RULES AND REGULATIONS

ITEM 10 - SCOPE OF CARRIER'S OPERATING AUTHORITY

Rates and provisions named in this tariff, or as amended, are limited in their application on Pennsylvania intrastate commerce to the extent of the operating rights set forth below.

Certificate No. A-00103976

Folder 1

1. To transport, as a Class D carrier, milk from farms in the counties of Bucks and Montgomery to dairies in the said counties and the city and county of Philadelphia.
2. To transport, as a Class D carrier, new furniture sold by merchants of the borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, and household goods and office furnishings, stock and fixtures in use, from the borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways, of the limits of said borough, to points in Pennsylvania within forty (40) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough, and vice versa.
3. To transport, as a Class D carrier, in emergencies, not to exceed ten (10) trips per year, new furniture sold by merchants of the borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, and household goods and office furnishings, stock and fixtures in use, from the borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, and within ten (10) miles, by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough, to points in Pennsylvania more than forty (40) miles, by the usually traveled highways, from the limits of said borough and vice versa; provided, that such trips shall be reported to the Commission immediately after they are made.
4. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property of the Western Electric Company and the Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania between points in the counties of Bucks and Montgomery;

with right No. 4 above, subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk in tank vehicles or in hopper-type vehicles.

5. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property usual to use in a household when a part of such household equipment or supply, in connection with a removal by a householder from one house or dwelling to another; furniture, fixtures, equipment and the property usual in a store, office museum, institution, hospital or other establishment, when a part of the stock, equipment or supply of such store, office, museum, institution, hospital or other establishment, in connection with a removal from one location to another; and works of art, furniture, musical instruments, displays, exhibits and articles requiring specialized handling and equipment usually employed in moving household goods between points in the borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, and within an airline distance of ten (10) statute miles of said borough and from points in the said borough and territory to points within fifty (50) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough, and vice versa.

ITEM 20 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS •

Except as otherwise provided herein for rates, rules, regulations and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods in use, see Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory), revisions thereto and reissues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 30 - DECLARED VALUE •

Rates and charges named herein applicable when value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty cents (60¢) per pound, per article. For method of determining rates when value declared exceeds sixty cents (60¢) per pound, per article see Governing Tariff.

ITEM 40 - PIANO CARRY (A) (C)

When a grand or baby piano is included in the move an additional charge of \$50.00 will be assessed.

ITEM 50 - LABOR CHARGE (A)

Carrier will assess a charge of \$35.00 per hour labor charge when no other charges are otherwise provided in this tariff, when such services are requested by shipper or his agent.

ITEM 60 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

Class 1 Shipments are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property; except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of, and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

ITEM 70 - PACKING AND UNPACKING SERVICE (C)

When packing occurs on the same day as loading, packing will be performed on an hourly basis plus the cost of containers (Item 250), and such labor will be charged for at the labor rates shown in Item 300 or 350. When packing occurs on a different day, carrier may charge packing per unit based on the rates specified in Item 250. Unpacking will be charged for at the hourly labor rates shown in Item 300 or 350.

ITEM 75 - PAYMENT •

This carrier may elect to accept MasterCard or Visa credit cards as payment for all rates and charges, subject to the following notes below.

Note 1: The application of this item is subject to authorization from MasterCard or Visa on each individual shipment.

Note 2: This item will only apply to shipments transported between points in Pennsylvania as authorized in Carrier's Scope of Operating Rights set forth in Item 10 herein.

ITEM 80 - FULL VALUE PROTECTION INSURANCE (A) (C)

Provisions of this rule apply on the transportation of household goods, in use, for both forty (40) miles and less and, in excess of forty (40) miles.

Full Value Protection will be provided by carrier only if shipment is declared at a minimum lump sum of \$10,000 or \$4.00 for each pound of weight in the shipment, whichever is greater.

ITEM 85 - PICKUP OR DELIVERY TRANSPORTATION RATES ON STORAGE-IN-TRANSIT SHIPMENTS •

- (a) Apply hourly rates shown in Item 300 herein. Minimum transportation charge eight (8) hours at rates named in Column 1 and Columns 2, 3 or 4 in Item 300 herein. Hourly rates apply on loading, actual movement or transportation and unloading (except as provided in (b) below.
- (b) Where storage-in-transit shipment is not unloaded at carrier's warehouse, and shipment remains on carrier's vehicle, an overnight S.I.T. flat charge of \$150.00 per vehicle will be assessed.
- (c) Waiting charge will be assessed by carrier on the basis of a vehicle, driver and two helpers at the applicable hourly rates shown in Item 300 from 8 A.M. following overnight S.I.T. flat charge until carrier's employees and equipment arrive at customer's location for unloading. Thereafter, carrier's hourly rates in Item 300 will be assessed on the equipment and labor furnished by carrier from the commencement of unloading until completion of unloading and dismissal of equipment and labor by shipper.

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ITEM 90 - WAIVER OF MINIMUM CHARGE (C)

When move is performed solely at the carrier's convenience, carrier shall not assess a minimum transportation charge. In such instances, carrier shall charge shall based on the actual time to complete the move plus the applicable travel time charge.
