LIQUID
MUST BE DRAINED PRIOR TO MOVE.

13. PLANTS (LIVE OR ARTIFICIAL)

Since the mover is not responsible for the safe transportation of plants, employees must arrange for other methods of transportation.

14. MISCELLANEOUS:

Desk Letter Trays - Empty papers and pack in correctly marked cartons.

Cardex Files - Keep rods and file guards tightly drawn. Bind loose cards together with rubber bands in batches of about 150 and pack in cartons.

Furniture Casters - Remove loose casters and pack in cartons.

Odds & Ends - Pack desk clocks, calendars, rubber stamps, bookends in cartons or if special packing is required, notify Move Consultant in advance.

Employees Consolidating - Consolidate your office belongings with those of other employees being located in your immediate area at the new location. This will help conserve carton space.

Electronic And Telephone Service Equipment - Utility servicemen will have been notified in advance of this move. Remember, telephone servicemen are required to disconnect phones secured to desks.

TAGGING/ MARKING

III

1. MOVING LABELS

Assorted colors are available for your tagging requirements. (See illustrations.) Obtain your specific code assignments for floor, room, number, etc. from your Move Consultant. Carefully print your identification code in large letters with a dark crayon or magic marker before placing tags on items to eliminate damage.

2. DO NOT MOVE

If items are not to be moved or if equipment and furniture are to be discarded, be sure to tag them with "Do Not Move" labels. This will eliminate unnecessary expense.

3. SPECIAL TYPES OF FURNITURE

- Such as "L" desks and conference tables may need to be dismantled. If so, be certain that all sections of the pieces of furniture dismantled have the same tag color and code information.

4. TAG PLACEMENT

Please follow the illustrations on the following pages in order to place coded tags in a uniform manner. The mover requires this uniformity to quickly and efficiently replace your furniture and equipment in the new location.

5. ARROWS

These pressure sensitive arrows point to the direction in which an object is to be located in the new quarters. These removable arrows are color coordinated with the moving labels, and may be applied to floors, walls, ceilings, etc.




Use the above graph to pre-plan placement of your furniture and equipment in the new office. This will avoid confusion and delay in setting up your new quarters.

1. YOUR FIRST CONCERN

Your first concern will be to get unpacked and back to a normal operating routine as quickly as possible.

2. AFTER UNPACKING

As soon as you have completed unpacking, break the cartons down and place them in a central area for removal from the offices.

3. DAMAGE CLAIMS

Although the mover will exercise extreme care, some damage may still occur. Prior to establishing a claim, the Employee, the Supervisor or the Move Consultant must be familiar with the condition of the furniture or equipment to know if damage occurred during moving. If damage has occurred, a report similar to the one below should be completed and given to the Move Consultant within three days.

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

Arbitration is a dispute resolution process whereby a neutral arbitrator will resolve your dispute instead of a judge or jury in court.

The parties involved in the dispute agree to use a mutually selected arbitrator to review their dispute and resolve it by rendering a decision or award that is binding on the parties. Like litigation, arbitration is an adjudicative process designed to resolve the specific issues that will be submitted by you and your mover. However, arbitration differs from litigation in that it does not require conformity with the legal rules of evidence and the proceeding is conducted in a private rather than a public forum.

Many parties choose to use arbitration for resolving their disputes to avoid the high costs of lawsuits. Often, a dispute can be arbitrated within a shorter time and at a lower cost than by going to court.



The American Moving and Storage Association (AMSA) is a national trade association that represents carriers and agents in the household goods moving industry. AMSA sponsors a dispute settlement program so

that its members can comply with the Federal requirement of providing a fair and effective way to resolve disputes regarding articles in your shipment that you have claimed as lost or damaged during your move and/or whether you must pay additional charges that were billed to you by your mover after the delivery of your shipment.

The National Arbitration Forum (NAF) administers our arbitration program. NAF is an independent, non-governmental organization that is not affiliated with AMSA or with any household goods moving company.

NAF maintains a panel of independent and neutral arbitrators that include attorneys, law professors and former state and federal judges to resolve disputes. NAF charges an administrative fee to arbitrate your dispute. The administrative fee, which is divided equally between the parties (unless your mover agrees to pay all or a portion of your share of the fee), is paid to NAF; AMSA does not receive any portion of the administrative fee. The parties to your proceeding will be you and your mover with NAF acting as the neutral program administrator. Neither AMSA nor any of its employees takes any role in the arbitration proceeding or has any influence in the outcome of the arbitrator's decision. (AMSA serves only as a clearinghouse to make sure that your mover properly addresses your initial request for arbitration as required by the Federal statute.)

The arbitrator's decision that you receive from NAF will be kept confidential. Federal law (Section 14908, Subtitle IV, Title 49 United States Code) specifically prohibits an interstate carrier or its agent from disclosing information about your shipment without your permission, except in response to legal process issued under authority of a court of the United States or a State or to an officer, employee, or agent of the United States government. Therefore, AMSA respects your right to privacy in such matters and will keep the results of your arbitration case confidential.




Disputes eligible for arbitration are unresolved claims on interstate shipments of household goods for individual consumers that may occur as a result of 1) loss or damage involving the articles contained in your shipment, or 2) additional charges that were billed to you by your mover after the delivery of your shipment.

While most disputed claims for loss and damage are eligible for consideration under the mandatory arbitration provisions, only certain types of disputed charges are eligible. Disputes regarding **charges that were collected by your mover when your shipment was delivered are not subject to mandatory arbitration.** However, disputes regarding **additional charges that were billed to you by your mover after your shipment was delivered are eligible for consideration** under the mandatory arbitration provisions.

For example, if you received a non-binding estimate from your mover for \$7,000, you would be required to pay no more than 110% of this amount (or \$7,700) at delivery for the services and quantities (weight) listed on your estimate. If your shipment weighs more than the estimated amount, your mover will invoice you for the additional amount after your shipment has been delivered. The amount of the additional billing is the amount subject to arbitration.

If you and your mover cannot resolve your dispute, you may request that arbitration be used to resolve your claim. Before arbitration can begin however, you must be sure that you have exhausted your remedies through the mover's regular claims process and that the mover has made its final offer to you. In accordance with Federal law and the terms of your Bill of Lading contract, your claim for loss or damage must be filed with your mover within nine months of delivery. The carrier must acknowledge your claim within 30 days of receipt, and within 120 days must pay, deny, make a settlement offer or advise you of the status of the claim and the reason for any delay in disposition. Your claim regarding disputed charges must be filed within 180 days of receipt of the mover's invoice.

Disputes involving other types of claims may be arbitrated under the program only if both you and your mover agree to do so.



What Are the Legal Effects of the Program?

Congress provides requirements for dispute settlement programs in Section 14708 of Title 49, United States Code, under the authority of the U.S. Department of Transportation. These requirements are reflected in the program rules. You should carefully consider the legal effects of binding arbitration before you decide to use the program.

Arbitration under this program is optional and voluntary for you, but not always so for your mover. Your mover must agree to your request for arbitration of disputed claims of \$10,000 or less, if no settlement can be reached. However, if you request arbitration of a disputed claim over \$10,000, your claim will be submitted to arbitration only if both you and your mover agree to arbitration. Once both you and your mover have signed the official forms and submitted the dispute to NAF for resolution, a neutral NAF arbitrator will render a final decision.

The arbitrator's decision is legally binding on both parties and can be enforced in any court having jurisdiction over the dispute. Under the rules of the program, there is a limited right to appeal the arbitrator's decision; however, courts will not usually revise findings of fact or law in a binding arbitration award.



What Can an Arbitrator Award?

The arbitrator may grant any remedy or relief the arbitrator feels is just and appropriate within the scope of the agreement between you and your mover and within the rules of the program. In general, the amount of any award may not exceed your mover's liability under the bill of lading, or in the case of disputed charges, the total amount of disputed additional charges.

In reaching a decision, the arbitrator will consider the applicable laws and the provisions of the tariff, as well as applicable practices of the moving industry. Under the rules of the program, the arbitrator only has jurisdiction to consider

How Do I Request Arbitration?

YOU MAY REQUEST ARBITRATION by writing to the **American Moving and Storage Association, Attention: Dispute Settlement Program, 1611 Duke Street, Alexandria, VA 22314**. Your request to AMSA may also be sent by fax to **703-683-7524**. Your request must be sent to AMSA within 90 days after your mover has made its final written settlement offer or denial of your claim to you.

Along with your name, address and telephone number, the following information should be included in your request for arbitration:

- The name of your mover and the identification number (if any) of the shipment,
- The name your shipment moved under (if other than your own),
- The dates and locations where the shipment was picked up and delivered,
- The dollar \$ amount you are seeking to recover through arbitration, and
- A brief description of your dispute, including how you believe your claim could be resolved by your mover.

CLAIMANTS ARE NOT REQUIRED TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT FROM PROCESS CLAIMS. THE ARBITRATOR DOES NOT INCLUDE THE ADMINISTRATIVE FEE OR DETAILED DOCUMENTS SUPPORTING YOUR POSITION WITH YOUR INITIAL REQUEST. INSTEAD, AMSA WILL VERIFY THIS INFORMATION FROM YOU LATER IN YOUR DISPUTE. CANNOT BE SETTLED AND YOUR CASE PROCEEDS TO ARBITRATION WITH NAF.

After AMSA receives your information, AMSA will promptly notify your mover of your request for arbitration and, if the dispute falls within the program guidelines and a settlement is not achieved, AMSA will forward to you the required forms and program rules. You will then have 30 days to complete the forms and return them to NAF, along with your portion of the administrative fee. Then your mover submits its documentation and its portion of the administrative fee and the arbitration process begins. The arbitrator makes most decisions within 30 days of receiving all the necessary forms and documents.

claims for loss or damage to the household goods transported, disputed additional transportation and service-related charges assessed by the mover in addition to those collected at delivery, or such other disputes arising out of the transportation of the household goods that are mutually agreed upon, in writing, by both you and your mover. The arbitrator has no jurisdiction to consider any other claims, including, but not limited to: consequential or incidental damages, mental anguish, loss of wages, punitive damages, alleged fraud, violations of law or any claim that cannot be arbitrated under law, such as allegations of criminal activity.

How Much Does Arbitration Cost?

The Administrative Fee charged by NAF is based on the total amount of the claim in dispute. When the amount of the claim is: **\$10,000 or less, the fee is \$500; Over \$10,000 up to \$20,000-\$550; Over \$20,000 up to \$30,000-\$600; Over \$30,000 up to \$40,000-\$650; Over \$40,000 up to \$50,000-\$700; Over \$50,000-\$700 plus one (1%) percent of the amount over \$50,000. Unless otherwise agreed to**

by both parties, you and your mover will pay equal shares of the fee.

For example, if the amount of the dispute is \$7500, the applicable administrative fee would be \$500. This fee would be **shared equally** between the parties **with you and your mover each paying \$250**. If the claim in dispute is higher, \$75,000 for example, a \$700 fee would apply plus 1% of the amount over \$50,000. In this example, the fee to be shared by the parties would be \$950 (\$700 plus 1% of \$25,000); the fee for each party would be \$475.00.

The arbitrator may apportion the fee as part of the final award by determining which party shall pay the cost or a portion of the cost of the arbitration proceeding, including the cost of initiating the arbitration process. In other words, the arbitrator may decide to refund all, a portion or none of your administrative fee, depending on the circumstances of your dispute.
