PROCEEDINGS

JUDGE TURNER: Now, is the time and place for a pre-hearing government application of Eric F. Wright Enterprises, Inc. trading as Eric's Moving. Docket Number A-00113409F0001AMA.

Richard Mulcahey is here representing the Applicant, Eric F. Wright. Attorney Casey is representing a group of 11 Protestants.

ATTORNEY CASEY: Yes, your Honor.

<u>JUDGE TURNER:</u> Both are present at the hearing today. Are there any other Counsel or Protestants in attendance?

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: I don't believe so.

<u>JUDGE TURNER:</u> Any other Counsel or Protestants? ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: I don't believe so.

JUDGE TURNER: Okay. Before we started, off the record, I had asked Mr. Casey and Mr. Mulcahey if they wanted or would be willing to make opening statements. And I believe Mr. Mulcahey, you wanted to.

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: Good morning, Your Honor.

Regarding the Eric F. Wright Enterprises, Inc.

application currently filed by the Public Utilities

Commission at Docket Number A-00113409F0001AMA. The

company is licensed as a household property carrier and also a carrier of household foods, between points in the City and County of Philadelphia and the County of Delaware and part of Montgomery County. By this instant application, we are seeking an amendment to the current Household Goods Authority so that this company would be able to provide service not only in the areas that it has now, but also Berks, Bucks, Delaware, Chester and Montgomery County and both points in that area to points in Pennsylvania and vice versa. There were 11 Protestants in the case. The matter was before the mediation process with Mr. Urich (phonetic).

Mr. Casey and I had numerous conversations regarding the case and we have proposed a restricted amendment that would read as follows. Provided however, that no right, power, or privilege be granted to originate transportation from the counties of Bucks. And that trips generated in Berks County will be limited to the geographic area within ten statute miles of the Chester/Berks and Montgomery/Berks County border. And, Your Honor, what we have done ---.

JUDGE TURNER: Excuse me. Are you expecting another person?

1 ATTORNEY CASEY: Yes, Your Honor. This is Mr.
2 Purcell ---.

JUDGE TURNER: Okay. Why don't you continue Mr. Mulcahey.

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: What we have done, Your Honor, is we have prepared a map ---.

JUDGE TURNER: Oh.

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: --- just to give a little bit of a better idea of what we're looking for. I'm not sure I want to mark that as an exhibit because that may not be a final resolution, but that at least, I think assists visually on what we have and what the applicant has.

JUDGE TURNER: It certainly assist me and I notice that Mr. Casey has a copy. So, okay.

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: The area marked in red is the current Household Goods Authority that the company has. The area in yellow is what we're requesting by this application. And the area in the blue-green is the area that we are proposing as the area that we'll service pursuant to the restricted amendment.

JUDGE TURNER: Okay.

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: Both Mr. Casey and I have had a number of conversations back and forth through

a number of parties and we haven't been able to resolve the case yet.

JUDGE TURNER: But it is your hope that you could do so today?

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: I would hope so.

JUDGE TURNER: All right. Mr. Casey do you have opening remarks?

ATTORNEY CASEY: Your Honor, I would concur with Mr. Mulcahey's statements about what's happened so far and that we have made an effort. And he has provided me with a map and I've been discussing with my Protestants, it's a little bit of a problem mailing around and getting responses. In addition, we had filed Interrogatories with the applicant and they had responded and answered them.

Some of them, at the time they were filed, the information was not current or available. And we're hoping today that we can get some information today that will assist us in maybe coming to an agreement.

JUDGE TURNER: Are you prepared, Mr. Mulcahey, to give additional information?

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: Yes, we are.

JUDGE TURNER: Okay. Good. At this point then perhaps the best thing is to go off the record. I'm assuming that you don't want to conduct your

assuming that you do not want me to be present. You are not looking for a mediator at this point because you've been through mediation; is that correct?

ATTORNEY MULCAHEY: Yes, Your Honor.

ATTORNEY CASEY: Yes.

ATTORNEY CASEY: An hour?

JUDGE TURNER: Okay. Now, I'm willing to function as a settlement judge if that's what the parties want. But you can let me know if that changes. All right then, let us go off the record. How long do you think this will take?

Half an hour, hour?

JUDGE TURNER: Okay. I am located in 1302.

Also the library is in 1302, if a group needs a separate meeting place. I would appreciate it if someone would come and check in with me in half an hour and either summon me or let me know how much more time you need. Is that okay?

JUDGE TURNER: Gentlemen, shall we go on the record or do you have more to do off the record --- on the record? Okay. Back on the record. Mr. Mulcahey?

But, I find that if I have a --- the Judge has a copy, if it gets lost, we can always come up with it. So, I'd appreciate a copy of the amendment and your acceptance, Mr. Casey.

<u>ATTORNEY CASEY:</u> Did you mention statute miles?

<u>ATTORNEY MULCAHEY:</u> Ten statute miles.

ATTORNEY CASEY: Thank you, Your Honor, for you

23	ATTORNEY CASEY: We would remain part of the
